Board Members Present: Betty Opiela, Lois Beauchamp, Ida Tyson Blankenship, Sylvia Jolet, Sharan McCall, Holly Nelson.

President called the meeting to order. Minutes were approved as written. Treasurer's reports is as follows: Operating fund = \$14,066.44. Reserve fund = \$40,265.79 Total = \$54,332.23.

President reported that Youth A Iteratives 26 nniversary was being celebrated on September 10<sup>th</sup> and that she and Jean Powell would be attending on behalf of the guild.

President has offered the excess folding tables and chairs in the storage facility to Trinity United Methodist Church, their board was expected to accept the donation at their meeting on September 10<sup>th</sup>. While at the church, the president discussed the option of the church's custodian or youth group as an option for setting up meeting tables/chairs. Cost for the custodian'' services = \$50.00/ meeting. The church will notify us of the cost for youth group services, as well as the availability of both options, soon.

**Quilt Show:** Lois Beauchamp reported that Linda Carlson has completed quilting on the Raffle Quilt and that the binding is being attached now.

**Fashion Show:** On schedule, with many entries submitted within the last few weeks. The commitment to the hotel is for 150 attendees, but less than that number of tickets have been sold.

**Programs:** Holly Nelson reported that September's program would be mini-demos, with presentations by 4 guild members. October's guest speaker, Fran Snay, will be sending 2 quilts as samples of her workshops. November's program will be the UFO Auction, with Amy Cottrell presiding.

**Unfinished business:** The president will proceed with disposal of excess material in the storage facility, as approved by the membership at the August meeting. The excess material (except for the folding chairs and tables) will be donated to Youth Alternatives.

**New Business:** The President passed out archival job descriptions for Board positions (dated September 1990), and asked that they are reviewed and recommendation made for modifications or updates.

Ida Tyson Blankenbship moved that the guild continue with its support of the American Quilt Study Group with a donation of \$100.00(as has been done in previous years). Holly Nelson seconded the motion. The motion passed.


