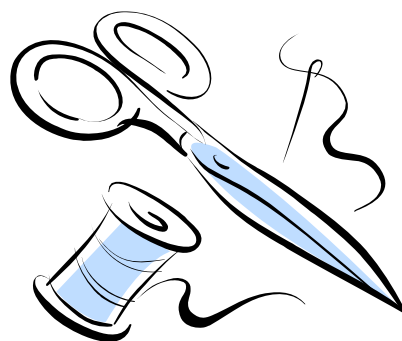

## Bright Hopes

In August we delivered 40 quilts and seven totes to the San Antonio Children's Shelter. Thank you to all of our Bright Hopes helpers for making time to sew for the kids!

Some time ago we were given a beautiful king size quilt frame. It hasn't found a home yet and I'm hoping someone would like to buy or trade batting for it. The frame is hand finished wood made from an "Easy Build Quilting Frame Kit." The upright frame (the trestle) is 39 inches tall and the legs are 26 inches 'deep.' The holder for the quilt rollers is 33 inches 'deep.' Ten foot thin wall steel conduit was used for the rollers, so with ratchets attached it is slightly wider than 10 feet. We measured and the minimum space required to store the quilting frame (fully assembled with the quilt holder in the full horizontal position) would be approximately 3 feet wide by 10 feet long by 3.5 feet tall. If the quilt holder is kept at an angle, the depth needed is only 2.5 feet. If you are interested in the quilt frame please contact Sharon at 210-542-1464.

We need tops for the October kit party - just in case you have a ufo you'd like to get out of the house. I'll have some top kits at the September meeting, too.

- **Scribe** for the judges, Wednesday and Thursday.

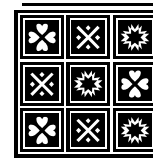
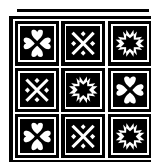

## Tip from Blockcentral.com

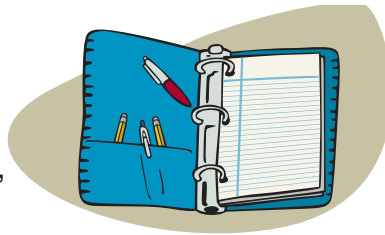
I have dramatically increased my quilting productivity by setting up a Quilting Journal. I have a 3-ring or spiral-bound notebook resting in a lucite cookbook stand ON MY SEWING TABLE (in my face), so I will always remember to write in it every day.

I divide each page into two long columns, and pre-write the dates/day of the week at the top of the column. I feel guilty about "wasting" the space if I don't write something... and I can't write something if I don't do quilting.

EVERYTHING quilt-related goes into the journal. If I spend 4 hours on the Internet in a quilt "chat", or an hour looking through a magazine, or if I dream a quilt... everything goes into the Quilting Journal. I even attach receipts from quilt-related purchases here, too.

MUCH of quilting is INVISIBLE, but TIME-CONSUMING. If I feel myself getting depressed over not having COMPLETED something, I pull out my Quilting Journal and read that I spent a day pulling fabrics, or I trimmed paper-piecing patterns for three hours, or I sorted scraps, or I washed fabrics, or I unstitched something that was not quite right... and I realize how MUCH I got done.

It's an instant "upper", and I'm off quilting again! - kiskat in Texas

## GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

### ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.

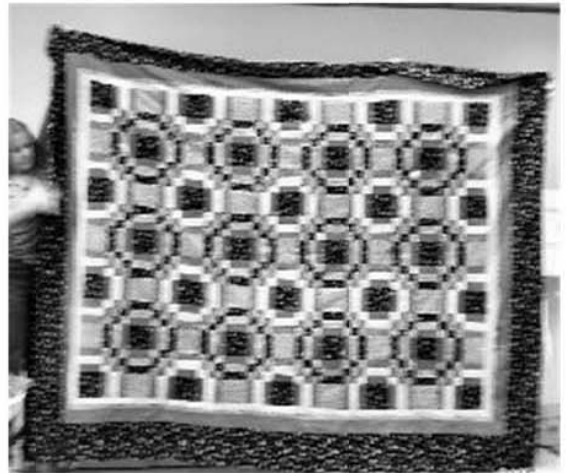

## Duties of Officers



### The President Pro Tempore shall:

1. serve as the presiding officer in the absence of the President;

3. be authorized to sign contracts pertaining to special events;
4. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.



### The Third Vice President for Programs shall:

1. provide programs for each business meeting;
2. schedule and coordinate periodic workshops;
3. be authorized to sign contracts pertaining to programs and workshops;
3. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.



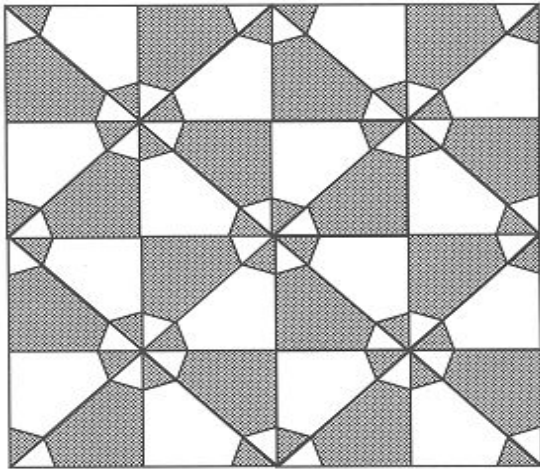
### The Treasurer shall:

1. have custody of all Guild funds;
2. be bonded and be the primary authorized signatory on all Guild accounts;
3. deposit in the general fund all monies received from all committee activities;
4. keep an accurate account of all monies received and disbursed;
5. disburse money for approved budgeted items upon receipt of invoice or other documentation from the person responsible for the budget item;
6. present a financial report at each Executive Board and at each business meeting;
7. present a proposed budget to the Executive Board at their October meeting.
8. prepare an annual financial report for the February Executive Board meeting for submission to a certified public accountant for preparation of the annual tax return;
8. perform other duties as directed by the Executive Board, or as may be incident to this office.

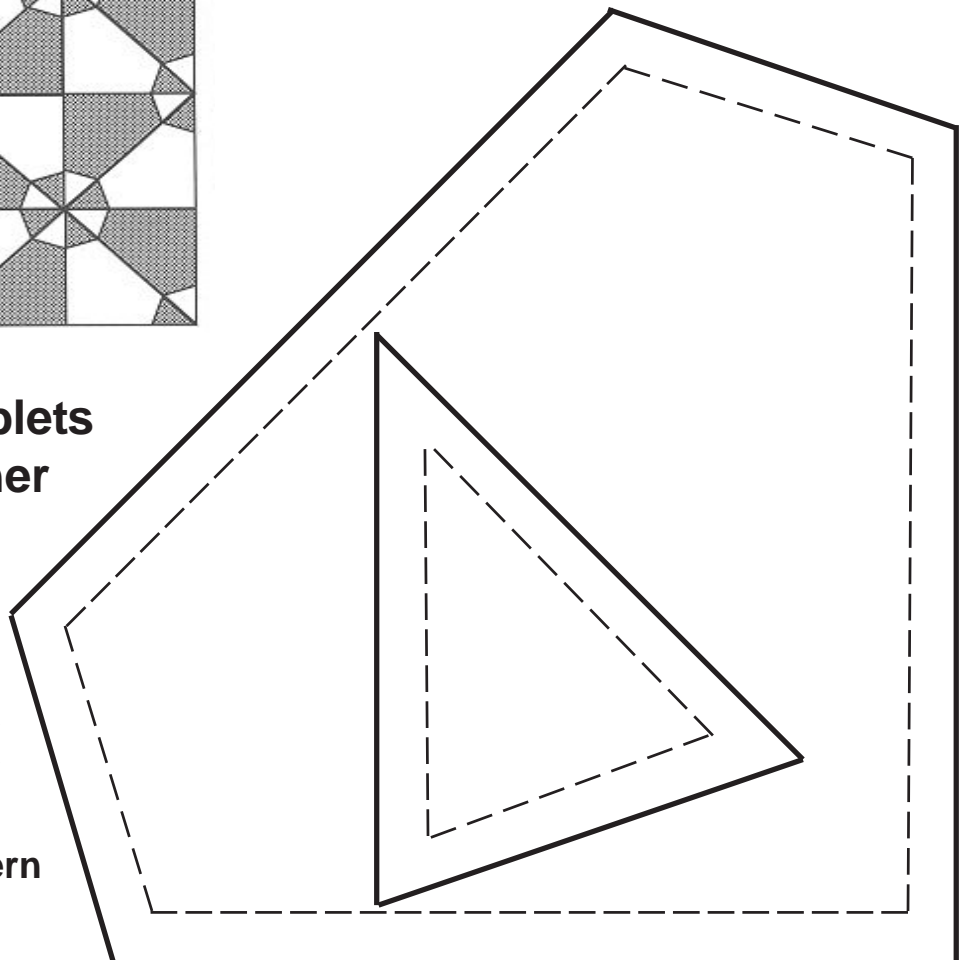

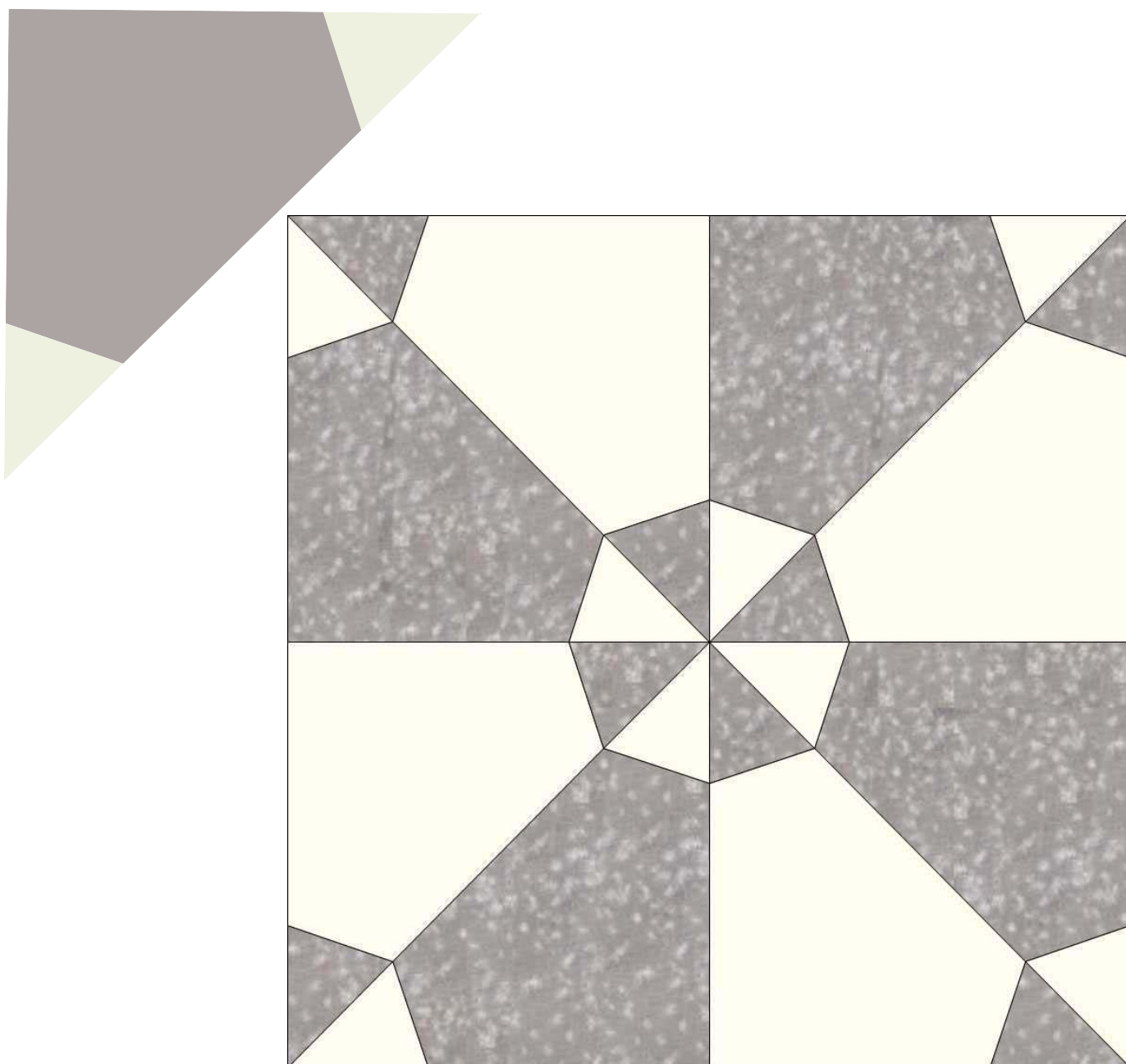

The **Turkey Giblets** block first appeared in Nancy Cabot's syndicated newspaper column in 1938. The design works well when stitched in two contrasting colors. Let's do browns and oranges.
