News from the book library...

The physical book inventory is done!! Mary Ruth and I have spent many a day over the last few months going through the book library, getting the Excel inventory into a Collectorz database, purging duplicates or non-guilt related books, applying new labels in the remaining books, and just simply bringing it all up to speed!!!

Basic housekeeping chores are left. I am now going through the database flagging those books that did not turn up during the inventory, or "Missing". The beauty of this data base is that I can flag those books as such and be on the lookout for them as time goes on. I can also flag the purged books and others that needed particular handling and always have those notes on the database.

I will publish a list of the missing books when it is complete. I ask that all members review the list and, just maybe, you have a copy of a book that is missing! While we have been conducting the inventory and getting a handle on the new program, we have been waiving late fees. Starting in July, a late fee of \$1 per month will be collected for every month a book is not turned in on time.

We have gathered four boxes of duplicate and purged books. The board is in support of offering these books to the members via a book sale. Instead of waiting until the yard sale in the

fall, or at the boutique at the next show, they will be offered at the May meeting in the first small classroom to the right of the main meeting space. From setup until the beginning of the business



meeting, ANY book will be \$5. We will stop selling when the business meeting starts. At the beginning of Bring and Brag, the price will drop to \$3 for ANY book. At the start of the program, the price will drop to \$1. Please bring exact change !!!

Pieces of the Past: Thimbles

Finger guards, or thimbles, have been made of stone, bronze, wood, leather, horn, bone, tortoiseshell, ivory, mother-of-pearl, glass, metals and porcelain. The earliest known thimble was Roman and found at Pompeii. Made of bronze, it has been dated to the first century AD.

Medieval thimbles were often made of leather, but few survived. Thimbles elaborately carved from ivory, stone, bone, mother-of-pearl and wood were popular in the Far East. In Europe, silver and gold were used

from the 15th century. In 1695 the first thimble was made in England by Lofting, a Dutch metal worker. It was called the "thumb-bell" because it was worn on the thumb and shaped like a bell. The name eventually became thimble.

Russian thimbles were not originally for sewing, but were used in combat as weapons for grappling, or to shield an archer's thumb from chafing on the bowstring.

In the Victorian age thimbles were given as a love token. Silver and gold thimbles were the most popular, but the metals were becoming scarce. When the couple married, the bottom 'band' of the thimble could be cut off and used as the wife's

wedding band.

"Dames thimbles" were used by schoolmistresses to beat a dent on the head of a naughty child - a practice known as thimble pie-making!

During World War I, silver thimbles were collected from "those who had nothing to give" by the British government and melted down to buy hospital equipment.

People who collect thimbles are known as digitabulists.

Odd but true: The most unusual use of a thimble was recorded by Lattimer Clark in 1866. He improvised a battery using a silver thimble with acid and zinc to complete the first successful cross-Atlantic cable connection.

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

ELIGIBILITY

- · Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- · (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- · Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- · Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- · If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.





July 2010 Block Party
