## GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

### ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
- (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.
- Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the following year.
- If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

Applications must be submitted on or before November 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year **after** the grant is awarded.

## Pieces of the Past: Thread

### Ellen Hernandez



Early sewing threads were made of thin strips of animal hide. The ancient Egyptians made thread from plant fibers and spun wool and hair from animals, dyeing them with berries and plants. The Chinese and

Japanese discovered silk fibers which were spun as thread and made as cloth. With the development of machines, thread production improved by being made faster, more uniform, stronger, and with truer dye colors.

Many thread companies took pride in the appearance of their spools. They were, and are, valued as much as the thread wound on them. Made of birch and maple, some spools had intricate carved scrollwork on one end. Spools were colored to help dressmakers identify the type of thread. The hourglass shaped spool sparked the creation of the Spool Quilt.

Threads are made from animals, plants, or synthetics, and combinations such as poly/cotton. The animal thread, silk, is best for animal fabrics, such as silk and wool. It is strong and can be used for buttons and decoration.



Thread from cotton plants are used with linen, rayon, and cotton, all which may shrink. Since cotton thread does not stretch, it's not a good choice for knits.

Nylon and polyester threads are preferred for synthetics and stretch knits. These threads do not shrink, are strong, and are able to stretch and recover. Of the two, polyester invisible thread is a better choice because it does not melt at low temperatures and does not get brittle or yellow. Kevlar and Nomex threads are fire-resistant and retardant, often used in making children's linens and clothing. Other specialized threads include metallic, upholstery, embroidery, and cotton perle.

Most cotton threads today are mercerized. This means it has been swollen and stretched in caustic soda and singed over an open flame to remove the fuzz. This strengthens the thread and gives it luster.

Wonder about the numbers on spools, such as 40/3 or 60/2?


1st number refers to the size of the thread - the higher the number the finer the thread.

2nd number refers to the number of plies twisted together. The more plies, the stronger and thicker the thread. Three ply thread is suitable for garment construction, 2 ply thread is generally used for decorative purposes.

When threading your hand needle, remember to **knot the end that you cut off** the spool to keep tangling at bay. Here's a mnemonic for you: Remember, **the end you Kut is the end you Knot.**

Interesting: A bale of cotton weighs 613 pounds and will produce 25,000 spools of thread.

Today wooden spools are sold as fun toys for parrots to chew on.

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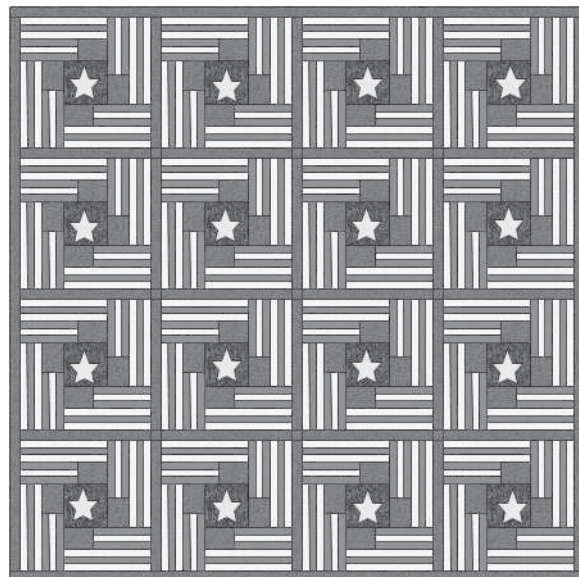
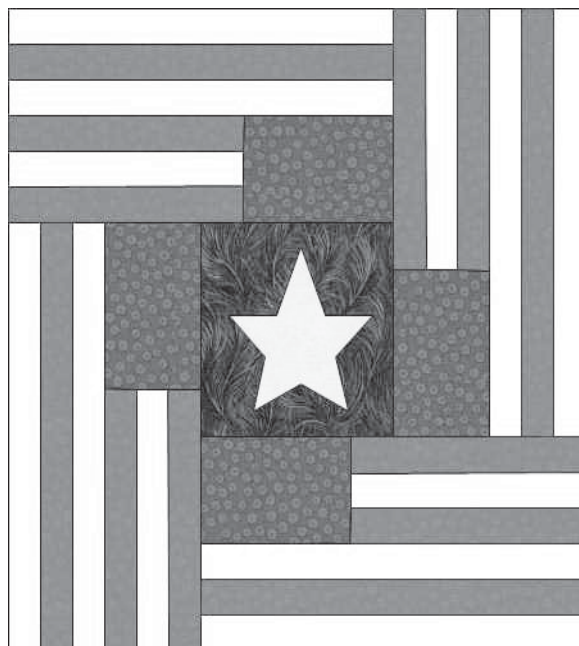


# July 2010 Block Party
