

## MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

## PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000.

## ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two
 (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.

An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.

□ Financial need will not be a criterion for selection.

Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members.

Recipient must submit in writing a final report of the project and expenses by March
 1 of the following year.

□ If recipient fails to fulfill requirements any advanced funds must be returned.

Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January guild meeting. The grant recipient's final report is due by March 1 of the year after the grant is awarded.

Pieces of the Past: Four-Block Appliqué Quilts

The mid 1800s brought enormous change to America. Lifestyles improved thanks to developments such as John Deere's steel plow, McCormick's reaper, Eli Whitney's cotton gin, steam radiators, ice machines, new stoves, lamps, and all sorts of gadgets.

Over 5 million immigrants came to America from 1815 to 1860. After the 1839 economic depression, there was more westward movement and construction of canals for steamboat transportation, and major railroads. On the fabric scene at this time, the demand for cotton was over 800 million pounds a year. More than 8 million yards of printed fabric were produced from just four mills in Pennsylvania. Imported fabrics came from France, England, and the Netherlands as well.

The need for fabric meant more mill workers were required. New England mill towns grew, enticing young girls to leave the farm and make their own wage. The mills offered boarding houses with rules of conduct and curfews, classes, and libraries. The first female labor union began at the mills.

Many 'modern' women of the day, especially in Pennsylvania and Ohio, cultivated their artful side by designing original patterns of four square appliqué quilts, popular from 1850 to 1890. Early designs were abstract, big, bold, and simple. Featuring florals, roses, tulips, leaves, feathers, carnations, eagles, cactus, watermelons, and potted flowers, four one-yard pieces (36 inch squares) were rather fast to complete. Many beds of the era were wider than ours today, and the 36 inch blocks with 18 inch borders made a well fitting 108 inch square quilt. Perhaps based on the Pennsylvania Deutch (German) folk art influences, red, green, yellow, and blue designs on a white background were common. Sometimes the background was a color, such as chrome yellow, and some had the addition of pink fabrics. Solid fabrics were used, but also small prints. The four blocks were not always identical in placement or color, with a variety of tones used.



Borders varied for these four block appliqué quilts, from none to vines or sawtooth patterns. Most were needle turned, and appliquéd with white thread. Binding was usually back to front or single width straight of grain. America's Centennial in 1876 inspired quilters to make four block eagle quilts. Free hand cut birds often had firecrackers in their mouth, or laurel leaves, gold rings, or baskets. Many families believed these appliqué quilts were more worthy of a place of honor in the home than a pieced quilt. Kentucky author, Miss Elizabeth Daingerfield wrote in 1909 that to a woman

"her piece quilts are her daily interest, but her patch (appliqué) quilts are her glory...made for the generations that come after."





Sandra Bloom compleated this wearable art by learning from the group that meets @ Creative Sewing Center on the 2nd Tue. of each month.

Karen Lambdin had one quilt that she had purchased the top at the Alamo Heritage auction and then quilted it free motion. The other one she made for her niece's graduation.




