Pieces From The Past The Hawaiian Shirt - Submitted by Ellen Hernandez



From unique, to fashionable, to gaudy, and then again cool, the Hawaiian shirt and prints have had a successful journey.





Ellery J. Chun FATHER OF THE ALOHA SHIRT

A young man's idea during the Depression gained world recognition. Ellery Chun, a new Yale graduate, returned to Hawaii to work in his father's dry-goods store. He fashioned a few men's shirts similar to the island palaka, blue and white denim shirts worn by field workers, using leftover kimono fabric. Chun's sister, Ethel, drafted the fabric designs which were printed in Japan on rayon Kabe crepe, cotton yukata, silk, and satin. The

shirt was a hit, and Chun was wise to register the name "Aloha Shirt" in 1936. Soon, other business men started similar companies, and artists such as Elsie Das and John 'King Keoni' Meigs were designing fabrics with floral designs, Matson Cruise line ships and logo, fish, and fruit.





President Harry Truman was pictured on a 1951 cover of *Life* magazine wearing a Hawaiian shirt. Eisenhower and his staff often wore the comfortable shirts. Hollywood

was responsible for the surge in tropical clothing fabric when stars such as Ginger Rogers, Betty Grable, Janet Gaynor and Bing Crosby wore them. *From Here to Eternity* stars Montgomery Clift, Frank Sinatra, and Donna Reed donned the prints on and off stage. And then of course there was Elvis in *Blue Hawaii*.





Tea timers, sleeveless tailored women's tops with Mandarin collars, were made with aloha fabrics on silk.

While popular with tourists, the Hawaiian shirt's acceptance in Hawaii itself took some time. A city and county resolution was passed in 1947 allowing employees to wear Hawaiian shirts to work from June to October. The old European suit and tie influence gradually faded. By the late 1950s, tropical

prints were made with polyester fabrics. Traditional bright patterns were substituted with muted colors in the 1970s, often turning the fabric inside out.

By the 1980s, Hawaiian shirts were making a comeback. Tom Selleck's signature *Magnum PI* jungle bird shirt was even contributed to the Smithsonian Institute. Today, vintage shirts sell at auction and on ebay for thousands.





This 1930s handmade Japanese silk is selling for \$4,500.

What happens to all those once worn Hawaiian shirts and muu muus? Many make them into colorful scrap quilts.
