Book Library Year End Report

The book library has ended 2012 with a bang!! We had several generous donations the past two years and all have been added to the database. Due to such donations, the library committee spent several weekends over the last year purging books from the library that either: (1) had not been checked out for several years; (2) were of an older technique that we have newer books on; or (3), were not directly quilt related. There is only so much space on the shelves in the storage, some just had to go! The committee thanks our Magazine Services group for taking them off our hands and making them available to the membership for a small fee.

The Board has been very generous also, with funding to support the library. I usually try and wait to order books specifically ask for by a member. With so many donations going into circulation this past year, the library had been sitting pretty comfortably! Just recently, I was given my balance and went searching for books!! Using the comfort of my computer and desk at home, I shopped till I dropped (if that's possible sitting at home)! I found many great bargains thru Amazon based on our current inventory, requests, and my own personal wish lists!!

Speaking of which, our library has so many books on patterns and techniques (probably 90%), I have been fascinated by the stories of quilters and am always on the lookout for those types of books. I have added <u>Trail</u> of <u>Thread</u>: A <u>Woman's Westward Journey # 1</u> by Linda K. Hubalek; <u>Remembering Adelia</u>: <u>Quilts Inspired by her Diary</u> by Kathleen Tracy; and <u>The Farmer's Wife Pony Club Sampler</u> <u>Quilt</u>: <u>Letters from the Lucky Pony Winners of 1915 and 90</u> <u>Blocks that Tell Their Story</u> by Laurie Aaron Hird. We have the first book on the Farmer's Wife. These books tell the stories of the quilters and some also include patterns of the quilts they speak of in the book.

Our library also has an extensive collection of fiction books that evolve around quilting. I have added <u>The Aloha Quilt</u> and <u>The Giving Quilt</u> both Elm Creek Quilt Novels by Jennifer Chiaverini. To keep a balance I also added <u>Fool's Puzzle</u> and <u>State Fair</u>, both Benni Harper Mysteries by Earlene Fowler.

Hot Fruit Salad from Christmas Breakfast Party

- 1 can sliced peaches
- 1 can pineapple chunks
 - 1 can sliced pears
 - 1 can apricots halves
 - 2 bananas, sliced

1 jar maraschino cherries (cut in half)

- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 3/4 cup brown sugar

4 tsps curry powder*

1 tsp cloves

1 tsp nutmeg

Drain and combine the canned fruits, add the cherries. Melt butter and add the sugar and spices to the butter. Pour butter mixture over fruits. Bake in 350 oven for 30 minutes or heat in microwave for 5 minutes. Remove from oven and add sliced bananas.

* I used 2 tsp cinnamon instead of curry as I know some people don't like curry.

Entry Rules

General Information

- Entries are due no later than **June 15, 2013.**
- Entry packages must include the following:
 - o **Completed entry form**, printed in ink, one form for each entry.
 - Copied forms are acceptable.

A maximum of four (4) entries will be accepted per person, excluding the Challenge category. More than one person may be listed as maker, but one person must sign the form as designated entrant. Three or more persons make a group entry.

• Entry fee is \$7 per entry for GSAQG guild members, and \$15 per entry for nonmembers.

Entry fee is non-refundable if withdrawn after the deadline (June 15, 2013). Entry fee is non-refundable if withdrawn after the deadline (June 15, 2013). One check may cover multiple entries.

No fee for entries in the Challenge category.

- Wall hangings less than 30" wide will require a 2" sleeve across the top of the quilt.
- Quilts will not be displayed without a sleeve.
- The quilt must be labeled on back of the quilt, and must include the name of the quilt and the quilt maker(s). The maker's name on the label must be covered during the judging portion of the show. <u>All</u>
- garments and miniatures must be labeled.
- No rigid frames, mounting devices or special lighting may accompany the quilt.
- Quilts entered must have been completed after January 1st, 2009.
- Items previously judged in a GSAQG show will not be accepted.

- Special awards may include: Best of Show, Viewers' Choice, Judges' Recognition, Best Use of Color, Past President Award, Best Hand Quilting, Best Machine (Stationary) Quilting, Best

Machine (Track-Mounted) Quilting, and Theme Quilt (Rainbow).

Categories Defined

- To reflect the dynamic nature of the quilter's art, our show will focus on overall construction and design and less on the mechanics of production. Accordingly, there will be no category differentiating professionally quilted work from others. To quote one of our past judges, "Well done is well done."
- **Stationary machine:** A quilt that is moved by hand under a sewing machine to do the guilting.
- **Track Mounted**: The machine is moved over the surface of the quilt to do the quilting. In the judging of these awards, both stitch production and quilting design will be considered.
- Quilters will be acknowledged on the gallery cards and in the program, but ribbons will be awarded only to the entrant, one per quilt, except where Special Awards Ribbons are given.
- Individual awards will be given for excellence in Hand Quilting, Machine Quilting (Stationary machine), and Machine Quilting (Track-mounted machine.) Those will be awarded to the quilter.

100 <u>Rainbow</u>

- 1. Any size is acceptable.
- 2. Any construction technique is acceptable.
- 3. Quilt must be predominantly the colors of the Rainbow.

- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

500 Pieced Quilt, Small

- 1. Quilt must be less than 72" on the longest side.
- 2. Construction technique is predominantly pieced.
- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

600 Mixed Technique, Large

- 1. Quilt must be at least 72" on the longest side.
- 2. Top must contain a balance of two construction techniques (piecing & appliqué).
- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

700 Mixed Technique, Small

- 1. Quilt must be less than 72" on the longest side.
- 2. Top must contain a balance of two construction techniques (piecing & appliqué).
- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

800 Scrap Quilts

- 1. Any construction technique is acceptable.
- 2. Any size is acceptable.
- 3. Any type of quilting is acceptable.
- 4. The top must contain at least 60 different fabrics.

900 <u>Group Quilt:</u>

- 1. Any construction technique is acceptable.
- 2. Any size is acceptable.
- 3. Three or more people must have participated in the construction of the quilt top.

1000 <u>Miniatures</u>

- 1. Piece must be 25" or less on the longest side. (Max 25 x 25)
- 2. Entries must be in a scale proportioned to the size of a whole quilt.

- 1. Any guilt made from a kit (purchased pattern with pre-selected fabrics) or Block of the Month pattern(from shops, mail order or magazine, etc.), including patterns with pre-selected/pre-fused fabrics

- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

1400 First Quilt

- 1. The entry must be the first quilt entered in a formal quilt show.
- 2. Any size or construction technique is acceptable.
- 3. The quilt must be the work of one or two people.

1500 Juniors

- 1. The quilt must be made by child under the age of 18.
- 2. Any construction or guilting technique is acceptable.
- 3. Limited adult help is acceptable.

1600 Wearable Art

- The piece must be intended to be worn as a garment.
- 2. The piece must be constructed using piecing or appliqué.
- 3. The quilting technique (hand/machine) is optional.
- 4. Novelty techniques are accepted: These include crazy guilting, yo-yos, etc.

1700 Challenge

- 1. Challenge fabric must be easily identifiable within the piece.
- 2. Size: 200 inches maximum perimeter measurement.
- 3. The piece must be a finished quilt and be the work of an individual.
- 4. Any technique or combination of techniques is acceptable.

1800 Other/Miscellaneous

Quilts that do not fit criteria of other categories: whole cloth, yo-yos, crazy quilts, table runners, painted/colored work that does not fit Art category rules, etc.

16 Common Threads Issue 1 Pieces From The Past Vera Bradley Fabrics - Submitted by Ellen Hernandez



Few would recognize this 1930s Elizabeth Arden model as the namesake for a multimillion dollar female owned business: Vera Bradley. Her daughter, Barbara Baekgaard, along with best friend Patricia Miller, invested \$500 and started making travel bags in their garage in 1982. Dismayed by the lack of feminine luggage while in the Atlanta airport, the duo's designs made millions within three years




The striking fabric designs and quality workmanship have ensured customer satisfaction. Some fabrics, such as this early pattern, Rose, are retired. Since 2010, new patterns are released four times a year. Quilted cotton bags are not the only Vera Bradley products available today. There are sunglasses, beach towels, flip-flops, notebooks, pencils, cards, a pet collection, and now a microfiber line.

The headquarters are in Fort Wayne, Indiana. There are 48 stores and 8 outlet stores in the US, and 7 stores in Japan. Over the last several years, some workshops closed, and a new one was opened. In 2009, Vera Bradley stated that 310 people in Indiana made 60,000 bags/month, while the rest of the bags were made overseas. By overseas, they meant China. This change in production was a disappointment to many in the US, but sales have not slowed down. Popularity remains high because so many items are still made in the US and because of the continued philanthropic activities of the company. Since 1998, over \$15 million has been donated to the Vera Bradley Foundation for Breast Cancer Research Laboratories at the Melvin and Bren Simon Cancer Center in Indianapolis in memory of their coworker Mary Sloan. Other funded charities include Riley Hospital for Children in Indianapolis which provides medical care to all Indiana children, regardless of a family's ability to pay; United Way; walk-ing/biking trails across Fort Wayne; monetary and product donations to a variety of non-profit events in Northeast Indiana and across Indiana.

In September, Patricia Miller announced that she would retire but continue to serve on the board of directors and on the board of the Vera Bradley Foundation for Breast Cancer.

Trying to find some Vera Bradley fabric? It's difficult, but you can find a few remnants on eBay of some of the designs. Watch out for knockoffs, copy-cat products that are not Vera Bradley. Sometimes they are difficult to spot.

Colorwash Fan Wednesday Feb. 20 10:00-4:00 \$50.00


