If so, bring it and we'll get some help to finish it. You will feel so much better having it off your "to do" list. Also, we are looking for some Christmas Pineapple blocks. We only need 10 more border blocks -- they have gold fabric for the light spaces on 2 sides. If you have any unfinished blocks that don't have the gold fabric, return them unfinished -- I can substitute the needed colors.

Common Threads Pieces From The Past by Ellen Hernandez

Pieces of the Past: Minton Tiles by Ellen Hernandez

Is it a floor, or is it a guilt? Quilters around the world are using Minton tiles as inspiration for fantastic guilts.



Thomas Minton's company, founded in 1788 in England, was known for porcelain, pottery, ceramic and encaustic tile. Herbert, Thomas' son, patented the encaustic process: the pattern and color are inlaid deep within the tile preventing color loss over many years. These tiles were mostly square and used for floors in places like the House of Parliament, cathedrals, royal residences and even to newly constructed homes. The tiles fit together so well very little grout was used. In the US, the tiles were quite popular and were installed in the Smithsonian, and the US Capitol additions in the 1850s. After great research and the discovery of original Minton tools and forms, restoration of worn Washington, DC tiles at the Capitol began in 1986.

New York's Central Park Bethesda Terrace Arcade, created in the 1860s with more than 15,000 Minton tiles, is the only place in the world where the tiles are used for a ceiling. The tiles were removed in the 1980s for preservation and reinstalled during restoration which was completed in 2007.

Succeeding Minton company owners focused on tableware and cloisonne enamels. The original Minton tileworks building was saved from demolition in the 1980s. MAW and Company in England continues to produce some patterns of Minton tiles and to assist with repair and restoration.



The Minton tiled floor at St George's Hall in Liverpool, laid in 1852, was covered with a wooden floor in 1860. In January 2012 the tiles were uncovered for public viewing.

Maybe one of the many Minton tile patterns will inspire your next quilt.






