GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

The April 1, 2013 board meeting of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild was called to order by President Ida Blankenship at 3:00pm. Attending were Ida Blankenship, Mary McCarthy, Cindy Shutt, Linda Ethridge, Gail Dickman, Sherry Durringer, Sandy Bloom, DeaJae Shore and Sylvia Jolet. The minutes of the March 2013 board meeting were approved as presented.

President – Ida Blankenship: The letter of resignation of the 2nd VicePresident for Information was read and accepted by the board. The board approved the nomination of Cindy Shutt for a Calico Rosebud. The guidelines for nominations for the Calico Rose and Rosebud will be put in newsletter for members' use.

President Pro-Tem – Dea Jae Shore: A motion was made, seconded and passed to make a change in the phone service for the guild. DeaJae will investigate and bring her findings back to the board.

Secretary – Sylvia Jolet: Three calls were received this month and referred to appropriate guild representative.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt: The 2012 Guild tax report is complete and filed. Total Guild funds are \$67,456.57 as of March 31. The February treasurer's report was approved.

2nd Vice President/Information – Dea Jae Shore: The newsletter is done. The guild membership directory is at printer and should be available for distribution at the April General Membership meeting. All newsletter contributions should be sent to quiltnews@sanantonioquilt.org.

1st Vice President/Special Events – Sandy Bloom: Sherry Durringer reported that the Summer Retreat participants will have a workday on April 4 at Sherry's house. An interim report on the Quilt Show indicated about 40 quilt entries and \$9,000 income. Judith Miller has stepped up to chair the Raffle Quilt.

3rd Vice President/Programs – Mary McCarthy: April meeting will be a workday for members. Cindy will assist Mary with food/drinks. Mary will not be in town for May Guild Birthday meeting. Gail, Sandy, DeaJae, Linda and Sylvia will share responsibility for program, etc. Larry and Lois Beauchamp will present program. Member signup for June Eleanor Wright Workshops will begin at the April meeting and continue at the May meeting if needed. The participant names will be drawn after the May meeting by the president and one other board member. Those selected will be contacted directly.

4th Vice President/Services – Gail Dickman: Met

with St. Andrew Church employee to discuss and clarify set-up process.

5th Vice President/Community Outreach –

Sherry Durringer: Story Book program currently has 68 quilts in 14 locations with 2 new quilts received and 14 works in progress. A total of 44.5 hours this quarter. Quilt Angels completed 3 trauma quilts in 86.95 hours. ITC quilters finished 3 quilts in this quarter in 630 hours. Bright Hopes delivered 123 quilts and 56 tote bags this quarter with 1422 hours reported.

Parliamentarian – Linda Ethridge: No report.

New business: A reminder letter will be sent to members who have not renewed membership. Melanie McInnis will co/chair next Guild Auction. The Hyatt Resort Spa room has inquired about getting some quilts. Ida Blankenship will research.

- Current Board members are eligible if the significant service does not fall under their Board position purview.
- Any member may recommend another member for the award for exceptional service to the Guild by submitting a written recommendation to the Executive Board.
- At the monthly board meeting the President presents the recommendations to the board, which gives approval or disapproval for the award for that month.
- The recipient of the award is announced at the following business meeting and a short article about the individual and the reason for the award is published in the following month's newsletter.
- If no recommendation is given by a member, the board may recommend an individual for the award or not give one for that month.
- If several recommendations are submitted, they may be held over for succeeding months.
- The award consists of a small token of appreciation.
- Only one award may be presented to any one member in any given year.



Rosebud Award

This award is presented to a member for above average performance of duties for which they have volunteered.

- Recipient must be a member of the Guild.
- Any member may recommend a recipient to the board, in writing.
- Board may choose recipient without a member recommendation.
- There is no restriction on the number of Rosebud awards given in one month or in the number of awards a member may receive in any given year.

Pieces From The Past by Ellen Hernandez

Pieces of the Past: A Third Hand by Ellen Hernandez



What collectors now consider to be pieces of art were originally sold to benefit the health of those who sewed. By gripping fabric, the *Third Hand* tool allowed the seamstress to comfortably use both hands, thus eliminating rounded shoulders and stooped backs. And, 100 - 200 years ago nothing said romance like receiving a third hand as a token of your betrothed's love.

The sewing bird was invented in England in the 17th century. The first designs were made of wood or iron. During the Victorian era they were also made of brass, steel, ivory, and even silver. The basic bird had a clamp or screw to attach to a table. Pressing the hinged tail of the bird opened the beak for insertion of fabric. As designs improved, the birds might have a pincushion, emery ball, thread cutter, scissor sharpener, spool or thimble holder, or winding reel for thread or yarn.

Birds were not the only design used for the *Third Hand*. There were cherubs, dogs, fish, frogs, snakes, and imaginary animals.



This brass dragon fish recently sold on ebay for \$3,000.

The New Jersey Monmouth Museum holds one of the largest collections of sewing clamps, known as "grippers" in the US. Their popularity diminished after the invention of the sewing machine, when less hand sewing was done.

Eleanor Wright Grant

I'd like to take this opportunity to tell you all in writing just how the Eleanor Wright workshops are managed. If you have questions I will be glad to answer them.

It was decided at the time the grant originated that June would be the best month to hold the workshops. No major guild activities were planned for June and it was considered that the members would be available to fill the classes.

The national teacher is chosen two years or more in advance by the 3rd VP Programs. This is done with suggestions from the membership. Every teacher is required to give a presentation to the guild at the June meeting. The actual classes are decided closer to the date of the workshops. Again, this is up to the 3rd VP Programs with input from the board and general membership. The number of students is set by the teacher. Sometimes this can be negotiated. It is *always* limited by the room design - the number of available electrical outlets being the prime concern.

Sign up for the classes takes place at the April and May guild meetings. Any member may sign up for one or both classes. While the guild receives no money, there may be fees due to the teacher on the day for patterns, etc. which are the responsibility of the attendee.

Immediately following the May business meeting, the President and another board member retire to a side room with the sign up sheets. Since the sign up sheets are numbered it is easier to draw numbers than to write names and draw them. The first drawing is for the Friday class, the second is for the Saturday class. A member may attend only the class for which her/his name is drawn first. From the remaining names three alternates are drawn for each class. This information is given to the 3rd VP who then contacts the selected members with the needs list and class information. It may sometime occur that the number of sign ups is no more than the teacher's limit in which case all who signed would be able to attend.

It should be evident that the \$1000 allotment comes nowhere near covering the cost of these workshops. But then workshops were not set up to make money.

I hope this clarifies the process a bit. - Mary McCarthy

ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM**

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year following receipt of the grant**. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, **at a minimum of (3) three months before** the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **by March 1** of the year following receipt of the grant.
