September 9, 2013

The Board meeting of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild was called to order at 3:00 pm by Ida Blankenship. Members present were Gail Dickman, Melanie McInnis, Mary McCarthy, Sherry Duringer, Carol Bryant, Cindy Shutt, Sylvia Jolet and Ida Blankenship. The August minutes were approved.

President - Ida Blankenship - A suggestion to have a scissors sharpener man to one of the guild meetings was discussed. Gail will research further and bring to the membership to determine any interest for this service. A short meeting will be held after the general membership meeting of those interested and are working on quilts for the Hyatt Resort project. A Calico Rose was given to DeaJae Shore at the show followup meeting for her leadership of the Quilt Show this year. An announcement of this will be made at the general membership meeting, Board members were encouraged to visit Quiltinghub.com for information. President Pro-Tem - Melanie McInnis - Research continues for upgrade/replacement of guild's current PA system.

Secretary – Sylvia Jolet – a purchase for 372days/845minutes was made for Tracfon. There were a number of calls during quilt show from folks trying to find the location. In future the phone should be at show for general guild use.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt – July financials have been reviewed. Very preliminary show net is \$20,665.18. The August guild total fund balance is \$68,779.79.

1st VP – Special Events – Carol Bryant – Concern is that the Houston Bus trip passenger minimum will not be met. The chair will continue to recruit. Winter Retreat participant list is full. Glenda Harris is the chair of the next summer retreat and it is too early to begin accepting registration. Kits are ready for members to work on for next fall's quilt auction. No final report on quilt show is available at this time. 2nd VP – Information – DeaJae Shore - Melanie McInnis will operate the powerpoint at meeting in DeaJae's absence.

3rd VP- Programs - Mary McCarthy - Ida volunteered to assist with lunch plans for September Workday. Carol will assist with meals and snacks for mini retreat in September. October program will be Melinda Bula. November program will be Vicki Owen, Ethel Howey Grant winner, on paper piecing. December will be the annual Christmas Party. A chairperson is needed for this event. January 2014

program will be Ruth Felty, Ethel Howey Grant winner on fused thread play. February program will be mini-demos.

4th **VP – Services – Gail Dickman -** a clarification on committees' usage of their budget was made.

5th **VP – Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer** – Carol Steely is shadowing Sharon Ross, chair of the Bright Hopes to take that position. A request was received from someone at Christus Santa Rosa Children's Hospital to discuss some type of quilt project. Sherry will investigate further.

Parliamentarian – Linda Ethridge - A slate of candidates for next election is complete. President Pro-Tem, Judith Miller; 1st VP Special Events, Carol Bryant; 3rd VP Programs, Rebecca Cook; Treasurer, Cindy Shutt. More candidates will be accepted.

Unfinished business – Budget requests should be submitted to Treasurer by Oct 1.

New business – none.

GSAQG Guild Meeting Minutes

September 14, 2013

The meeting was called to order by Ida Blankenship, president, at 10:05 am.

President – Ida Blankenship - Seven new members were welcomed and given a guild pin. There are 107 members and 3 guests present. \$1.75 was collected in name tag fines. A big thank-you was given to all for a very successful quilt show. DeaJae Shore will be given a Calico Rose for her leadership of the quilt show. Minutes of the August Guild meeting were approved at published. Bernie Farris was introduced as the chair of the 2015 Quilt Show. A short meeting of the participants in the Hyatt Resort Spa quilt project will be held after the general meeting. Lisetta Ennis, new chair, gave an update of the status of the Memorial Quilt and need for input from members.

President Pro-Tem – Melanie McInnis – no report

Secretary – Sylvia Jolet – 372 days/845 minutes were purchased for Tracfon. A suggestion to have guild phone available at guild functions was made in response to number of calls received during show.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt – names of individuals who worked at door ticket sales were called and they were congratulated for selling 2,666 tickets. Preliminary show financial report shows \$52,294.28 (income); \$32,728.40 (expenses);

\$19,455.88 (balance). This reflects a slight decline in net income from previous years. Current total guild funds is \$68,779.79.

1st VP – Special Events – Carol Bryant – Sandra Lowell reported that 48 spaces have been reserved for the Houston International Quilt Show bus. This is a go and a waiting list is being taken. Linda Ethridge showed several quilt auction items and encouraged members to visit her table to take projects home. The date for the auction is no set but will be in late September/early October 2014. They currently have 32 tops ready for completion. This represents about 1/3 of needed quilts.

2nd VP – Information – DeaJae Shore - no report 3rd VP – Programs – Mary McCarthy – today's program will be the guild workday on projects for Bright Hopes, Quilt Angels, QPC, and Quilt Auction. October program is Melinda Bula's bluebonnets and sunflowers. November program is Vicki Owen, a Ethyl Howey Grant recipient, on paper piecing. Dember is guild Christmas Party. January 2014, Ethel Howey grant winner, Ruth Felty will show us fused thread play.

4th VP – Services – Gail Dickman - The guild library has 12 new books for members use. Members are encouraged to return DVD's on time. Golden Carrot award was Lani Nunley. A big thank you to all those who worked at the quilt show on demos. Door prizes were drawn at this time. A motion was made, seconded, and approved after discussion, to invite Cesar Martinez, scissor man, to come to a meeting to sharpen scissors for members.

5th **VP – Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer** – Interested volunteers for ITC were encouraged to act now since the mandatory Volunteer Orientation for ITC will be held September 30. Storybooks/quilts are at 5 new locations this year. Currently 92 quilts and books are out this fall in 10 private and 12 public schools. These will be visited/viewed by 4000 to 5000 children.

42 quilts were turned in today for Bright Hopes. Plenty of work for today. Quilt Angels will work on trauma quilts today.

Parliamentarian – Linda Ethridge – Nominating committee report: Candidates for upcoming open positions are Judith Miller, President Pro-Tem; Carol Bryant, 1st VP Special Events; Rebecca Cook, 3rd VP Programs; Cindy Shutt, Treasurer.. Anyone interested in running for one of these positions are encouraged to contact Linda.

Pieces of the Past: 42. Turtle Quilts

The pattern of a quarter circle within a square can be traced to ancient Roman mosaics, as seen here at the Caracalla Baths, Rome, Italy, built in AD 212.



Transferred to fabric, the *Mill Wheel* or *Rob Peter to Pay Paul* quilt pattern probably came from England. In the US Colonies, many names were used for the traditionally two colored quilts, depending on the layout: *Wanderer in the Wilderness, Rocky Road to Dublin, Drunkard's Trail, Solomon's Puzzle, Old Maid's Puzzle, Wonder of the World, Endless Trail, Crooked Path, Boston Trail, Country Cousin, Old Maid's Dilemma, the Milkmaid's Path, Fool's Puzzle, Algonquin Trail, Falling Timbers, Steeplechase, Love Ring, Sunshine and Shadows, Lone Ring, and Snake Trail.*




The diagonal lines in the *Drunkard's Path* variation resembled a drunkard's staggering walk. The pattern was considered bad luck, as the person who slept under it might develop a thirst for drink and wander far from home. Popular in the 19th and 20th centuries, this pattern was used to promote the abolition of slavery, women's rights, and the Temperance movement. Blue and white was the Temperance Union colors: white for purity and blue for water, a pure beverage source. Whether all blue and white Drunkard's Path quilts were for Temperance is debatable. At the time, colorfast superior indigo dyes were quite popular and commonly used for quilts.



This turtle pattern version was published twice in the weekly *Kansas City Star* and once in the weekly *Star Farmer*: 6 Jan 1943, *Turtle on a Quilt* and 13 Apr 1949, *Terrapin. Turtle Quilt* appeared only in the OK/Arkansas edition. It was popular for children and as a scrap quilt.







The 1999 Sotheby's auction of important American folk art included this circa 1910 quilt from Georgia. The 30 red turtles are pieced on pale yellow, and the turtle heads and tails are stuffed. White shirt buttons are eyes. It sold for \$12,650.




