Common Threads

Pieces of the Past, 44: Bendigo Signature Quilt Ellen Hernandez



- Who? Mary Ann Hill and sewing ladies of Bendigo
- What? An embroidered signature quilt
- Where? Bendigo, Victoria, Australia
- When? 1895
- *Why?* Fundraiser at the Golden City Fancy Fair for the Sisters of Mercy Convent School.

Basic questions answered. Is this story complete? No way! This quilt mystery is still evolving. Read on.

In 2003 Evelyn Carwardine Leamon of Bendigo, Australia passed away in a nursing home. At the bottom of her closet was a pile of what was thought to be rags. Instead, the muslin piece was an antique embroidered patchwork quilt. Evelyn's family donated the

red and white quilt to the Strathdale Quilters who began its restoration. Historian Robyn Ballinger concluded that this quilt is one of only two Australian signature quilts from before 1900. Ms. Ballinger, along with the Bendigo Regional Genealogical Society set out to find information on the 270 people who signed the quilt. Some names were known to be prominent people of the area, such as DB Lazarus, the mayor of Bendigo and AJ Peacock who became Victoria's first premier. The guild began publicly displaying the quilt in hopes that viewers could add more details about the signers. In 2012 Betty M. Jackman compiled the research in a book, *Heritage Signature Quilt 1895: History of the Signatories*.



After ten years, the Strathdale Quilters needed to find a home for the restored quilt. Rejected by the library and art gallery, the quilt was donated to the Aspire Foundation in 2013. Having no physical place to display the quilt, Aspire temporarily put the quilt in the Sacred Heart Cathedral. An official unveiling ceremony was conducted in October with about 10 descendents of the

signatories attending. The Strathdale Quilters announced that they will auction a new signature quilt in the same pattern as the original, charging \$500 to \$1000

per signature. All the funds will be donated to Aspire to help build a Museum of Faith. The original quilt will be permanently displayed there.


Research continues on finding the descendants of the signatories. A facebook page keeps people updated: *aspire heritage signature quilt*


