



Pieces of the Past, 45: Poinsettia Quilt by Ellen Hernandez



Quilters have had an interest in creating Poinsettia quilts, perhaps back to the mid 1800s when red and green quilts were so popular. Album quilts and pomegranate quilts were often made with red, green, and white. One of the most striking, modern looking poinsettia quilt patterns is from 1917 by Marie Webster which includes a black and white striped border. Traditionally, Poinsettia quilts were appliquéd, but a variety of geometric and paper pieced patterns are available. Here are a few Poinsettia points of interest:



*The plant we commonly associate with Christmas, the Poinsettia, is not really a flower. Known as *Noche Buena* or Christmas Eve plant in Mexico. Flor de Pascua or

Mexico, *Flor de Pascua* or Easter flower in Puerto Rico

and Central America, and *Crown of the Andes* in Chile and Peru, the colorful bracts, or leaves, are

striking. The plant was introduced to the US in 1825 by Joel Poinsett, a physician, botanist, diplomat, congressman, and Secretary of War who was the first US Minister to Mexico. The beautiful non-native plant was later named Poinsettia in his honor.

*A 500 year old Mexican legend tells that a poor girl without a gift for Jesus' celebration was told by an angel to bring weeds to the church altar. The weeds miraculously turned into red blooms. The bright leaves holds symbolism for many countries: the star leaf as the star of Bethlehem; the red as Jesus' blood sacrifice. The plant was known to the Aztecs who used the leaves for red dye, and a medication to reduce fever.

*Poinsettias are not as poisonous as once thought, though the sap can cause allergic reactions, and if ingested may cause vomiting, and if it gets in your eye can cause temporary blurred vision.

*We have a National Poinsettia Day every December 12th, the day Joel Poinsett died in 1851.

*The sale of Poinsettias is a multi-million dollar business of more than 100 varieties, from speckled to pink to purple.




