2.14 Pieces of the Past 46: Herrschners Ellen Hernandez



German immigrant Frederick Herrschner started selling embroidery patterns and sewing items from a street vendor cart in Chicago in 1899. His loyal customers who moved out of the area asked for items to be mailed to them, which was the beginning of the mail order catalog. DMC floss from France was a favorite item, as well as clothing and stamped and perforated patterns. The first quilt kits were introduced in 1927. From the catalog pages below, some of the popular items to embroider included birdcage covers, bridge table covers, sewing machine covers, and silverware storage cases. After Frederick's death, his son Frederick, Jr. took over the company. Over 400 quilt products were available, with the addition of leather work, beading, jewelry, doll kits and painting supplies.

In 1970, the company was purchased by Quaker Oats. Now over 110 years old, Herrschners continues to provide quality sewing notions by catalog and online at *Herrschners.com*, operating from Stevens Point, Wisconsin. They

employ 150 workers, many of whom make suggestions for products, catalog layouts, and even complete samples for the catalog or the Wisconsin store. January is their busiest season. They also publish Cross-Stitch & Needlework, a bi-monthly magazine with designs and patterns and have a separate website yarnsale.com. Their former catalog items from Gimbel & Sons, of collectibles and gifts and Calli & Co., paper crafts, are incorporated into their main website. Herrschners sponsors

the largest annual afghan competition, generating the books *Herrschners Blue-Ribbon Afghans* and *More Herrschners Blue-Ribbon Afghans*.

Side note: Frederick, Jr.'s wife, Eleanor Martin, began her own company in Illinois in 1932 manufacturing and selling hair wave attachments, cosmetics, knick-knacks, and pharmaceutical supplies. In 1933 Eleanor Martin, Inc. moved from Chicago to Elgin, Illinois, and became a needle art mail-order catalog. The president of the

company was changed to Frederick in 1934. Eleanor was described as "America's leading Needlework stylist." The company ceased operations

in 1938.











Common Threads KRIS THOMSON GRANT

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant in honor of long time member, Kris Thomson. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant is to fund a project that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant of \$600.00 will be awarded to one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the grant if the quality of the proposals do not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant committee members are ineligible.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before April 1,2014, and the grant will be awarded at the May 2014 Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **two(2) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipient must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This
 may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the
 members in 2015. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Kris Thomson Grant Chairperson and the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **one month** following the presentation or workshop.

GSAQG KRIS THOMSON GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.




