GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

May 5, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President, Ida Blankenship at 3:00 pm at the St. Andrew Presbyterian Church. Members present were Cindy Shutt, Rebecca Cook, Judith Miller, Gail Dickman, Sherry Duringer, DeaJae Shore, Linda Ethridge and Sylvia Jolet. The minutes of the April 2014 board meeting were approved as published. Lani Nunley was nomination for a Calico Rose for her leadership with the Villa de San Antonio Retirement Center Bee was approved. The winner of the Kris Thompson Grant is Cathy Baisley. A policy for giving Guild pins to new members was discussed and the following was approved. "New (never before) members will receive a Guild membership pin at the meeting at which they join. Returning (after an absence) members may purchase Guild membership pins from the Membership Chair."

Judith Miller asked about the (somewhat annual) Guild Garage Sale. She received a suggestion from a member that it be open to non-members. This will be considered at the time of the next sale time.

There were 7 calls to the Guild phone this month. One was returned to address a question about the Guild. The March financial reports have been reviewed and approved. The current balance of the Guild's funds is \$65,713.87.

Sherry Duringer reported that the Texas Folklife at the ITC will be held June 7 and 8, 2014. She requested a supply of Auction information and Guild membership brochures. The Seven Sisters quilt is ready for binding for the auction. There will be a special exhibit Called Teas Masterpiece Quilts and Art Quilts will be at the ITC September 5 through December 11, 2014. The Guild quilters will be moved and be part of this exhibit.

The Fredericksburg Quilt Guild will have their award winning raffle quilt at next meeting for ticket sales to our members. Rebecca will have cupcakes and punch for Guild Birthday Party at May meeting. Board reviewed and approved the updated instructor contract. Rebecca is working on getting more info on the Guild's Facebook page. She is currently working on securing the 2016-2017 programs. The requirements for the Eleanor Wright Scholarships was discussed and will be reviewed and brought to the membership's attention

DeaJae Shore advised the board that postage is now \$.70/newsletter and how is it getting very expensive to provide this service to the members who request a hard copy of newsletter. She will

pursue ordering flash-drives for board members to maintain guild information pertaining to each office in electronic format.

Linda Ethridge reported on the Guild's Quilt
Auction preparations. The committee meeting held
last month was very successful and a possible
partnership with the Nellie Reddix Young Adult
Program surfaced. This will be further investigated.
The meeting adjourned at 4:45 p.m.

A Calico Rose was presented to Lani Nunley for her leadership for the Villa de San Antonio Retirement Center Bee which was started about 2 ½ years ago by Kitty Janiga. Their primary effort is to make guilts for Bright Hopes to be given to children at the Children's Shelter. Janet Miller presented the Kris Thompson Grant to Cathy Baisley in the amount of \$600. There were 7 calls to the Guild phone during the month. The total of Guild funds is \$65.713.87.

Linda Ethridge, Auction Chair, showed several quilts that were turned in today for the September 27 auction. Glenda Harris announced that the Summer Retreat is full but a waiting list is available for last minute substitutions should the need arise. Pieces From The Past by Ellen Hernandez

6.14 Pieces of the Past, 50: Quiltindex.org - Sarah Longbottom Davidson by Ellen Hernandez

This is my **50th** quilt history article for the Guild newsletter! Thank you for the Calico Rose. I thought this month I would share a note about my process of writing.

I enjoy quilt history and collect books on the subject. I select a topic that interests me from a book or magazine, the radio, tv, or web. Veracity is important to me, so I try to find more than one reference on the topic. If other people, places, or events are mentioned, that helps my search for confirmation. My approach is similar to my genealogy research - never assume! After editing on average 4-8 pages of collected material I don't have room to include the references. Trying to condense the information and include relevant photos is a challenge, but one I hope you continue to enjoy. Perhaps you are stimulated to research the topic yourself.



Now, on with this month's story. I'm diverging a bit with a personal account. It reminds me of Disney's 50 year old song, "It's a Small World" after all.

The Alliance for American Quilts' contest this year is about Inspiration, something from their 50,000+ documented quilts found online at www.quiltindex.org. I have entered an item in this auction fundraising event for many years, and started my plan for this year. I searched the index by categories - location, year made, name of quilt block, etc. Somewhat overwhelmed with deciding on only one quilt, I followed my genealogy interest and searched by the quilter's name category. It had to be something unusual from my family tree - not the Phillips or Smiths or Porters, but maybe my

grandmother's family name, Longbottom. I know Longbottom sounds funny, and many families changed the name in later years to Long or Bottom/s. The origin is the Longbothoms from England. I digress. Back to the search. Surprisingly I got a hit. This beautiful 1915 Lone Star quilt by Sarah Jane Longbottom Davidson popped up from the Quilts of Tennessee Project, Knox County. Eureka! Grandmother's family was from Concord, Knox County, TN and she had an aunt Sarah who married John Davidson. Lots of personal information was included in the quilt index record: born 1851, died 1924, occupation as a storekeeper, and Presbyterian. All those things were the same as MY great-aunt Sarah. The bright quilt was hand pieced cotton, hand quilted in a crosshatch grid, 69" x 86", and in unused, excellent condition.



Verifying that this Sarah was the same as the Sarah in our family, I rechecked the 1870 Census Concord, Knox County, TN and found Sarah, age 19, daughter of Benjaman and Elizabeth Longbottom, sister to 9 year old Benjaman. That fits - the younger Benjamin was my grandmother's father, born 1860. Concord was a small town, founded in 1854 by my maternal great uncle James M. Rodgers, a prominent member of the Concord Cumberland Presbyterian Church. The town grew rapidly after the railroad came, and had a large marble quarry. TN State Marriages record Sarah J. Longbottom marrying John C. Davidson 24 May 1874 in Knox County. John and Sarah

Davidson are found in the Knox County, TN census records 1880, 1900, 1910 (and Sarah as a widow in 1920.)

My Quilt Alliance inspiration square is almost finished, thanks to Great Aunt Sarah's quilt. How nice to know there were many quilters in my family tree, and that relatives preserved and recorded this lovely quilt.


