GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes 02/02/2015

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 pm. Those in attendance were Ida Blankenship, Karen Lambdin, Cindy Shutt, Linda Etheridge, Sherry Duringer, Dea Jae Shore, Jeana Kubik, Rebecca Cook, and Carol Bryant.

There were no corrections to the minutes, so they stand approved as presented in the newsletter.

President- Ida Blankenship announced the Calico Rose Award will be presented to Barbara Sumlin for her work with the Winter Retreat.

The Coggins Estate is still a work in progress and will be for a long time. There will be 2 tables at each meeting to sell the items.

Secretary – Karen Lambdin discussed how to refer a few phone calls made to the guild.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt: total cash and savings - \$68,187.04. The December financials were checked, approved, and delivered.

1st VP for Special Events – Carol Bryant – the Raffle quilt has been accepted into the Dallas Quilt show. There was a big sign ordered for the show that can be reused in future years. Registration is in progress for the mini retreat in March. There is a need for a chairperson for the Fall mini-retreat.

Ida is working on getting more vendors for the quilt show. She has 22 confirmed vendors, but would like to get 40. Board members were encouraged to pick up vendor business cards at other shows so that Ida can contact them. Program ads are another good source of income at the quilt show.

2nd **VP for Information** – Dea Jae Shore passed out new flash drives to board members. The other guild chairpersons and volunteers in need of flash drives will be getting them from Dea Jae at the meeting in February. Ida encouraged board members to add a folder to the flash drive including policies and duties that relate to the specific board position for future volunteers.

Dea Jae noted that 204 members have renewed this year. She will be sending board members a small list of members to call to encourage their renewal.

Ida discussed the possible need to set up an emergency phone chain in case of the need to cancel meetings due to bad weather or other crises. Discussion was tabled for now. Ida also asked board members to review the policies and bylaws for possible updates next year.

3rd **VP for Programs** – Rebecca Cook announced the Bonnie Hunter workshops are full. The meeting is likely to be full and extra chairs may need to be set up.

Rebecca discussed a financial request from a future speaker, which would be against current policy. The board is considering the request.

4th **VP for Programs** – Jeana Kubik received a new list of DVDs from Jackie Randall. This list is on the web page also.

5th VP for Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer announced that Jeana Kubik volunteered to quilt the

KLRN donation quilt. Linda Kirk and helpers are taking the storybook quilts to schools this week. Also, Linda's Haiku project is in full swing with all of her packets checked out.

Sherry plans to write up a clear plan for the items to be donated to the Roy Maas Youth Alternative program for the new volunteer.

There was discussion about a request from one of the community outreach programs.

Final items – the cost for the new large sign for the quilt show can be prorated over the next 3 – 4 shows. The sign has no date or location on it, so it can be used in future shows. The necessity of street banners was also discussed. Facebook and newspaper ads worked well at the past quilt show.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:20 pm.



3.15 Pieces of the Past, 59: Martha Washington's Penn's Treaty Quilt by Ellen Hernandez



This 100" square medallion quilt of linen and cotton with penciling is attributed to Martha Washington around 1785. The quilt was passed down to Martha's niece, Frances Dandridge Henley Lear. Frances' step-

granddaughter, Louisa Lear Eyre, later inherited the quilt and featured an illustration and story of it in her 1906 biography, Letters and recollections of George Washington: being letter to Tobias Lear. (Tobias tutored George Washington's children and became his private secretary and military aide.) A review of her book in *The Reader* described the quilt as a "variegated horror", and a "dinky historical souvenir." Not everyone agreed with this critique, and Louisa donated the quilt to the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association in 1931.

The copperplate toile print in the center was quite popular in Martha's day and was reproduced several times in browns and reds. It was copied from a 1771 Benjamin West oil painting depicting the 1683 treaty between William Penn and the Lenape Turtle Clan. A bolt of cloth is depicted in the print as part of the trade. The print was used for many household items and a 1788 advertisement by John Penn, Jr. described his items for sale as "William Penn's Treaty with Indians on cotton bed curtains and window curtains." This copperplate was









used for reproduction until 1932.



GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained.
 This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG


