## **GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes**April 3, 2015

The meeting called to order at 3:04 PM. Members attending were Ida Blankenship, Karen Lambdin, Cindy Shutt, Dea Jae Shore, Linda Ethridge, Jeana Kubik, Rebecca Cook, and Carol Bryant. The March minutes were approved as is.

A motion was made to award Janice Frankenberger a Calico Rose for her work on the Mini-retreat. The motion was seconded and approved. The board approved the awarding of the Allred Grant to Nancy Beasley.

Board members were invited to an open house at Safesite storage building on April 10.

**Treasurer** – Cindy Shutt reported a balance of \$77,448.92. The February accounts have been checked and approved.

1st VP for Special Events Carol Bryant shared progress with the quilt show. Pins are in, the banner is ordered, and printing is done. Ida has 39 vendors signed up for the show.

The Summer Retreat is full.

**2**<sup>nd</sup> **VP for Information** Dea Jae Shore – Rebecca Cook will take charge of the projector at the meeting.

**3rd VP for Programs** Rebecca Cook – De LeClair will be the speaker at the meeting this month. Bright Hopes will hold a Quilt Tying Party after the meeting, members will need to provide their own lunch.

At the May workday, members will be reminded to bring machines, optional, and lunches will be provided.

**4<sup>th</sup> VP for Services** Jeana Kubik – discussed the new storage unit and the new lock combinations. The President Pro Tem, Judith Miller is officially in charge of the storage units and sign-in sheets at the unit.

Jeana typed up a new form for announcements at the meetings. She will put them on the Welcome Table at the meetings. Carol Rouse has a special quilt top set aside for donation to Elf Louise.

5<sup>th</sup> VP for Community Outreach Sherry Duringer was not able to attend, but she sent in a report. The Quilters Save Our Stories committee is taking a break until July. There is need of a new beekeeper at the ITC. The Memorial Quilt for UT Health Science Center is ready and will be shown at the April guild meeting.

There was discussion about the free table at the back of the meetings. These items are free for anyone. If someone has a special item to donate to one of the committees, he/she should bring it to that committee chair and not the free table.

**Parliamentarian** Linda Ethridge reminded board members to bring in donations for the Silent Auction.

Other Business:

QPFC – Quilt Project Finishing Committee, Ida formed this group to

- plan the assembly of quilt block sets, many of which have been donated
- finish the plan, stitching out and producing tops for guild auctions and other requests
- · strengthen friendships with quilters
- learn new skills and techniques
- have a place for the donation of sets of blocks
   After discussion, a motion was made to officialize
   the QPFC, was seconded and approved. A second
   motion to allow the QPFC a budget of \$350/year for
   supplies was seconded and approved.

### **Policy Corrections and Changes**

The board corrected the Policy section of the Directory to include the existing committees

- Memorial Quilt, Permanent Collection, Quilters Save Our Stories, and Mini-Retreat, plus the new Quilt Project Finishing Committee (QFPC). They will appear in the alphabetical list when it is printed next year.

Board members should write in these additions to current directory.

It was decided to award a Certificate of Recognition to Carol Rouse in April for her aboveand -beyond work on the QPC over the years. The board meeting was adjourned at 4:50pm.

New this month are: In a Heartbeat (machine applique/cut away); The Big Apple (a very, very large apple core in flannels makes it easy to machine stitch the curve), Fan (hand applique a partially made fan), and Renaissance Romance (double wedding ring -- Yes, it is more curves!)

For the Guild Work Day next month, QPC has a few pieces to be finished. First, the Funky Chickens -- only 2 blocks need borders, then it's ready to set together and add a border. Second, there are at least 2 tops that are ready for borders, and third, we have some projects that only need one more block (such as Orange No Name, Floating Squares)

Pieces of the Past: Ann West's Coverlet ...by Ellen Hernandez



When Ann West made this wool coverlet in 1820, little did she know it would create a British national incident. She lived in Chippenham, Wiltshire, West England and owned a millinery and dressmaking shop. Her medallion style coverlet centers around Adam in the Garden of Eden, surrounded by 64 panels of everyday characters. She included explanatory embroidered captions (some directly on the panels, some on yellow fabric) perhaps as a teaching tool. Wool pieces such as Ann's were made during this time by male tailors to advertise their skill for coats and uniforms.


Besides Bible characters, the panels include distressed widows, an unemployed poor sailor, and a double wedding ceremony. The Woman of Samaria, from a Bible story, is dressed in clothing similar to what a 19th century British woman would have worn. Ann signed the coverlet, "Remember Me and Forget me Not, Ann West's work, 1820."

The coverlet went up for sale in 2006. The owner had discovered it in a trunk in someone's garage. He needed the money to fund his trip to the World Cup.

The British Culture Minister, David Lammy, responded to the sale by placing a temporary export bar on Ann's coverlet with this edict: "this pictorial coverlet







The coverlet sold for \$55,000 and was purchased by Friends of the Victoria and Albert Museum. The historical piece remains in England at the V&A.

### GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

### ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained.
   This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

### **GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS**

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG

- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.


