presentation. Quilts need labels sewn on and tops need to be assembled into kits. All are welcome to stay and any help will be greatly appreciated.





Kits for blocks will be available at our February meeting Blocks must be completed and turned in at the April meeting.



Common Threads Pieces of the past

12:15 Pieces of the Past, 68: Watson Sisters' Quilts, by Ellen Hernandez



This stunning modern looking silk kaleidoscope quilt was made by Elizabeth Watson in 1890. She lived on a farm in Cumbria, England with her two sisters, Annie and Sara-Jane, who were also quilters. It is recorded that they rose at 5am and after chores they spent daylight hours sewing. Elizabeth made this quilt for her *bottom drawer* (hope chest) though she never married.

The brilliant purples and pinks used in this and the Log Cabin quilt were possible due to the failed efforts of a chemistry student. In 1856 during the Crimean War

William Perkin, 17, was unsuccessful with an experiment using coal tar to produce quinine, an





anti-malaria drug. When he washed out the beakers he created a bright purple solution - mauvine. This first synthetic dye bonded well with silk and wool fibers. Prior to this, purple dyes, which faded quickly, came from snails and was an expensive process. Only the wealthy could afford them which is why it is referred to as a royal color. Queen Victoria made mauve popular after wearing a

silk dyed dress to the Royal exhibition in 1862. Perkin continued his research developing other dyes

including *Perkin's Green* and *Britannia Violet*. The dyes were used as stains to identify bacteria which had previously been invisible.


These quilts are two of 800 items owned by *The Quilters' Guild of the British Isles* formed in 1979, currently with 7,000 members. They also have this *1718 Silk Patchwork Coverlet* thought to be the oldest patchwork quilt in the UK. They have housed the items at the *Quilt Museum and Gallery in York, UK* until October 31st when unfortunately the museum **closed** due to lack of financial support. Fifteen of their quilts were last displayed at the Houston



International Quilt Show 2015 as part of Kaffe Fasset's *Ancestral Gifts* collection. The Guild will continue to care for the collection and is searching for a location to exhibit items in the future.
