GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

President Ida Blankenship opened the meeting at 3pm. Others in attendance were Karen Lambdin, Elaine Staller, Sherry Duringer, Dea Jae Shore, Cindy Shutt, Jeana Kubik, Virginia Oehlke, Janet Miller, Linda Ethridge, and Barbara Sumlin (as a visitor).

The minutes for the December board meeting were approved as presented.

It was decided to award the Calico Rose to Linda Lyle and Sandy Schoenfeld at the January meeting.

Ida reported that Ellen Hernandez submitted 5 patriotic quilt tops to the Home of the Brave Quilt Project. Several members helped with the blocks. Ellen shared a Certificate of Appreciation sent to GSAQG. Dea Jae will share the news on the powerpoint.

President Pro Tem – Virginia Oehlke reported the purchase of new locks for the storage buildings. They have the same combination as the old ones.

Secretary – Karen Lambdin reported a call from the Local Community News regarding an upcoming story about quilting bees.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt reported a balance of \$71,836.11. The November financials have been checked and approved. The budget is almost finalized.

1st Vice President for Special Events – Elaine Staller had a question about reporting volunteer hours. These hours are kept on file, but aren't reported to the IRS.

There will be an email blast to remind members to submit raffle quilt designs. Carol Bryant has been looking at venues for the next quilt show.

The Winter Retreat is full and there is a waiting list. The dates for mini-retreats were discussed.

2nd **Vice President for Information** – Dea Jae Shore will be sending the policies and procedures portion of the directory for board members to proofread. 193 members have paid dues, but that leaves 122 that didn't renew yet. She would like to make the deadline for renewal be the January meeting date, so the directory can be ready at the February meeting.

A motion was made to change the web host for the guild website, the motion was seconded and approved. The web page might be down for a week during the process.

Dea Jae reminded board members to go to Dropbox for current membership information.

3rd Vice President for Programs – Janet Miller asked if any board members would like to dine with Sue Nickels this weekend.

In February, Mark Lipinski cancelled. A replacement speaker will be Jessica Darling, a modern quilter from

Austin.

In March, Karen Lambdin will teach a Friday class, Gone Quilting from Bandera will present a trunk show, and there will be a Bright Hopes workday after the meeting.

In April, Linda Poole will be teaching and lecturing. Suggestions were made for programs for the July, October, and November meetings.

A motion was made to limit members to one Bring and Brag item on guild days when there is a speaker. The motion was seconded and approved. Ida will announce the new policy at the meeting and Dea Jae will put reminders on the powerpoint.

4th **Vice President for Services** – Jeana Kubik wants to start a group to make the president's quilt. She plans to make new signs for the tables. She asked to buy several swiffers for cleanup of the church hall, and got several donations instead.

The Rockport Quilt Guild will have their raffle quilt at the meeting.

5th Vice President for Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer gave the 4th quarter reports. Sherry asked to share a new ALS Quilt Challenge with guild members. She will make an announcement at the meeting and newsletter, and post forms on the website.

Barbara Sumlin made a request to the board to reinstate the Quilt Angels Committee. It was decided to blend the Quilt Angels committee with the new Community Response Committee. Janet Miller and Barbara Sumlin will rewrite the job description for the new committee. Shelving and containers in the storage building are available for them.

In March, Karen Lambdin will be teaching a portrait quilting class, Gone Quilting quilt shop will present a trunk show, and after the meeting, there will be a mini workday for Bright Hopes. children - of a special period in their lives when they are beyond infancy and before their teens."


Denise Holly Ulinskas is an author and watercolor artist best known for her Toot and Puddle children's books and a little faceless patchwork illustration similar to Sunbonnet Sue called Holly Hobbie. Denise was the real Holly Hobbie, married to Douglas Hobbie. She





created her blue bonneted character in 1967 for American Greeting cards. Her messages included: 'Life's greatest blessing is a happy heart'; 'Happiness is found in little things'; and 'Start each day in a happy way.' The simple Americana charm of the calico clad girl caught on quickly, perhaps influenced by the folk movement and the popular 1970s tv show Little House on the Prairie and Laura Ingalls Wilder's books. Soon Holly

Hobbie was everywhere from rag dolls sold by Knickerbocker Toys to lunch boxes, toy ovens, stickers, dishes, linens, clothing, and fabric. Laura Ashley is said to have been inspired by Holly Hobbie at the time designing small pastel cotton prints and prairie-type dresses.


















Other authors and illustrators copied the Holly Hobbie character placing her in mystery novels, feature movies, and most recently paired with a set of 'girlfriends' named Amy, Heather, and Carrie with Doodles the dog, Cheddar the pig, and Bonnett the cat. LeAnn Rimes sang the theme song "Twinkle in Her Eye" for five Holly Hobbie and Friends DVD movies. Marie Osmond helped revive Holly Hobbie toys in 2006 with her porcelain and rag dolls.





Holly lives in Massachusetts and continues to write and paint. Her newest book is about her favorite spooky childhood story, Hansel & Gretel.
