March 7, 2016

President, Ida Blankenship called the meeting to order at 3:02 pm. Those in attendance were Karen Lambdin, Dea Jae Shore, Sherry Duringer, Janet Miller, Virginia Oehlke, Cindy Shutt, and Linda Ethridge.

There were no corrections to the February board meeting minutes, so they stand approved as presented.

There were no nominations for the Calico Rose this month.

Ida discussed the results of the survey taken at the Feb. meeting. It was decided to include these forms in the newcomer folders.

President Pro Tem – Virginia Oehlke was reminded that Ida will not be at the May meeting.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt reported cash and savings balance of \$65,056.16. The January financials have been checked and approved.

1st VP for Special Events –Elaine Staller was not in attendance, but emailed a report. The Summer Retreat has a few openings. The Bluebonnet Quilt Auction (the new name) will be Sept. 17. There will be a \$5 admission ticket with incentives for members to sell tickets. Virginia Oehlke volunteered to chair a Spring Mini-Retreat on April 22-23. Dea Jae will help.

2nd **VP for Information** – Dea Jae Shore will not be at the May meeting. She never received photographs from the photographers at the last meeting, so was not able to post Bring and Brag photos on the website. The mailing of the leftover directories cost \$70. Next year she will not be

publishing the policies and bylaws in the directory, so it will cost even less.

3rd **VP for Programs** – Janet Miller passed around the written policy change discussed at the last meeting. It will be published in the next newsletter. She discussed the programs for the rest of the year.

4th VP for Services – Jeana Kubik could not attend. There is a volunteer to take over the library committee.

5th VP for Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer asked for an email blast informing members of supplies needed for the workday. It was decided that there needs to be signs at the appropriate tables about Golden Carrot tickets. Other Business – Dea Jae would like to include information about an online block sharing program in the eblast.

QPFC may change the time and location of their meetings.

The need for board members to approve co-chair choices was discussed.

Also, the committee chairs should be working on job description updates.

4.16 Pieces of the Past, 72: Chester County Criswell Quilt, by Ellen Hernandez



Mary Criswell of Chester County, PA was engaged to Jesse Jackson Smith in 1852. Her friends secretly created red, green, and white applique signature blocks for her bridal quilt. Mary found out about the surprise and she decided that she and her best friend, Martha, should make identical blocks. Mary's is inscribed, "My album is a garden plot, Here all my friends may sow, Where thorns and thistles flourish not, but flowers alone will grow." The 104 inch quilt has survived these many years although many of the red fabrics have disintegrated. It has 60 twelve inch blocks surrounding a larger 24 inch central block. Thirty-three block designs were

used and on each was written the name of a family member, friend, or neighbor. Some blocks also included poems or special greetings. The center block was made

by Mary's mother, a well-respected seamstress and quilter. It is inscribed with Mary's parents' names rather than the bride and groom, a bit unusual.



The quilt was passed down

through the family generations and is now owned by Sharon Barnes of Victoria, Australia, Mary's great-great-granddaughter who is also a quilter. In 2012, the 160th anniversary of the Criswell quilt, Sharon decided to make a replica. She drafted each block and made the blocks available online for others who might be interested in making the quilt as well. Block patterns were released



monthly and it took three years to reveal the 33 designs. Sharon wrote a book about her extensive research into the identification of the people named on the quilt, 'Round is the Ring that Has No End', available as an e-book on amazon and etsy. In January Sharon began another quilt along, this time at a rate of one block each week @ twobitspatches.com. There is also a blogspot http://www.chestercriswellquilt.blogspot.com.au/ and a facebook page and pinterest pictures.


