10.16 Pieces of the Past, 78: Oh, Snap! by Ellen Hernandez

Called press-studs, poppers, tichs, ball and sockets, rivet buttons, or snap fasteners, this type of closure dates to 201 BC when used on horse halters in China's Terracotta Army. Today's snap version was invented by the German Heribert Bauer for men's trousers in the 1800s. They were not rustproof. He sold the invention to the Prym company in 1903 and it is still a major producer of Snap Fasteners. About the same time a similar product was



invented by Australian Myra Juliet Farrell.



Snaps were important in theatrical garments for quick changes and to embellish the outside of garments. An ad in 1904 *McCall's Magazine* was "...Hear it Snap---even the blind can fasten it." The military used snaps for clothing as well as for gear such as canteen covers and bags. Fashion designers used snaps on many items like spats and gloves. Later snap versions were brass, nickel plated, and rustproof. In the 1960s, plastic snaps appeared, and in the 1970s there was a nylon version.

Jack Weil, founder of Rockmount Ranch Wear of Denver, CO who coined the phrase "the West is not a place, it is a state of mind," put snaps on his Western styled shirts in the 1930s which are still popular today. His first snap designs were square, circle or diamond topped with pearl and backed with tin and were strong enough to pass through wringer washing machines.

There are three snap designs – the ring type for heavier fabrics, prongs for lighter strength, and those that can be sewn.




