Friday's class will be Quilts with Great Edges, learn a multitude of techniques for finishing the edge of your quilt. Sewing machine with walking foot if available. Class is \$35.00 plus kit fee of \$50.00 payable to the teacher. In Saturday's class, Simply Crazy, you will use cotton fabrics, fused raw edge, and hand stitched decorative stitches to embellish. Class is \$25.00 plus kit fee of \$20.00 payable to the teacher. Wild West: 21st-Century Quilts Salute the American Frontier


ONLINE ENTRIES FROM SEPTEMBER 1, 2016 TO MARCH 1, 2017

1.17 Pieces of the Past, 81: The 1945 Boys Memory Quilts by Ellen Hernandez


In 1945 the UK agreed to take in 1000 Jewish orphans under age 18 from European war camps. The Central British Fund, known today as the World Jewish Relief, could only locate 732 orphaned child survivors. Eighty of the children were girls and the youngest was three years old.



They were Polish, Czechoslovakian, Hungarian, German, Romanian, and Austrian. A large majority did not know where they were born. They were sent to foster homes and hostels in Scotland, Ireland, and Southampton. The group was devoted to supporting each other and established clubs to stay in touch. They became known as 'The Boys.' With temporary visas, the children were required to learn English, a trade, and find jobs. Over the years some moved to the US, Canada, Australia, or Israel. They started a charitable organization called 'The '45 Aid

Society' to support each other's needs and fund specific causes, many to help children.

For their annual reunion in 2015, *The Boys'* children and grandchildren decided to make a memory quilt to honor their survivor. Most of the families were new to quilting. A volunteer made packets for them which included white cotton, instructions, and sample ideas. Weekly workshops were held to provide assistance, and volunteer artists, embroiderers, and designers helped. Techniques included sewing, painting, photography, writing, and gluing. The goal was to honor all 732 children as well as 32 other child survivors who had also escaped to England and befriended *The Boys*. The end result was not one quilt but four six-foot quilts made of 163 squares and 5 maps. These quilts have been exhibited in museums and synagogues throughout the UK, Europe, Israel, and the US.





Fifty-one survivors attended the 70th 2015 reunion. Ben Helfgott, chairman of the '45 Aid Society, commented: 'Our experience may have hardened us, made us more realistic about human nature, but it has also left us with a dream. A dream to live in a world of understanding, compassion, fraternity and love for our fellow man. We have brought up our children to share the same dream, to reject hatred and revenge, to reach out with tolerance, to

live with integrity and to give of oneself to the community.'
