### 6.17 Pieces of the Past, 86: Mary Perry Quilt by Ellen Hernandez



This satin, silk, and taffeta octagon quilt was almost overlooked on a library wall in the tiny town of Alto, Texas for several years. It wasn't until Deborah Burkett noticed the guilt that renewed interest into its origins began. Alto librarians found a file with the name of the family that donated the quilt, the Deckers. Burkett contacted nearby resident Mary Decker and learned that Mary E.

Perry, her great grandmother, had made the quilt at age 15 during the Civil War. The quilt is made of very fine fabrics, expensive for the time, and has beautifully embroidered central motifs including flags, flowers, leaves, acorns, and an anchor. Born in 1845, Perry grew



up on a wealthy plantation in west Louisiana. She lived through many tragedies. Her first husband was murdered after only two years of marriage. She married again, to a state senator, who died in his forties. They had six children but only 2 survived into adulthood. Mary moved to Alto where her sons began a prosperous lumber company. The Decker family has now donated the quilt to the Winedale Collection at the University of Texas Briscoe Center where it is undergoing restoration and

preservation.

Author and retired educator, Dr. Deborah Burkett, is chairman of the Cherokee County Historical Commission. She often visits East Texas towns to record oral histories from senior residents. Her most



recent books are 'Ouilts and Their Stories: Binding Generations Together' and 'East Texas Piney



Woods Spunky Women - 1830s to 1950s.' Mary Perry's quilt is not the first mystery quilt Burkett has investigated. While researching the 1942 Rusk, TX girls'

basketball team she viewed a 1935 signature quilt on display at a quilt show in Troup, TX. It had

been rescued from an antique store some years earlier in Tyler, TX. The names were immediately familiar to her, specifically one adult: '1927-1935 Corine School, Mrs. G. H. Thomas'. Mr. G. H. Thomas had been the coach of the Rusk, TX girls' basketball coach. Burkett determined that the quilt, signed by many students, was a gift to Mrs. Thomas, also a teacher, about the time she left teaching in Corine to live in Rusk.

Please finish quilts prior to turning them into Bright Hopes. We hope this does not cause you any problem.




