and great-grandmother. Several years ago she was requested to restore an 1860 Tumbling Block quilt top made by Susan Dunn Powell of Kentucky. It had been wrapped in tissue paper and stored in a family owned desk for many years. The 70-inch

square top was made of silks, brocades, and taffetas. It was English paper pieced with silk thread. More than 80 blocks had deteriorated and needed to be replaced. Marcotte discovered





that the stabilizing papers were old letters, bank statements, and envelopes with postage.

Searching for replacement fabrics from the same era, she found a quilt from Missouri in an antique shop in the Adirondacks. It, too, was a Tumbling Block quilt. As she started taking this quilt apart she noticed the stabilizing papers were also letters, with the same color ink, the same handwriting, and similar stories as the Dunn Powell top. There were matching fabrics, thread, and stitching. Marcotte eventually concluded that the Dunn Powell quilt and the newly acquired quilt must



have been made by the same person. The restored quilt is now displayed in the home of Powell's great-grandson, William Chamberlin.





The optical illusion of tumbling block is an old pattern found even in Greek and Roman tiles. In geometry, this tessellation is called rhombille tiling. As a quilt, this pattern has been popular since the mid-1800s and was also called Baby Blocks, Stairsteps, and Boxes. The

illusion is enhanced by using a light, a medium, and a dark fabric for each trio of diamonds. Y-seam joining meant these quilts were suitable only for experienced guilters. As a hand-pieced project, blocks could be made by groups and joined together later. This fire screen from the Victoria and Albert Museum is from 1865.



Karel Donley invited applications for the Ethel Howey Grant. Forms and information are available on the guild's website.

**Treasurer** – Cindy Shutt reported a total of \$79,230.54 guild funds.

 $1^{st}$  VP for Special Events – Elaine Staller reported that the 2018 Auction Chair, Jean Hardies, had kits available for volunteers to finish. Sign up for the Houston bus trip will begin in August.

Carol Bryant explained that Quilt Show Committee members will be wearing red bandanas and "Ask Me" labels attached to their name badges. Volunteers working at the Show are asked to wear white shirts and dark trousers.

Holly Nelson explained the gallery card requirement for quilts hanging at the Show. Thirty words or less should tell why the quilt was made. Registration for Winter retreat in January 2018 will begin in July and cost \$290.

2<sup>nd</sup> VP for Information – Ina Ramirez asked members to tell her if they want a printed copy of the newsletter mailed to them. On a personal note, Ina thanked Barbara Sumlin and Glenda Harris for teaching the beginners class at the May workday. 3<sup>rd</sup> VP for Programs – Janet Miller was absent so Mary reminded members of the Paint Chip Challenge July deadline. She also mentioned the August program would be presented by longtime guild member, Ruth Felty.

**4**<sup>th</sup> **VP for Services** - Letty Zavala drew Judy Abbey's name for the Golden Carrot prize.

Librarian Janet Craig reminded members the fine for overdue books is \$1 a month and encouraged renewing by email to avoid paying anything. **5<sup>th</sup> VP for Community Outreach** – Pat Alva and her committees had nothing to report at this meeting.

There were 128 members, 3 guests. The guild welcomed two new members – Oralia Aves and Janice Lamb.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30.

**Ethel Howey Grant Applications** In case you don't know about this wonderful

opportunity, please read this now! Our wonderful quilt guild has money set aside in honor of past member Ethel Howey for one or more of US to receive \$1,000 every year to learn more about the art of quilting. Just think, you could finally afford to take that class at Quilting Adventures or the International Quilt Festival. Or attend classes with a teacher(s) that you've always wanted to learn from.

Okay, okay, there are a few conditions that you need to meet to take advantage of this opportunity. First, you will need to submit an application telling us what you want to do and why.

1. Why you would like to receive this grant

2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget

3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership

This application is due on August 1, 2017.

Then the recipient of the grant will get a chance to share wonderful new skills with the guild sometime during the next year. This does not need to be too intimidating. If you are outgoing and would like to present a lecture to the guild, this is one option. Or, you could share your new skills in a workshop after one of the meetings. Other options could be the making of a YouTube movie or booklet for members to view. Or maybe you have another idea for sharing.

One note, it is not right to take a teacher's livelihood and teach her method verbatim. She may depend on these classes for her income. Please put your own spin on the techniques that you have learned and make it your own.


