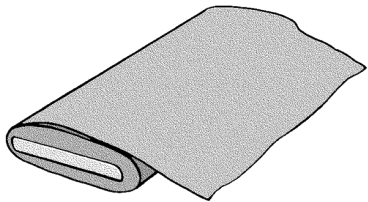

Beth has been quilting for 20 yrs. and featured in Quilter's World, The Quilter, Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks and other publications. Member of the 2014 Quiltmaker's "Scrap Squad". Her philosophy is "Inspired designs, relaxed attitude". Go to YouTube, https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCNMXqB-9LKZ6_N1hyEmnlg and watch a 3 part video by Beth on making accordion sewn scrappy half square triangles.

Because teachers are not allowed to sell during class or at Guild meeting Beth has made arrangements to bring items you pre-order. Go to her web site, www.evapaigequilts.com, place your order and at check out use the code, **FREESHIPSAT**.

Friday workshop: Syncopated Ribbons. You'll need your sewing machine, an overflowing scrap bin, outside the box thinking and chocolate. Cost: \$35. plus \$8.00 pattern fee total \$43.00.

Saturday workshop: Now You Give It A Scrap Slap. You'll bring 81-3 in. squares, in class all the squares will be dumped in a pile and each student will pull squares for their block. All students will work the same block but in different value, colors, contrast, and placement. Will need a sewing machine. Cost: \$25.00.

April. Leslie Tucker Jenison, San Antonio, will be our teacher and lecturer. She is a designer for RJR fabrics. Has been quilting since the early 80's. Leslie is a published and award winning modern quilter. Friday workshop: Move Over, Mondrian. The class modernizes the idea of a log cabin quilt. Cost: \$35.00. Saturday Workshop: Intro to Improv. Improvisational piecing using three shades of gray. Cost \$25.00.

May. Guild Work Day and Guild Birthday celebration. Lunch will be provided. Committees will have sign-up sheets at the March and April meetings.

For hundreds of years the Han Chinese have been making baijia pao or 'one hundred families robes' as a tradition for their sons' special birth celebrations. With a high mortality rate, children were not even named until their 100th day. The robe was believed to provide protection from evil spirits and ensure good health. Donated pieces of fabric from about one hundred friends and family members reflected the community support given to the child. Most patches were silk. Shapes included squares, triangles, hexagons, and diamonds. Embroidery might have been added such as zodiac and Buddhist symbols. Several historic baijia pao examples are owned by museums.

American parents adopting children from China started a tradition of making a similar item called baijia bei or the 'One Hundred Good Wishes Quilt' (OHGWQ.) Fabric pieces along with a good wish, poem, or letter are sent to the family who make the quilt and keep the written items in a scrapbook for the child. There is no history of a OHGWQ in China, but the spirit of the project helps adoptive families feel more connected to the Chinese culture.

The Quilts of China Project was a cooperative effort of the American Folklore Society and the Chinese Folklore Society to document Chinese piecing and

quilt traditions. An exhibit of items was held in 2015 at the Michigan State University Museum and many can be viewed online at www.quiltindex.org, China Collection.



Why Take the “Now YOU Give it a Scrap Slap” or “Syncopated Ribbons” workshop with Beth Helfter?
And wait...Who the Heck is Beth Helfter?

To answer the second question first – that’s me right there. I’m a quilt designer and instructor from Massachusetts who’s been quilting for twenty years and has been building a business since 2005, when I had twin two year olds and a need to create to stay sane. Eleven years later I have twin teenage daughters, another daughter solidly in the preteen fun, and the need to create has been joined by the need to get out of the house now and then and be with quilters, inspiring, motivating, learning, and sharing my designs and seeing theirs as well!



My work has been featured in Quilters World, The Quilter, Quiltmaker’s 100 Blocks, Quilts From Quiltmakers 100 Blocks, and I was a member of the 2014 Quiltmaker “Scrap Squad.” My style tends toward the scrappy and my designs mirror my company tagline: “Inspired Designs, Relaxed Attitude.” Quilting is supposed to be fun, and with every pattern I strive to keep you as far away from your seam ripper as possible, with every lecture I work to keep quilting light, fun, and motivating, and with every workshop I try to create a relaxed atmosphere of learning with a pattern or technique that doesn’t aim for perfection.

Lecturing and teaching is my very favorite part of this career and I’m thrilled to share EPQD with San Antonio Quilt Guild this winter!

But really, why take the Now YOU Give it a Scrap Slap workshop?



How many times do you as a quilter see a pattern and know exactly how to change up the color and fabrics to make it sing YOUR song? Or are you more apt to stay safe and recreate the quilt just as you see it? As a member of Quiltmaker’s “Scrap Squad,” I loved being able to turn featured designs shown in the magazine from quilts from one fabric line into scrappy wonders and upping the wow factors simply with a little recolorization and addition of scraps to the basic blocks. Using creativity, tone, value, and color are all things we as quilters love to do, but sometimes it’s hard to know where to start, and we end up making the blocks just like we saw them to make it easy.

In this workshop, we work to break out of the “line fabric” look to discover how recoloring

not only gives blocks a pop, but depending on value placement can change the entire look and feel of a block. It’s a quick class and a romp through other people’s fabric, too! You’ll never look at a block the same way again!

And why take the Syncopated Ribbons Workshop?

Do you have an overflowing scrap bin or two? Do you like hanging out with your fellow quilters for a day rather than cleaning your house? Do you love a project you just can’t screw up, no matter how hard you might try to? Do you like to let loose and just have fun without worrying if you are doing it right?

If you answered yes to even half of one of these questions, I promise the day will be worth it. Syncopated Ribbons is a workshop where we see our scraps go from strips and squares to funky, beautiful, crazy-quilt-esque works of art while we clean out a scrap bucket or two and have a ball! Scrap trading with other members of the class encouraged, mini lessons will be taught along the way involving trimming tips and foundation piecing, and while no two blocks will ever look alike, I’ve never seen a quilt made from this pattern that wasn’t gorgeous!

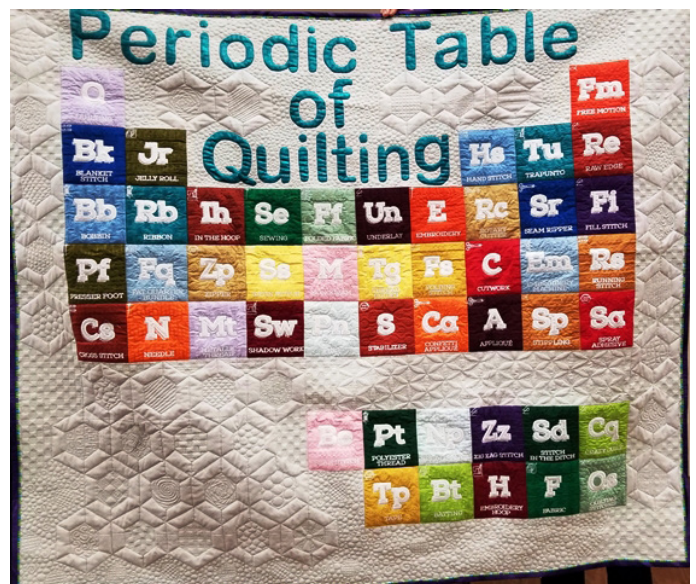

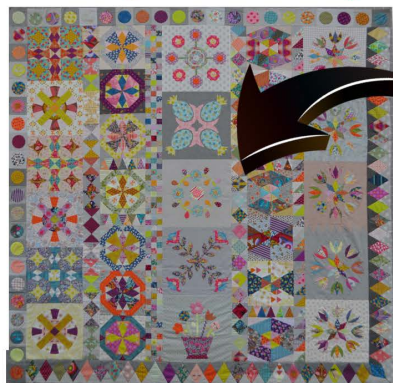
