8.19 Pieces of the Past, 112: The Women's Quilt by Ellen Hernandez



Roxanne Ellis, Labour and Cooperative Councillor for the Gedling Borough in England started what she calls "the most beautiful project should not exist." Becoming aware of the large number of women killed from domestic violence and essentially forgotten, Ellis started *The Women's Quilt Project* to raise awareness not only of the deaths, but of the lives of the victims. A quilt square was made for each of the women who died in England and Wales from 2009 to 2015, approximately two women a week, for a total of 598 squares. The blocks vary in design with the use of

pens, paint, applique, and embroidery.



Over 1500 men and women from around the world helped with the quilt, finishing in about three months. They researched the women which proved to be difficult as most written articles only discussed the

men and m around elped with hishing in elements. The ched the lich proved allt as most cles only he use was an

perpetrators. For many who worked on a quilt, domestic abuse was an

issue close to home. A young mother, *Andrea*, had seen her mother abused by her father and always felt guilty that she could not intervene as a child. With her own daughter, they each created a block and Andrea was able to discuss her experiences as they worked. *Laura* remembered a teacher who had been a support while at college, Julie Ann Semper. Creating the quilt brought together a sisterhood community, all proud to be a part of celebrating women.

On March 8th, 2017 the quilt was displayed in Parliament on *International Women's Day*. For this project, Ellis was acknowledged by Amnesty International as a Suffragette Spirit winner.



The 100" x 100" quilt was taken on tour to help raise funds for domestic violence. In August 2019 the quilt will be featured at *The Festival of Quilts* in Birmingham, Europe's leading patchwork and quilting event attracting over 25,000 people. It is hoped that the quilt will eventually reside at the Victoria and Albert Museum.

Ellis became interested in quilting when she and her mother visited a quilt show years ago. Besides quilting she likes to sew and knit. When elected in 2011 she was only 23. She is now serving her third term.

Opening on June 13, the retrospective with 15 quilts of this artist's unique work is sure to delight the eye with its colorful and detailed images that bring to mind the wonders of the optical instrument.

Nadelstern will also make an appearance at the Museum and give a free lecture about her work and the exhibit on Saturday, June 29, at 3 pm. Museum admission is free beginning at 2 pm.

"As Paula has said, the word 'kaleidoscope' promises surprise and magic, change and chance. Paula Nadelstern's amazing quilts sparkle with these elements," says Museum

On her website, Nadelstern expounds on her work. "Exploding with visual excitement, a kaleidoscopic design organizes an abundance of light and color, form and motion into a complex and coherent image," she writes.

"My goal is to harmoniously integrate the idea of a kaleidoscope with the techniques and materials of quiltmaking. I try to free myself from a conventional sense of fabric orderliness, seeking a random quality in order to imitate the succession of chance interlinkings and endless possibilities synonymous with kaleidoscopes."

Also on display this summer is an exhibit that features contemporary interpretations of some of quilting's most traditional patterns, blocks, styles, and techniques. Opening on June 27, "In the American Tradition" features 31 works of breadth and diversity.

"Our exhibition includes works in traditional style, some with an original twist, such as a charming hankie appliqué quilted with hearts, an autumnthemed quilt with pumpkins on the bordering vine, a basket design with different flowers in each basket, and a Double Wedding Ring in brilliant neon hues," Dr. Sider says.

"Several showstoppers feature spectacular hand quilting, the technique dominating this exhibition. It also has an appealing pictorial quilt depicting four 18th-century women stitching the original

American flag, along with a graphically modern Yo-Yo quilt."


