9.19 Pieces of the Past, 113: Quilts for Empowerment by Ellen Hernandez



Registered nurse Mary Ann McCammon began teaching quilting to a specific group of women in Kenya, Africa in 2015. Through her 'Quilts for Empowerment' (QFE) program, women struggling with the physical and emotional issues of obstetric fistulas caused by prolonged, complicated childbirth (or sexual assault) have been helped to obtain surgical repair while gaining self-confidence as sewers to become economically independent.

McCammon began quilting in the 1980s making traditional hand pieced and hand quilted bed quilts. As a professor of nursing in Oregon, her interest and research program focused on improving the health of marginalized women, including those who were incarcerated. Upon learning about the struggling women in Kenya who often have no medical care during delivery, McCammon did what she could to support them – made quilts. She donated her quilts to the San Jose *Fistula Foundation* to raise funds. They, in turn, sent her to Kenya to teach quilting. At the Gynocare Fistula Center in Eldoret, Kenya McCammon discovered that none of the women had ever hand sewn or drawn a picture. Her class of three rose to twelve as she shared her quilting notions and embroidery floss. The women started learning simple embroidery and made



small landscape quilts drawing upon the images of their community. Eventually, after several annual visits by McCammon, the women were able to make placemats, table runners, tote bags, and small folk-art story quilts, all with African fabrics. They now have two treadle sewing machines. McCammon has been buying the women's crafts at a flat rate and selling them in the US with all proceeds going back into the non-profit organization. With the monies earned, the Kenyan women have a steady income to pay for children's school fees, food, and housing upkeep.

As the QFE has grown, the women who are often abandoned and shunned by family and community now benefit from more assistance in the form of counseling, health and financial guidance, scholarships to complete their education, and other vocational training. Back in the US, there are speaking engagements and fundraisers to build interest in supporting the Kenyan women, as well as an annual benefit in Oregon. This year on November 2 many art quilted items will be offered for sale at the wine country barn event in Newberg, OR. A new video highlighting the women will be premiered along with an art quilt exhibit which will then tour the country. In July 2018 and 2019 McCammon sold QFE products at the Sisters, OR Outdoor Quilt Show.

A PBS news story about treating fistulas in Kenya, "Erasing the Pain and Taboo of This Female Injury" can be seen at www.pbs.org. It is estimated that over 1 million women in underdeveloped countries suffer from obstetric fistula which is a preventable and treatable condition.

Boutique news....

The show is just around the corner! I am accepting items to be sold in the boutique at every meeting up to the show. For newer members, the Guild has a boutique at the show where your items can be sold. Items must be sewing or quilting related and must be handmade. The guild will collect a 20% commission off the sales price. The sales price placed on the item must include this 20% as well as about 8% for retail sales tax. Keep your prices in increments of .25¢ so I don't have to have so much change on hand. One-dollar increments are even better!!!

I will be setting up the boutique the Wednesday and Thursday before the show and can accept items at the event center. I can also accept your items during the show, as time allows, but whichever way you get your items to me, an inventory sheet must be filled out and every item must be on the sheet. Every item must be tagged with the sales price and your unique inventory code.

I have inventory sheets you can fill out, or you can turn in your own. If you do your own, it must include your contact info (name, address, email, phone number), a unique inventory control number, and the item number, description and price of each item. By submitting either form, (1) you are agreeing to work one 2-hour session in the boutique, and (2) myself, the guild, or the event center cannot be held liable for any loss or damage to your items. Your items must be self-insured. Your unique inventory code can be your initials, a series of 3-4 numbers or a combination of both. That is how we will identify you when an item is sold to be sure you get paid! Doing your own spreadsheet and creating your tags with mail merge is the way to go!!!

I will accept one or one hundred items; completed or assembled in a bag as a kit; bundles of fabric as a theme or a grouping. You can even put in fat quarters, but remember, every item you want in the boutique must be on an inventory sheet and must be tagged. I will have inventory forms at any meeting or email me to send you an excel spreadsheet. The tags can be of any form or fashion. Each tag must have your unique inventory code, name of the item, item number and the sales price. If you have room on the tag, put your name on it, just as an extra way to give you credit! Remember, the sales price will have about 28% taken out.

Books or magazines will not be accepted. We cannot take any items that are not tagged. Every item must have been hand made. It is the only way we can control the inventory and give you credit when something is sold. You are responsible for picking up any unsold items at the end of the show. We have been trying to establish this event as a unique, handmade, boutique shop, and NOT a yard/garage/rummage sale event.

Jelly Roll Race

- 1. There will be two groups of jellyroll racers, First Timer and Done It Before. There will be a winner in each category. Participant may have a helper to keep strip straight, finger press seams but not hand them strips aligned and ready to sew.
- 2. If participants provide their own jellyroll, 40 strip, 2 1/2" x WOF they keep their finished top. If Bright Hopes and Community Quilt Angels provide the jellyrolls, the top is donated to that committee. Please notify Linda Nash, Bright Hopes or Barbara Sumlin, Community Quilt Angels, if you are going to use one of their jellyrolls.
- 3. The race will begin ½ hr. after the completion of all Guild business. During the ½ hour participants will set up their sewing machine and if they wish the selvages may be cut off during this time. Guild power strips and extension cords will be available.
- 4. The strips can be sewn end to end or on the diagonal. Trim diagonal seams and finger press. The strip will measure more than 1600 in. Cut 18 in. off one end and discard. Bring both ends right sides of fabric together and sew the strips together lengthwise. Cut the strip apart at the end, should have about 800 in. Repeat five times, should have a top 50 in. x 80 in. First Timer will take about 50 minutes to complete top.

Bring your clean sewing machine, several full bobbins, full spool of thread, new needle, scissors, tape measure and be ready to start sewing. Helpful to watch the Missouri Star Quilt tutorial, Jelly Roll Race, on YouTube.


