She has 5 committee members working with her on the auction. The auction will be held at the Leon Valley Conference Center.
2. Minutes approved.

Layers of Fun

In September we introduced a new block, Layers of Fun. This block goes together easily. This pieced block complements an alternative block to make an awesome quilt. Stop by the QPC table to see both blocks. And check out a block or two.

Have you been thinking about learning a new technique? The Holiday Stars block offers an opportunity to match points with using a folding technique to add dimension to the block. Very interesting block. Have fun with it!

Goal at QPC is to offer you something new to try or sharpen some skills. The blocks become Auction quilts to support the GSAQG.

Remember to turn in your QPC blocks! We appreciate you!!!

Jelly Roll Race

1. There will be two groups of jellyroll racers, First Timer and Done It Before. There will be a winner in each category. Participant may have a helper to keep strip straight, finger press seams but not hand them strips aligned and ready to sew.
2. If participants provide their own jellyroll, 40 strip, 2 1/2" x WOF they keep their finished top. If Bright Hopes and Community Quilt Angels provide the jellyrolls, the top is donated to that committee. Please notify Linda Nash, Bright Hopes or Barbara Sumlin, Community Quilt Angels, if you are going to use one of their jellyrolls.
3. The race will begin ½ hr. after the completion of all Guild business. During the ½ hour participants will set up their sewing machine and if they wish the selvages may be cut off during this time. Guild power strips and extension cords will be available.
4. The strips can be sewn end to end or on the diagonal. Trim diagonal seams and finger press. The strip will measure more than 1600 in. Cut 18 in. off one end and discard. Bring both ends right sides of fabric together and sew the strips together lengthwise. Cut the strip apart at the end, should have about 800 in. Repeat five times, should have a top 50 in. x 80 in. First Timer will take about 50 minutes to complete top. Bring your clean sewing machine, several full bobbins, full spool of thread, new needle, scissors, tape measure and be ready to start sewing. 10.19 Pieces of the Past, 114: **How to Make an American Quilt**, by Ellen Hernandez

Twenty-four years ago, Whitney Otto's New York Times bestselling novel, *How to Make an American Quilt*, was made into a Steven Spielberg movie. Otto was not a quilter. She wrote the 1991 story as her master's degree thesis about the lives of women in a small town and the quilting environment seemed to be a good fit. Starring in the movie were Anne Bancroft, Ellen Burstyn, Alfre Woodward, Winona Ryder, Maya Angelou, and Jean Simmons.

The movie art department was staffed by five men who did not sew. Their attempts to make quilt designs was not successful. Patty McCormick, president of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds at the time, was called on to create five quilts for the movie within three months. McCormick's main focus was the prominent quilt in the story, a king size sampler appliqued bridal quilt named "Where Love Resides." It included 760 leaves in the border. Two features in the quilt were impractical to McCormick, a velvet mermaid tail and gold lame wedding rings, but the producer was insistent. Seven women made two complete copies of the bridal quilt, one left as a top and one hand quilted in only eight days in a two-inch cross-hatch pattern. The other quilts were made by fourteen quilters. Some of the quilt blocks were duplicated and left in various states of completion to be used by the actors throughout the movie. McCormick



had to introduce sewing and quilting to several of the actors, even to the point of how to use a thimble. Close ups of quilting hands were of McCormick and her other "Stunt Quilters." Some days they were on set the whole day trying to perfect one short movie scene. A book about the quilts and the movie was released in 1996 by McCormick, *Pieces of An American Quilt*. At the end of the movie Winona Ryder runs through the muddy orange grove to meet her fiancé, draped in the quilt. After production, the soiled quilt was given to the screen writer, Jane Anderson and called "Winonadirt."



Years later the owner of the Redlands, CA home used in the movie, David Salvaggio, commissioned the same quilters of 1995 to make a replica of the *Where Love Resides* quilt. The quilt has been featured in several quilt shows.

Another quilt featured in the movie was to be an heirloom slavery quilt. McCormick read about an African American artist in Maryland, Barbara Brown, and had her design the quilt blocks. One surprising feature was the use of red fabric for the Red Sea, a literal interpretation.

A crazy quilt with black velvet, silk, beads, and elaborate embroidery was made by artist Christine Dabbs to be used for the baby in the movie. Two tops had to be made, one washed to look old. Dabbs so enjoyed making the quilt that she completed seven, the extras for herself, her two daughters, McCormick, and one for an exhibition. The studio aged the quilt by cutting holes in it, shredding, tearing, and painting it brown, and it is barely noticeable in the movie.



Jan Barbieri created the quilt featured in the opening of the film, "Grasse Quilting Bee." The camera panned from the actual quilt to an aerial view of the farm and the quilt's orange groves were hand painted and tweaked in shades of green to match. That one shot took ten hours to perfect.

3. Fall mini retreat Co-organizer Janet Miller, asked if attendees have a sew rite table please bring it to the retreat in October and let Janice Frankenberger know.
4. 2019 Quilt Show – Organizer Janet Miller
 - a. Tuesday, September 17, drop off quilts at the event center. Quilt requirements: not in a bag, 4" sleeve attached, covered label. Entrant will receive a pink card to be used to claim quilt on Saturday, September 21, after the show.
 - b. If a quilt has been entered but will not be available for the show, advise the organizers so they can plan accordingly.
 - c. Volunteer quilt hangers are asked to bring a 3-step ladder on Tuesday. Be sure the ladder has your name on it.
 - d. Thursday, September 19, all members are invited to the Quilt Show reception held at the event center at 6:00 p.m. To enter, use a smaller door that is located to the right of the main entrance of the building. Non-perishable donations can be delivered as early as Tuesday, 9/17. Perishable items should be brought to the event center by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, 9/19. The award ceremony will be held at 6:45-7:30. Quilt viewing will be after the awards.
 - e. Free parking available to all, Tuesday thru Thursday. Friday and Saturday volunteers must have the "volunteer" sign on the dashboard of the car to receive free parking.
 - f. Volunteers are asked to wear dark pants and a white top. Volunteers are also asked to give their complete attention to the Show visitors with help and directions.
 - g. Beverages located in the hospitality room are available for volunteers.
 - h. Demonstration booth organizer - Sandra Lowell asks for volunteers who would like to present a "How To" demo for visitors. Please see her if interested.
 - i. Boutique organizer - Jeannette Jay will accept items on Wednesday -Friday. Each item must be inventoried and price tagged. Reminder that 28% of sales price is deducted for guild and tax expenses. Unsold items must be redeemed on Saturday.

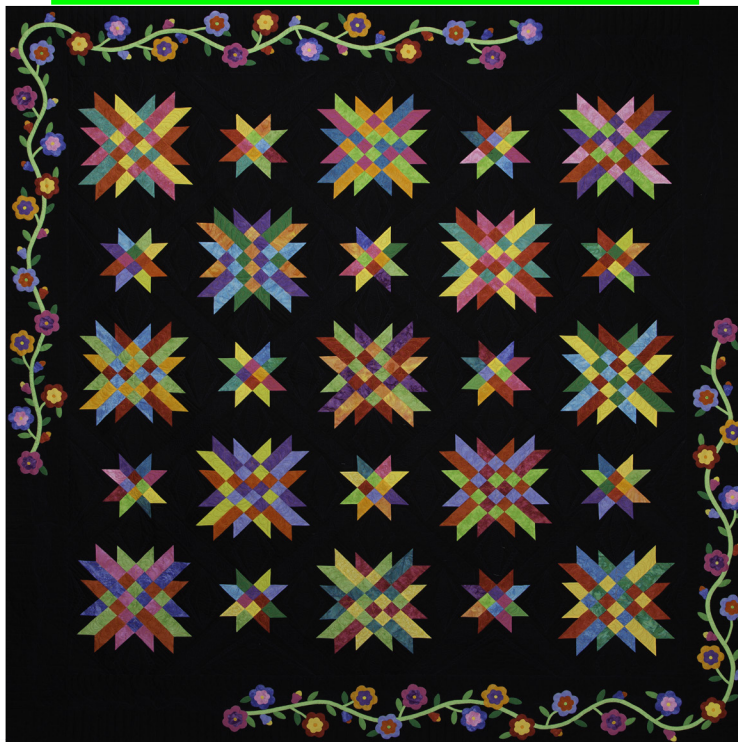
Parliamentarian – Sylvia Jolet

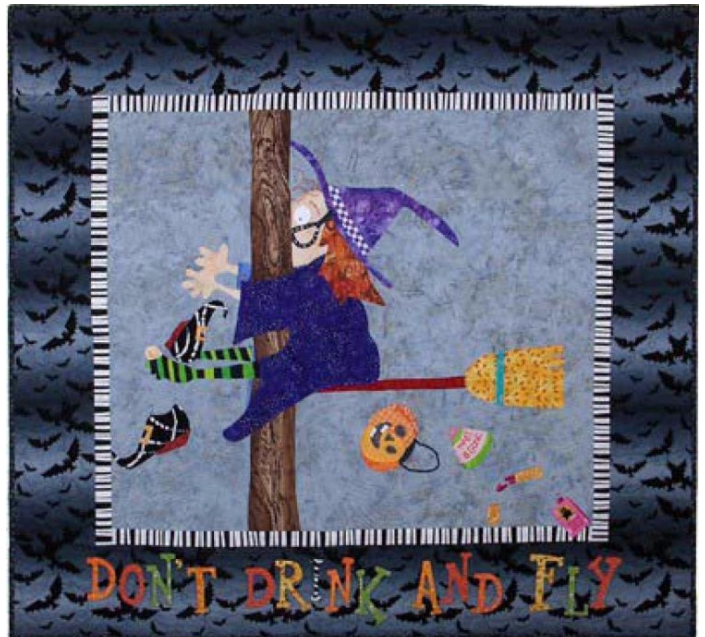

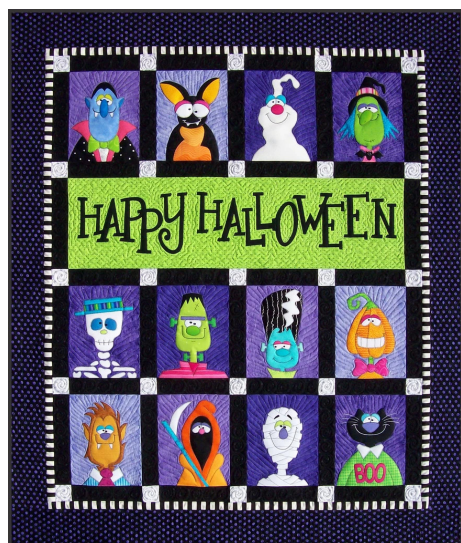
