ALMA'S BOOK REVIEW CORNER

The Thimbleberries Book of Quilts, by Lynette Jensen

Some of our members have shown warm and homey quilts at Bring & Brag and gave credit for their ideas as coming from one of the Thimbleberries books. These quilts always have a "look" that is easily recognized and would be welcome in any home décor. Lynette Jensen has a pattern company and a line of fabrics for RJR Fashion Fabrics by the name of 'Thimbleberries'. She named her company after a native American wild raspberry that grows in the Great Lakes area and southwest to New Mexico. Its tiny red fruit is shaped like a thimble. To Lynette, the word represents the "fruit of the thimble" or "fruits of the labor of the thimble", so she named her company appropriately.

The first several pages of the book are filled with photographs of "Quilts All Through The House" to suggest many options for using quilts in home decorations other than bed covers. Every bookcase, coat rack, chair, basket, etc. is fair game to be used as a stage for your quilt show. I fear that I would create visual chaos if I attempted to do the same in my house, but she pulls it off quite well. For those of us who are decoratingchallenged, one or two of those ideas will She offers plenty of options to suffice. choose from.

Directions to make each of these quilts are provided. They are all traditional in design and color. As Lynette says, "The quilts in this book are not difficult. Some are projects that can be done quickly, and others require more of a commitment." I like that phrase! "Of course, I could make that quilt, dearie. It's just that it would require more of a commitment than I'm prepared to make just now..." Oh, YES! File that one away!

Back to the book. Of all the tips, directions, helpful hints, and instructions, I like the 'Quilting Ideas" best. Instead of the tired instruction to "quilt as desired" as so many books tell us, she actually describes all of the quilting patterns she used for the project. The projects tend to have different quilting designs that work well together. Nothing too exotic or difficult, but the combinations of quilting in the ditch, quarter inch quilting, cross-hatching, and occasional stenciled designs provide a custom look to each project.




