Virginia Walton

July Workshop

Virginia Walton is the inventor of the "Creative Curves" templates and the author of several books using her techniques. She will present two workshops in July, one using Creative Curves and one on color.

On Friday at 9:30 am there will be an all day workshop on LOG CABIN "STARS" at the Operations Center. Cost is \$35 and the class will use the Creatives Curves Ruler set. If you do not have the set, she will have them available for purchase. As you can see, hopefully, in the picture this project combines a traditional Log Cabin Block with Curved Stars to produce a truly unique look. This is a scrap quilt and has an amazing number of variations. It requires a selection of fabric, a sewing machine, and basic sewing supplies. A supply list will be available to all who sign up.

Following the guild meeting on Saturday she will offer a Mini-Color Workshop. We have reduced the price for this workshop to \$15. In addition Virginia will have a Fabric Kit at \$18. There is NO sewing involved in this workshop. You will use fabric samples to explore how the dapth of color influences the overall look and impact of a quilt. Over 100 fabrics will be used along with approximately 30 quilt examples to illustrate the different principles being explored. You will experiment to see how choice of color effects the overall design of a quilt and how it effects specific block patterns.

We will accept sign-up by phone, mail, or e-mail up to 6pm Thursday evening for the Friday workshop and at the meeting on Saturday for the Saturday

Virginia's lecture at our meeting will be "Evolution of a Quilt, From Idea to Design." This lecture shows examples of how to combine fabrics to create a variety of quilts. From tradition to modern including Amish,

country, applique, samples, scrap, animal and a variety of other quilt styles.



Ami Simms November Workshop String Quilting

Ami Simms will be with us for two workshops and a lecture in November. Now is the time to plan to attend one or all of these events. We will take signup beginning at the July meeting.

On Friday, November 10 at 9:30 am Ami will teach an all day workshop on "String Quilting." The cost is \$35. Experiment witha technique quilters used years aago to make good use of every scrap they had on hand. Working with traditional block patterns your quilt top will blend patches made from "stringed" fabric (narrow strips of fabric sewn together to make "new" fabric) with solid patches of either muslin or black. Ami asks you to bring a minimum of 25 fabrics and a maximum of 10 pounds! Full details in the hand outs.

Saturday, after our meeting, there is a half day workshop on "Invisible Applique." Learn a new way to applique where the thread is nearly invisible. This workshop is devoted to hands-on practice with straight sides, convex and conaave curves, points and V-shapes.

The lecture at our meeting will be "Photo Quilting." Ami will explore one-of-a-kind quilts made with photographs and other images that have been transferred to fabric. Two styles are presented: scrapbook quilts which can accomodate any number of photo transfers and wuilts made with traditional blocks with one photo per block. Discussion include how to select photographs, copyright considerations, how to make transfers and construction hints.



#### **OPS CENTER COMMITTEE**

There will be a meeting on Thursday, 07-06-00, at 07:00 PM to discuss options for the Operations Center. There was a lot of discussion at the May meeting, but we could not resolve the issue or satisfy all the questions. This is everyone's chance to ask questions and offer ideas.

Since that meeting, a few things of interest have happened.

- The Central Park Mall option is still being pursued, but they have not given an answer either way.
- Thanks to Grace Richardson, I got in touch with a realtor that was very hopeful about space in a shopping center.
   Unfortunately, after our hopes were up, the owner declined his suggestion that we be allowed the space for "common area maintenance fees". (It would have been 1500 square feet for \$350!)
- 3. Jeanette Jay checked with the Zoning Commission about the property owned by Cathy Baisley's parents. It is zoned as R6, which is a residential zone appropriate for condominiums and townhouses, but not for public club activities. It would be a violation of the zoning laws to use that property, leaving the guild obligated to move out if a neighbor complained about signs, parking, or whatever.

There is no simple solution. I personally feel that the guild was a stronger organization with more participation in guild activities when we did not have an Operations Center. Indeed, our research showed that 42% of our members never visited the Ops Center in 1999 and another 15% only went there once. Although some members are using it, the majority of our membership is not getting benefit from it. I would like to see the guild close the Ops Center and sell the possessions that are providing us with storage problems.

However, some members are very vocal about how important they feel it is to keep the Ops Center open. 5% of our members visited the Ops Center 30 times or more in 1999. It is time that those persons who feel such a strong need to keep the Ops Center open should step forward and state how they can lead the guild to support the Ops Center.

I cannot provide leadership for maintaining the Ops Center when I strongly believe that it is not in the best interest of the guild to do so. I will chair the meeting on July 6th and will be available to answer questions at the July meeting, but will resign from the committee in July or sooner if possible.

Thanks to everyone who has participated. Your attendance at the July 6th meeting is welcome, as well as phone calls until then.




