



Board Members Present: Garnette Hanson, Rebecca Cook, Betty Opiela, Roberta Haby, Lois Beauchamp, Renee Bradley, Ida Tyson Blankenship and Sylvia Jolet.

President Betty Opeila called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM. Minutes were approved as printed. Treasurer Garnette Hanson gave the following report. The report is an estimate due to the fact that there was a delay in receiving the bank statements. Operating fund \$16,206.02/Reserve fund \$34, 671.09. During the past month money was transferred from the operating fund to the reserve fund: a sum of \$10,000.00. Garnette further reported that bank fees amounted to \$210.00 for August due to auction transactions.

**President's Report**: Betty Opiela reported on the quilt quilted by the Pin Droppers for the auction. There is a lady in New Jersey who wishes to purchase the quilt. Lois moved we sell the quilt to this lady, provided there is no objection from a Board member after viewing the quilt. Ida Tyson Blankenship seconded the motion. The motion passed. Betty will contact the lady in New Jersey and offer her the quilt for \$550.00 including shipping and insurance.

**Quilt Storage:** Betty reported that guild quilts are stored at Safesite, Inc. on Bandera Road. Twelve persons presently have access to the storage facility. Lois moved we update the list of names authorized to get into the storage facility where guild quilts are stored and they be limited to Board members presently serving. Garnette Hanson seconded. The Motion passed. Authorized names on the storage facility list are Betty Opiela, Ida Tyson Blankenship and Lois Beauchamp.

**Guild Telephone:** Betty reported that it has come to her attention that Tina Castillo, who has graciously allowed the guild phone to be located in her home, would now like to have the line disconnected from her residence. Betty will investigate new options for the guild telephone line. **Special Events:** Betty reported for Marilyn Bellows that Larry Beauchamp will chair the quilt show in 2003 and Dee Leclair will be co-chair. Larry has booked the Live Oak Civic Center for October 3, 4 and 5 for the 2003 quilt show (Only dates available) and also booked the third week and September for the 2005 quilt show. The theme for the 2003 show is "Deep in the Heart". Amy Cottrell has agreed to be in charge of the vendors for the 2003 show. Suggestions for the raffle quilt would be welcomed—send ideas to Larry Beauchamp.

Ida Tyson Blankenship has agreed to be co-chair for the 2002 style show.

**Services:** Rebecca Cook reported that Cathy Wallace has resigned as beekeeper. Elaine Staller will become the new beekeeper. Elaine is also in charge of Secret Sisters. However, she has agreed to complete the year with Secret Sisters. The Board will be looking for someone to take over the Secret Sisters program and the end of this year.

Rebecca reported the first quilt in was great fun. Fourteen members participated. Next quilt in will be September 18 from 12 noon till 3Pm at Cavendar Buick on I 10 W.

**Calico Rose:** Nominations were received for members to receive Calico Roses. Roses will be awarded in September, October and November.

**Nominating committee:** Sylvia Jolet, Betty Tope and Virginia Wright are seeking candidates for Vice-President of Special Events, Treasurer and President Pro-Tem. Please call one of the committee members if you are interested in serving or know of others who are willing to serve.

**New Business:** Rebecca Cook moved we establish an E group for the quilt guild. Lois seconded. The Motion passed. Rebecca will develop guidelines for the types of information to be shared on the guild E Group.





# QUILT PROJECT COMMITTEE - PM (OPC-PM)

Here is our Christmas block project:

Red, Green and White Log cabins. 14" finished block. Use 2 1/2" strips of red, green and white or white prints (prefer red and green to be all different). Want blocks of red and white; green and white; and red and green. For white blocks start with white square. For red and green blocks start with green square. Size hints: Pieces 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 should measure 6 1/2" unfinished; pieces 6, 7, 8 9 equal 10 1/2: 10, 11, 12, 13 are 14 1/2".


Autumn Leaves 6 1/2" blocks


The leaf should be an "autumn" color (gold, bronze, brown, gray, gray-green, olive green, rust, rusty red,—print or solid)

Background is light---tan, ecru, gold, (not white or muslin)

Stitching can be by hand or machine. Leaves can be fused. Thread can be visible or not. Your choice of method. If you have a leaf similar size that you'd prefer to do—great! Imagine what a wonderful little quilt this will make—or what a beautiful border for a large quilt.

Please pin a small paper with your name to each block—one entry for the drawing. (use labels or rubber stamp!!) Have fun! Let's have lots of blocks! With more, you have more chances to win!
