Lois Beauchamp moved the deadline for the 2001 directory by the February meeting and thereafter the January Meeting. Kris seconded. Motion passed.


Directory will also contain present set of by-laws and committee assignments and Board Members responsible for these committees.






4th - light green print or white

But, what about the projects for which I bought a pattern and special fabric, even though I haven't actually done anything on it yet? Is that a UFO?


