
2001 Quilt Show "Reach for the Stars"

Trina Horvath announced that the summer retreat is full and there is a waiting list. Retreat money must be paid in full by the May meeting.



Jan Mueller in charge of patterns announced there are now three disks available to be checked out for viewing at home.


#### **Community Outreach**

### Cover Them: A Quilt Installation

Holocaust Museum Houston will present a quilt exhibit from August through December entitled, *Cover Them.* The exhibit features 10 remarkable art quilts by Seattle artist Rachel Brumer. Brumer created the quilts in rememberance of children who perished in the Holocaust in France.

The Museum hopes to end the exhibition with a stack of "Children's Quilts" intended to provide the children of today with comfort and joy. Visitors will have the opportunity to pass on a quilt to a child in need or to teachers for use in the classroom.

Your Guild has agreed to be among the volunteers needed to produce these "Children's Quilts" to accompany the exhibition. Quilt size can range from  $35'' \times 50''$  (the smallest) to  $40'' \times 60''$  (the largest). They can be of simple designs and must be safe for small children. The design of the top can be anything that would make a child happy.

Larry Beauchamp encouraged participation in programs being sponsored by the guild. He announced that in September, Cynthia England would present a workshop on Landscape quilts.


#### **Services**

# A Salute to Friends of the Shelter: Greater San Antonio Quilters Guild

For more than 12 years, bright and beautiful handmade quilts have warmed the bodies and hearts of the many infants and children who have found shelter at the Children's Shelter. Every child, age newborn through six, is given a quilt to keep. The quilts bring them comfort while they are at the Shelter, and go with them when they leave. Like a beloved stuffed animal, the quilts offer visual and tactile assurance that they are safe, cocooned in their very own quilts.

It's an amazing love story. Members of the Greater San Antonio Quilters Guild lovingly sew, fill and quilt or hand-tie up to 40 quilts per month and donate them to the children. They do not meet the children or know their names. They don't even know their stories. They only know that these children – abandoned, hurt, alone, frightened – need the comfort that a handmade quilt can bring.

Kitty Janiga heads the children's quilt project called Bright Hopes, and pours her energy into seeing that the Guild makes its monthly goal. Calling herself a "fabric-aholic," she haunts the stores for on-sale fabrics, filling giant barrels with fabric and batting. Operating with a budget of only \$900 annually, plus donated goods, Janiga maximizes her buying potential to purchase supplies.

After shopping, she organizes a group of volunteers who put together kits that contain enough fabric for a quilt front, back, batting, label and crochet thread for tying. That's when she puts her marketing strategy into play, recruiting members of the Quilters Guild to turn the materials in the kits into quilts for the children.

"You have to refine your begging techniques," she laughs. For instance, when she finds out a member has invested in a new quilting machine, she encourages the quilter to take a stack of kits and "practice" before they take on a big, expensive

project. "If someone wants to practice hand-quilting, this is also a good place to do that — and the end product has a practical use," she says, using her best salesperson voice. Members check out the kits at the guild's monthly meeting and return the completed quilts at the next meeting.

On a recent visit to the Bright Futures Child Development Center at the Children's Shelter on South St. Mary's, Janiga and members of the Pin Droppers quilting bee were delighted to find the babies and toddlers curled up with their quilts for a warm winter nap. Their labor of love and skill and thoughtfulness makes a difference every day. And these big-hearted quilters must dream happy dreams, knowing that in homes throughout the city, hundreds of little ones curl up with their bright, beautiful quilts every night, assured that someone out there loves them.






## MAY BLOCK OF THE MONTH
