


#### SUNSHINE AND SHADOWS Valerie Arcement

#### PROPOSED BY-LAW REVISIONS

Pursuant to action by the GSAQG Board of Directors the following change to the Bylaws of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild, Inc. as adopted May 13, 2000 and Amended November 11, 2001 are presented to the membership for consideration. Discussion and voting on this proposed change will be during the August 11 Business Meeting.

Attachment to minutes of GSAQG Board Meeting of July 2, 2001 of the recommendation for by-laws amendment to include a meeting in June as a regular meeting and establish the 4th Saturday in June as the date for the annual quilt auction.

RECOMMENDED BY-LAW REVISION:

ARTICLE VI MEETINGS

Current:

Section 1. Business Meetings. The business meetings of the Guild, held to further the object of the Guild and act upon any business matters that may be brought before the membership, shall be held on the second Saturday of each month, **except June**, unless otherwise ordered by the Executive Board providing that all members are notified.

Change: Delete in third line ", except June,".

Current:

Section 3. June and December Meetings.

A. The June meeting shall be known as the annual auction.

- B. The December business meeting shall be limited to:
  - 1. the reading and approval of minutes;
  - 2. the Treasurer's report;
  - 3. the adoption of the following year's budget.

C. A social will follow the December business meeting.

Change: Delete "June and" from Section 3 title.

Delete "A. The June meeting shall be known as the annual auction."

Reletter the remaining "B & C" to "A & B".

The above proposal is the change to By-Laws which must be approved by the membership at the August meeting.

If this change is appproved the Board intends to establish the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday in June as the date for the annual quilt auction. This does not require a vote of the membership, but your Board anticipates hearing your opinions. If made, this change would be reflected in General Information:





# Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild, Inc. Board Minutes, June 4, 2001

Board Members present: Betty Opiela, Marilyn Bellows, Lois Beauchamp, Rebecca Cook, Renee Bradley, Garnette Hanson.

**Minutes** were approved with two corrections. Correction #1: Under Community Outreach it should read Ida Tyson Blankenship (not Blaketshiip). Correction #2: Under Program, it should state that Rebecca Cook and Marilyn Bellows acted as hostess for the workshops. Lucille Shean hosted Darlene Christopherson in her home as her overnight guest for the time that Darlene was in San Antonio.

**Treasurer's Report** was given by Garnette Hanson and was stated as follows: Operating Fund \$19,121.90/ Reserve Fund \$24,586.95 which givees a total of \$43,708.85.

**President Betty Opiela** reported that the date for the Auction was stated incorrectly in the Weekend Section of the San Antonio Express News. The date of the Auction was stated as June 3<sup>rd</sup> instead of June 30<sup>th</sup>. Renee Bradley also stated that she has already notified the newspaper of the error. On Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup> the San Antonio Express News should be running a piece on the auction for which Renee was interviewed

Betty requested that a calendar be put in the newsletter that gives all of the Guild activities stating dates and places for the upcoming months. Lois Beauchamp stated that she would pass that request on to Larry Beauchamp, who assists Lois in preparing the newsletter. Betty then stated that she would like to see a calendar that shows activities for the Guild and one that shows general quilt activities for the surrounding areas and even statewide quilt events. Betty then gave Lois some dates for activities outside of the Guild to pass on to Larry.

Betty requested that the application for submitting a quilt to the Quilt Show be put into the next newsletter. Lois stated that she would pass this information on to Larry. The application will be printed on the front with nothing on the back so that way the Guild members do not have to tear up their newsletter in order to use the application.

**Special Events:** Marilyn Bellows had a copy of the letter that Amy Cottrell had been mailing out to vendors who would possibly be interested in marketing their products at the Quilt Show. Marilyn stated that Amy was looking for a vendor of rubber stamps to participate in the Quilt Show. It was suggested that Marilyn call Valarie Arcement to see if Valarie knows of anyone who sells rubber stamps.

**Newsletter:** Lois Beauchamp stated that the newsletter has received no information on Folk Life for this year. It was suggested that Lois contact Lucille Shean who is in charge of this event to remind Lucille to give the information to the newsletter. Betty mentioned that this event is under the Community Outreach Vice President and that additional information might be available from Ida Tyson Blankenship.

**Services:** Rebecca Cook stated that Cathy Wallace, the Bee Keeper for the Guild, had requests to start a beginner's bee. Rebecca stated that Cathy was looking for a leader for this bee. There was some discussion on this bee basically taking the place of a quilt class. It was suggested that our members be encouraged to take a Quilt class at one of the area fabric stores, rather than depending on the beginner's bee to provide quilt instruction. Lois Beauchamp had hosted a beginner's bee in the past and it was unsuccessful attendance wise. Rebecca will ask for a volunteer to lead this beginner's bee at the next Guild meeting. If someone volunteers, Cathy Wallace will set up the bee.

Rebecca also asked the Board members their opinion on starting up Quilt-In again. Rebecca stated that the Guild could have Quilt-In at the Cavendar Buick Community Room. There was a general agreement that this would be a good thing to try to get started again. After some discussion it was decided that the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the Month from 12 noon till 3pm would be a good time for the Quilt-In.Rebecca will reserve the space at Cavendar Buick. Rebecca then asked the Board to help define the purpose and objective of Quilt-In. Lois Beauchamp volunteered to work with Rebecca on this issue. The first Quilt-In will be on August 21, 2001.

**Community Outreach:** Ida Tyson Blankenship report was given by Betty Opiela . Ida reported via Betty that the talk she gave to the International Alliance of Women on May 16<sup>th</sup> went well.

There was no unfinished business or new business. The next Board Meeting will be held on July 2, 2001 at 7438 Clear Water Drive.

The Board Meeting was adjourned by Betty Opiela at 7:55pm.

Minutes for this Board meeting were taken by Rebecca Cook for Roberta Haby, Secretary, who was absent.

**President Betty Opiela** called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM. Minutes were approved as written. Treasurer's report on the recent auction was as follows: Gross income from auction \$11,820,00/ Gross income from boutique \$1,111.50. Garnette Hanson reported she will transfer some of the money from the Operating Fund to the Savings Fund.

President Betty Opiela presented a request from the Bandera Quilt Guild asking our Guild to participate in a quilting project for Breast Cancer Awareness Month celebrated in October. The Board decided to decline the invitation at this time due to our upcoming quilt show in September.

Betty will express our willingness to participate in next years project if contacted at an earlier date.

**Renee Bradley** reported that two quilt frames have been donated to the guild. After some discussion Renee moved we get a value assessment on the frames and then offer them for sale to guild members. Marilyn Bellows, seconded. Motion passed.

**2001 Auction:** Jean Powell submitted the following auction report.

Gross income from auction: \$11,820.00 Gross income from boutique \$1,111.50 Expenses 1,065.63 Net income from boutique to guild 556.58 Net income \$10,754.37 Net income from Auction and boutique: \$11,310.95

**Marilyn Bellows** suggested by-laws be amended to have June guild meeting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday of the month and annual guild auction on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of June. Pros and cons of this action was discussed by the Board. Marilyn Bellows moved that Guild by-law be revised to read as such: In the month of June the regular guild meeting will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday and the annual guild auction will be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month. Renee Bradley seconded the motion. The motion passed. The Board will determine the proper procedure for presenting this proposal to the guild membership for a vote.

**Renee Bradley** announced that Terri Ryan has volunteered to co-chair next years auction. Renee will invite Terri to the next board meeting.

**Rebecca Cook** reported on the Quilt-In to be held at Cavendar Buick on August 21<sup>st</sup> from 12 noon till 3PM. Members will bring their own projects to work on. More information will be published in the next newsletter. Rebecca will ask for volunteers to chair the sessions at Quilt-In.

There being no old or new business the meeting was adjourned at 8:15PM.

#### Storybook Quilts Meet the Public

School is out and most of our storybooks and quilts are home for the summer. They were very busy since our last report in January. Eighteen books were used 43 times with 2622 students and many teachers viewing them. In addition 8 books were used by individuals with 215 (mostly adults) viewing them.
