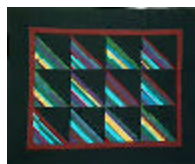

Fall at the Alamo

This year our re-enactment group of the Quilt Guild will be at the annual celebration of San Antonio lifestyle depicting the Fall of 1835 before the Spring of 1836 when the Alamo was overrun. Thus the name "Fall at the Alamo" It will be held on Sat. Oct. 19th and we need to be there by 8:00am for set up, then the Flag raising for everyone will be at 9:00am. Flag raising starts with everyone in their costumes gathered around the Flag Pole, a wonderful sight! It is great fun and we see a completely different type of people since most of the Alamo visitors are not native Texans. One of the requirements for this activity is a historically correct costume, at least the parts that can be seen! The only exception to the rule are our eyeglasses. Anyone who would like to participate call or email or talk to Mary-Ruth Flores. Now my address in the directory is incorrect and the correction has been published but if anyone has missed it look at the end of this article. The pattern library has several patterns for dresses and the caps we need to wear and before you get started sewing, talk to me as we need to discuss fabric choices and some short cuts in the sewing. The only reason I know the short cuts is Ruth Felty spent a long time talking me thru my dress! Thanks Ruth! Also we can't use plastic thimbles and scissors. Our spot is inside Alamo Hall, it's the large (real large) room behind the Library, which gets us out of any sun, rain, wind, etc. and we have fans if it is too hot. Let me know is you are interested, it is great fun!
