

The things you can do with miniatures! October's guest speaker was Debra Perkins from Dallas who, together with a woman she met at a bee in 1993, creates and publishes miniature quilt patterns. Her trunk show included over 50 striking quilts – none larger than a placemat. One of the advantages of miniatures is having a completed quilt in a relatively short period of time, but Debra cited several others, such as:

- Previewing fabric combinations for full-scale quilts
- Displaying more quilts in a limited amount of space
- They make great gifts
- They use smaller and smaller scraps (although this may not really be a "plus").


October Update: Quilt Blocks from Japan

What an exciting time we had at the October meeting! Not only were two completed quilts turned in, but 7 more blocks were selected from the basket. Sharan McCall turned in her lovely wall hanging composed of four blocks, entitled "We Wish You Peace". How in the world did you work your wonders and produce such a lovely wall hanging so fast, Sharan? And one of our new guild members Claire Wester turned one unique block into a charming wall hanging which she named "Valley of Peace". Thank you, Sharan and Claire. Because of your efforts, our collection now consists of 13 finished quilts. Can you believe it?

Then Gundy Cleven and Mary McCarthy, also two of our newer guild members, each selected baggies of blocks from the basket this month. We could see in Gundy's sparkling eyes that she already has a plan for the special block she chose. And Mary couldn't resist taking enough blocks to make two wall hangings! Gundy and Mary, do you have any idea how appreciative we are of your interest in and enthusiasm for this project? Because of you and all of the others who are involved in this project, there are now a total of 20 quilts in progress. Let's see: 13 quilts completed + 20 quilts in progress = 33 quilts! And that means out of the 139 blocks we received from Japan, there are only 31 blocks left in the basket; that is, enough for at least two 9-block quilts, one 8-block quilt, one 4-block quilt, and a number of single block wall hangings.

So, if you and/or any of your friends would like to design a layout for any of the remaining collections of blocks, we encourage you to call and let us know you are interested. Holiday Fabric Swap - 5 inch squares

Christmas fabrics this time !!!!!


Susan and Mary Ann are fascinated by the pattern book <u>Nickel Quilts</u> and propose a swap of 5 inch fabric squares. Goal is to increase the variety of 5 inch squares for as many people as possible.

If you are interested in participating in the swap, follow these simple rules:

- 1. Fabric must be 100% cotton, red, green, light, or other small holiday print prewashed.
- 2. Cut the fabric into exact 5 inch squares. (Please cut carefully .)
- 3. Place 10 DIFFERENT fabric squares in a plastic bag.
- 4. Limit 20 sets make sure that each bag contains 10 different squares.
- 5. You may duplicate fabric squares, as long as duplicates are in different bags.
- 6. Put your name in each bag.


You will receive the same number of bags as you turn in. Turn in the bags at the November meeting. Susan and I will sort them and return new fabric squares to the participants .

Editor's note --Swapping fabric squares is a wonderful way to increase your own stash. You could cut a 5" strip off your piece--ten times for sets to swap. A full width cut should yeild about 8 - 5" sqrs. So for your efforts you should get back 80 squares different from those you turned in.




