




November Update: Quilt Blocks from Japan



America the Beautiful - Quilt Project As planned by Carol Rouse

Most of you have seen the state birds and flowers quilt that was in the frame at the quilt show. We have a different version of the blocks which includes the outline of each state. Approximately 20 blocks were embroidered but the transfers were included for the remaining blocks. So I have planned a setting using all 50 blocks.

The blocks will be hexagons again. The embroidered block will have a red, white, and blue border. Connected to each state will be a hexagon collage of things related to that state (crazy-quilt style without the fancy stitching.) Included in the collage will be scenery, monuments, animals, crops, products, and even some events. These hexagons will measure apx. 9" x 11" and should have at least 7 things in each. So we need your help for such a special collection of fabrics!

The pieces need to be a minimum of 2-21/2 "in size, and of course they can be larger (some have larger motifs.) So far I've collected some monuments and scenery. The list below is my wish list; Please call me if you have some fabrics to help with this. If you have a state for which you'd like to do the collage hexagon, please call me and plan to do it. As you can see this is an exciting, ambitious idea—I'm hoping lots of you will agree with me and help.
