President's Letter

Sorry that I wasn't on hand to see what came out of the Brown Bags at the May meeting. I'm sure the projects were awesome!

I gave up my teaching job in March and have been among the ranks of the "now I'm retired, what do I do now?" people. Obviously quilting activities have been high on the list.

This started me asking, "Why make a quilt?" I realized that there are many reasons. Some make quilts to win prizes, some make quilts to help charities (is it politically correct to say "charity" anymore?). Some make quilts for their children and grandchildren, some make quilts to express their artistic feelings. Some make quilts because it's more fun than watching television, some because fabric "talks to them."

Whatever your reason for making a quilt (whatever size) we want to see it. Our show is coming up in four months. We want lots of quilts to show. Although we have judges and give ribbons we call it a "show" not a "competition." So use the entry blank in the newsletter (copies are OK) or download from our web page. Turn in to De Leclair ASAP. Deadline is July 26. And urge your quilting friends (wherever they are) to enter some quilts too, the show is not restricted to guild members.

And why do I make quilts? Because I love the way they look!

June Program – Every year we dedicate one program to one of our local area quilt shops. This year **Donna Gates** from **Las Colchas** will be doing a program on her **Texas Wildflower Quilt**. She'll be discussing the research she did on the various flowers as well as the different applique' techniques she used.

July Program – July's guest will be **Kathy Kansier**. Born and raised in Wisconsin, Kathy's mother taught her simple embroidery stitches when she was 5. This was the beginning of her lifelong interest in all facets of sewing. She later developed an interest in antiques. This, along with her friendship with the Wisconsin Amish, sparked a love for quilts. As an avid quiltmaker, Kathy enjoys all types of quiltmaking techniques. Her quilts have won many awards and have been displayed nationally. She specializes in hand appliqué, three dimensional appliqué, and crazy quilts.

- Program: "Whatever Was That Judge Thinking?" Have you ever wondered why one quilt wins over another? Kathy shares the process of quilt show judging, what judges look for and why they make the decisions they do. Kathy shares easy tips to help you make award-winning quilts.
- Friday workshop: Grand Finales. Did you ever wonder how wide your quilt's border should be or what border design to use? Kathy covers all the basics to end your quilt project with a grand finale. Border designs, mitering, bindings, prairie points, scallops, labels, hanging sleeves and tabs will all be taught. Students will make a sampler of impressive edge treatments that can be used as a reference guide for their future grand finales.
- Saturday workshop: Victorian Crazy Quilt Stitches. This workshop is designed to teach basic embroidery, silk ribbon and beading stitches that can be included in crazy quilts, pieced and appliqué quilts and wearable art. Your sampler block of Victorian stitches can be later turned into a pillow or wall hanging. Kathy with share the history of crazy quilts during the session.










Quilt Show

Vest Round-Robin Guidelines

- Decide on a **main** fabric, usually with a theme, 2-4 colors, something you really like and will love to have in your vest. ½-5/8 yd.
- Vest pattern of your choice—— cut a "base fabric" of the main pieces (2 fronts, 1 back) This serves as a guide for planning size and placements of the sections
- Complimentary fabrics—a few pieces you would like to see with your main fabric
- Blank **label** for others to sign as they work on your vest. Back the plain fabric with freezer paper to stabilize the writing with a Pigma pen.
- Notepad for "journal notes" as people work with your kit. (Blank pages stapled into a notecard are good.) Box or bag as container, marked with your name & phone number.

!st SECTION optional: Now you prepare the first segment for your vest—apx. 1/3 0r 1/4 of one of the sections. Piece or embellish it however you please. Place this in your kit to help you friends.

The golden rule of co-operative groups is that you do your very best work with a generous attitude—others will be doing the same. Feel free to add extra fabrics and do extra things to make the vest project better. It is very important that you have the kit ready to pass on to the next person on time. If you must miss the exchange meeting, get it there ahead of time.

At the last round you will receive your kit back, with the components to assemble for your own garment. You can add and rearrange until it suits you.

Your vest will be a special garment made with the love of new friends and worn with warm fuzzies each time. **ENJOY!**




6 ½ " block Paper-piecing Upper corner - 1 Bright royal Blue Stripes 2,4,6,8 White 3,5,7,9 Red
