## President's Letter

In addition she's planning some stimulating post-meeting activities as well. June is Auction, September is Style Show, and De Leclair is already on the road to our 2005 Quilt Show. Lots of activity, lots of entertaining and educational quilting activities. Hope to see you every month in 2004!

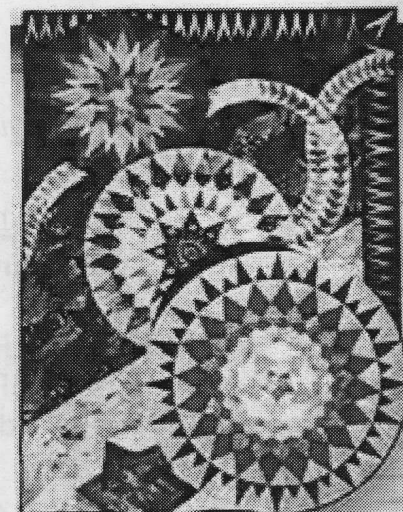

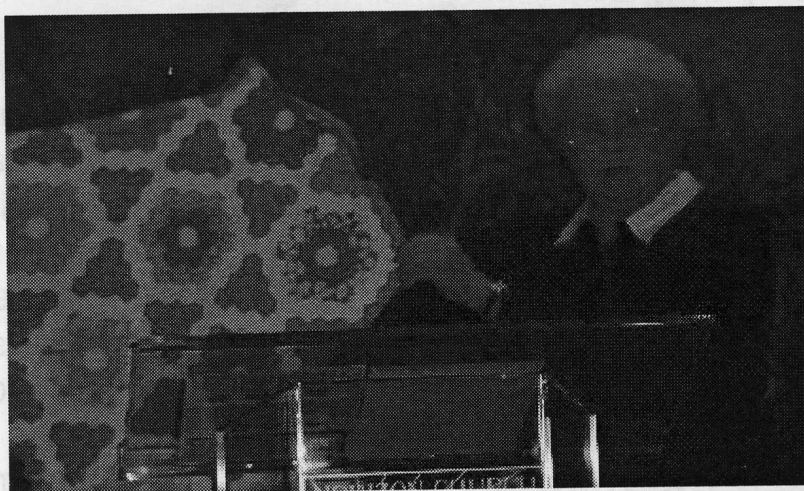

Programs: (Larry for Kitty) There will be an "orientation" program on Saturday. Susan Johnson was nominated to receive a calico rose on Saturday.

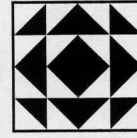
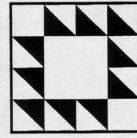
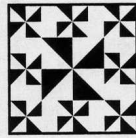
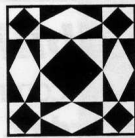
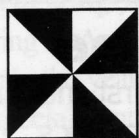
Secretary: Sharan stated that the message on the guild phone line has been revised.

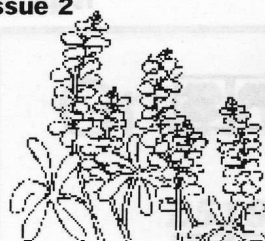
Organizing the three new committees which were formed as a result of the LRPC study was discussed. Names of volunteers were given to board members responsible for each committee.

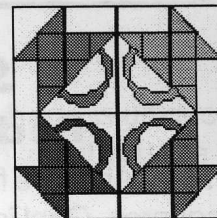

## Sweetheart Block Swap

### Red fabrics & prints this time !!!!!

Susan and Mary Ann are fascinated by the pattern book Nickel Quilts and propose a swap of 5 inch fabric squares. Goal is to increase the variety of 5 inch squares for as many people as possible.

If you are interested in participating in the swap, follow these simple rules:

1. Fabric must be 100% cotton, **red, red print, or valentine related print. prewashed.**
2. Cut the fabric into **exact 5 inch squares.** (Please cut carefully.)
3. Place **10 DIFFERENT fabric squares** in a plastic bag.
4. **Limit 20** sets make sure that each bag contains 10 different squares.
5. You may duplicate fabric squares, as long as duplicates are in different bags.
6. Put your name in each bag.

You will receive the same number of bags as you turn in. Turn in the bags at the February meeting. Susan and Mary Ann will sort them and return new fabric squares to the participants.

Editor's note --Swapping fabric squares is a wonderful way to increase your own stash. You could cut a 5" strip off your piece--ten times for sets to swap. A full width cut should yield about 8 - 5" sqrs. So for your efforts you should get back 80 squares different from those you turned in.

### THREE WONDERFUL GROUPS by Ruth Felty

Did you know that there are three national quilting organizations? Each one is unique and offers varied services to its members. I will give you a brief overview of each and if you are interested in more detail, contact me.

**NQA, National Quilt Association**, headquarters is in Ellitcott City MD. Their mission statement is: "The National Quilt Association, Inc. promotes quilts and quilting and encourages high standards in quilt making through education, preservation and philanthropic endeavors.

They have an annual show that moves from city to city. Special features include certification programs for judges and teachers, and a grant program that funds and promotes quilting and quilt making activities across the country. NQA was the original sponsor of National Quilting Day held annually in March.

**AQS, American Quilter's Society** is headquartered in Paducah Ky, where the annual show is held. "Inspired by the enduring creativity and importance of quilts and quilt making, our objective is to provide a forum for quilters of all skill levels to expand their horizons in quilt making, design, self-expression, and quilt collecting".

Special features include a book matching program, and book and magazine order service, which are designed "to inspire, instruct and nurture the art and skill of quilt making."

**IQA, International Quilt Association** is headquartered in Houston, TX where the annual show is held. The "organization is dedicated to the preservation of the art of quilting, the attainment of public recognition of quilting as an art form, and the advancement of the state of the art throughout the world. Our international membership – with more than a quarter of our members from countries outside the United States – makes IQA a truly diverse and global organization, but one united in spreading a love of quilts."

Special features include educational grants for various quilt research projects and sponsor of the only biennial international quilt event in Europe.

How many of these organizations count you among their membership?

This year it was my privilege to serve on the grant selection committee for the NQA. Over four thousand dollars will be provided to individuals and groups, across the United States for activities to promote the art and love of quilting. More information about the projects funded will be available in the spring of 2004.

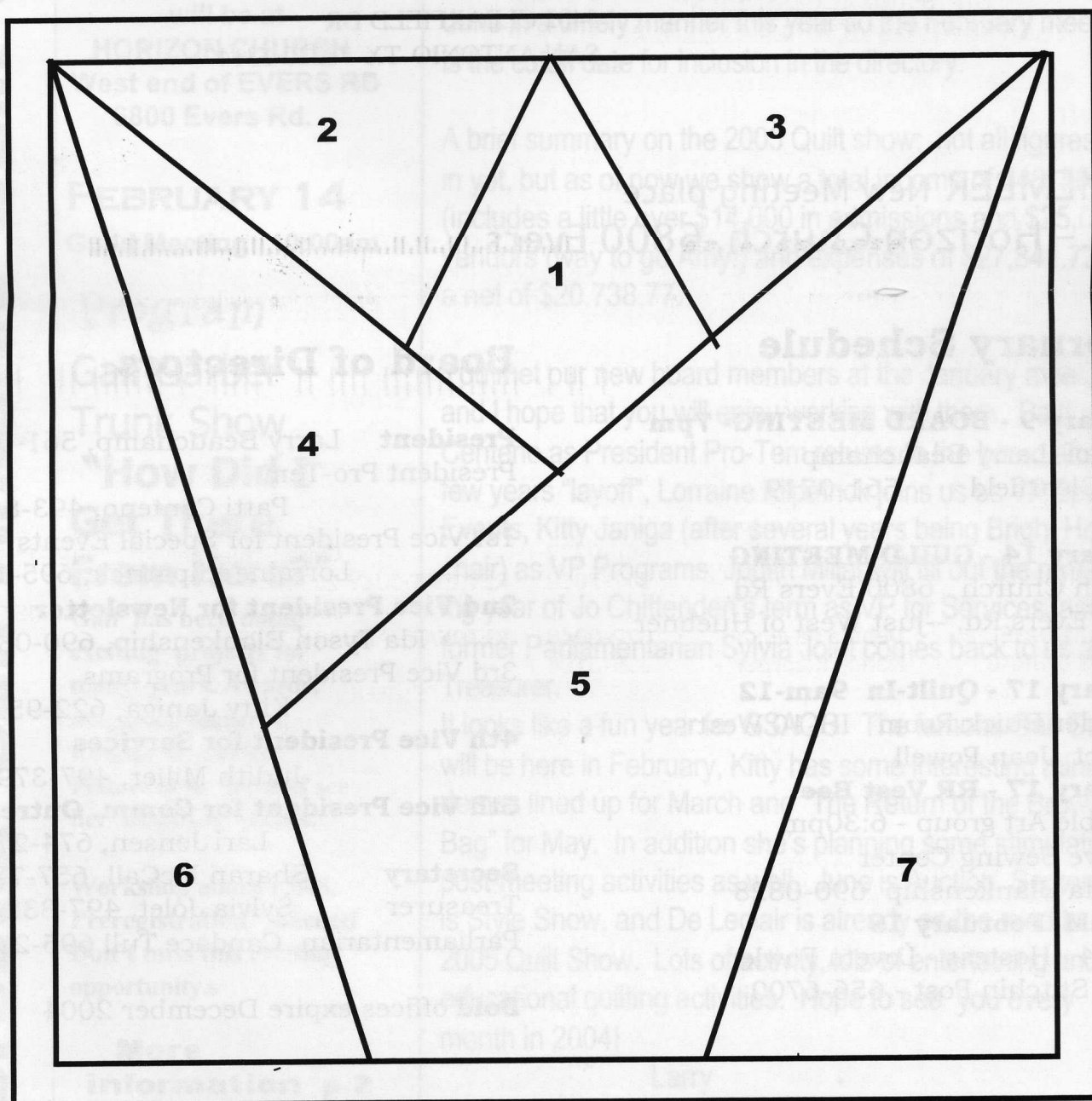
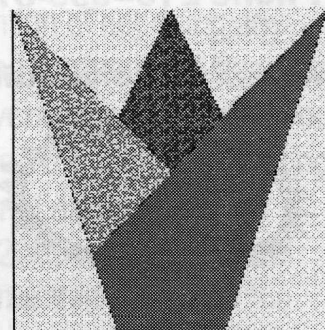
