President's Letter

I've have recently been thinking about the value of what we do....make guilts. This has been prompted by seeing prices set on items in some quilt show boutiques and by some "what is it worth" conversations with friends. But probably the biggest reason for my thoughts has been that for the first time ever I purchased (at one time) ALL of the fabric I needed to make a queen size quilt. In the past I have been able to use fabrics from my and Lois's stash. Granted the fabric had been purchased, but not all at once. At this same time, one of my on-line guilting sources published an analysis of the cost of making a quilt. They estimate that materials (fabric, batting, thread, etc.) totals \$200 to \$250 for a queen size quilt. Then add the labor! Their estimate is 12 to 50 hours for assembly. Machine quilting adds from ten to 50 hours...hand guilting from 100 to 500 hours. At minimum wage that guilt is an investment between \$300 and \$3000! So why do we do it? Because it is FUN!!!! We like fussing over a design, debating what fabrics to use, cutting it all up and putting it back together, showing off the result to our friends and burying all of our relatives in gift quilts. So tell your non-quilting friends what bargains they can get on June 26 at our annual auction. Never will they find such lovingly created art as such reasonable prices! And in the meantime...keep quilting. Keep those bed quilts and wall hangings coming!

President: Larry Beauchamp called the meeting to order. Larry informed us that Amy Cottrell will replace Melinda Dedman for the mini workshop on Saturday.




Secretary: Sharan reported that there have been no volunteers to take the job of guild photographer.






Take Time to Smell the Flowers


"Whirlygig" (Here's the block from Amy. 4 make a whole block.)




Please use all cotton, pre-washed fabrics. Pin your name on a paper tag for each block Turn in at the May meeting.


