At last, after a summer that took me away from my sewing room, I had three solid days that I could work, catch up, clean up and finish some projects. The 10 yards of flannel from my mother became 5 Bright Hopes Quilts. The storybook quilt, *The Seasons Sewn*, finally got its last season. Labels are on! I didn't remember putting patterns up there. – OH, my gosh!! 8 QPC blocks!! At what guild meeting had I recklessly pick these up. So I get to work. They are easy. But how long have I had them? This may have happened to many of us. For those of you new to guild, you may be asking – what's QPC? Quilt Project Committee has two branches-AM and PM. Loveta Fowler is in charge of QPC AM and Carol Rouse, QPC PM. Stop by and take a look at some of the projects. If you haven't tried a technique before, this may be your chance. If you're not sure how to do it, Carol or Loveta or one their trusty helpers will be happy to coach you. Board Meeting Minutes Ocotber 6, 2005

Board Members Present: Ruth Felty, Mary Mc Carthy, Dea Jae Shore, Judith Miller, Lois Beauchamp, Barbara Gilstad, Sylvia Jolet and Teresa Tijerina. Kitty Janiga was absent.

<u>President</u>: The meeting was called to order at 5:00. The September Board Meeting Minutes had a correction, the Treasurer reports not all bank statements had been received and stated "Balance" should read as "Estimated Balance." The minutes are approved as corrected. It was moved and seconded to present Janet Miller and De LeClair a Calico Rose each for their hard work in coordinating a very successful Quilt Show.

It was discussed to form a Standing Committee to collect and distribute quilts to non-profit community organizations. This committee will report to the 5th VP for Community Outreach.

The board had "Ethel' s Blue Baskets" quilt and beige hand-quilted wedding dress by Ethel Howey appraised. The quilt appraised at \$1600 and the dress appraised at \$1000. All paperwork will be given to Janet Miller, Chair, TLC Committee.

Discussions continue with our insurance company to finalize coverage. An inquiry was received from Creative Inspirations if GSAQG is interested in participating at their January function. Community Outreach will followup on this item.

There was a discussion on the concerns of some members on the sale of donated items. It was noted that our by-laws state all revenues are to be deposited into the General Fund.

Dea Jae moved an offer of \$25 a month be made to St. Andrew Presbyterian Church for the use of a classroom to conduct Thursday board meetings from 5pm-7:30pm, Lois seconded, and the motion carried.

<u>President Pro-Tem</u>: Lois will proceed with the planned sale of donated items prior to the Saturday meeting.

<u>Secretary</u>: Fourteen calls were received on the Guild's phone line this month, one call was for a generous amount of fabric from the Midland Quilting Guild. They have requested this fabric be made into quilts for recent hurricane evacuees.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Report pending receipt of bank statements.

<u>Special Events</u>: Houston bus trip tickets are sold out. <u>Newsletter</u>: Advertising rates for the newsletter was discussed and tabled for the November meeting.

<u>Programs</u>: Kitty was absent and Ruth conveyed a request to board members to remain in attendance at

the New Member Orientation after the business meeting, if possible.

<u>Services:</u> Arrangements are under way to hold our November meeting at the Encino Park Community Center. Directions are forthcoming.

<u>Community Outreach</u>: A San Antonio Express News reporter attended the quilt show and asked to interview the committee members of Storybooks and Quilts To Go project. The resulting article may be published in next week's paper. In addition, the committee has been asked to present the storybook and quilts project at the University United Methodist Church in June 2006.

<u>New Business</u>: Dea Jae moved to include the membership application and a survey in the November newsletter, the motion was seconded and the motion carried. Dea Jae volunteered to head a Hospitality Committee for the purpose of providing coffee and tea at the monthly meetings. Ruth will ask for volunteers to assist her.

General Meeting Minutes October 8, 2005

<u>President</u>: The meeting was called to order at 10:00, September minutes were approved as published. Janet Miller and De LeClair received a Calico Rose this month for organizing a very successful quilt show. A Standing Committee was formed to distribute quilts/quilted items to non-profit organizations. Carolyn Richardson and Kitty Janiga have volunteered to assist and interested individuals may contact Barbara Gilstad. A Hospitality Committee to provide coffee and tea at Saturday meetings needs volunteers and are asked to contact Dea Jae Shore. Sharon Ross has volunteered. Committee chairs were reminded to submit annual reports in November.

<u>President Pro-Tem</u>: Members were reminded to visit the classroom with Silent Auction items.

<u>Treasurer</u>: September Report - Operating Fund \$20,537.85, Reserve \$26,622.29, CD \$20,000.00 and Total \$67,160.14. Research will be undertaken on the feasibility of a 2-year budget. Members were reminded to submit budgets in November for 2006. Reimbursement requests for 2005 expenses should be submitted in November to be paid in 2005. Sylvia as Chair, Special Committee for Quilts for Katrina/Rita Evacuees, said a donation of fabric was received and kits to sew "comfort quilts" will be made for those interested in assisting.

Secretary: A generous donation of fabric was received from the Midland, Texas Quilting Guild.

Special Events: De Leclair reports the budget for the

quilt show will be submitted, a record number of quilts were submitted, a record number of appraisals were done, and the quilt raffle made \$5800. She recommended increasing the budget for advertising at the next quilt show. Yellow Roses were presented to De and Janet.The Houston bus trip is sold out, but Barbara Wofford is taking names for a reserve list.

<u>Programs</u>: The Auction and UFO sale is today and New Member Orientation will follow, the November program is By Kate Ackley, also known for Grandma's Flower Garden. She will give us a trunk show, demonstration and have her stamps available for purchase (no class this time). Our Buffet Luncheon is in December and we still need spools. Members were reminded to turn in their survey.

<u>Services</u>: The November meeting will be held at the Encino Park Community Center located north of 281/ 1604. A map will be in the newsletter. Carpooling is encouraged.Prices may increase for books and magazines, please adjust your requests.

<u>Community Outreach</u>: Jean Powell reported a fire at Youth Alternatives housing quarters and asked for donations of bedding goods. She also displayed the quilt made by Sandra Retzloff which will be donated to YA. Barbara reported a San Antonio Express News reporter interviewed the Storybooks and Quilts To Go Committee and the article is expected to be published this coming Wednesday.

<u>New Business</u>: Tess Weaver reports the Nominating Committee submits for President Pro-tem-Lois Beachamp, 1st VP for Special Events-Mary McCarthy, 3rd VP for Programs-Larry Beauchamp, and Treasurer-Karen Nanos. Ruth reported elections will be held at the November meeting as stated in our By-Laws. She asked if there were any nominations from the floor. There were none so nominations were closed. Amy recommended allowing the first row of the parking lot be left vacant for handicap members. There were 100 members and six guests present. Name tag fines collected - \$3.50.

Quilt Projects Committees Chair: Loveta Fowler, a.m. Carol Rouse, p.m.

Sometimes at the monthly Guild meeting one hears the cryptic phrase "QPC". Many members, old and new, are not able to decipher this acronym. QPC stands Quilt Projects Committees; there is an "a.m." and a "p.m" branch, sharing common goals.

The first Quilt Projects Committee was formed shortly after the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild was founded in 1989. It began as a way for members to expand their quilt skills and as a source of quilts for the auction and for quilters of the ITC Committee. Initially only meeting during the day, in about 1994 an evening group was established so that members who were employed could participate. The chair of the QPC a.m. is Loveta Fowler, 945-8230; the chair of the QPC p.m. is Carol Rouse, 699-9363.

Each committee selects quilt blocks or quilt patterns which it thinks the members will enjoy. Instructions are written and fabric is cut; then these are put into plastic bags and taken to the Guild meetings as kits. The kits might require basic piecing, paper or foundation piecing, appliqué or embroidery. As members sign out the kits they are given brief oral instructions, if needed, and asked to call the phone number included in the kit if a problem or question should arise while constructing the block. There is usually a generous amount of time allowed before the finished blocks are due to be returned.

When the completed blocks are gathered the committees continue with the quilt making - setting the blocks together, adding sashing and borders, layering batting and backing, and, perhaps, the actual quilting. The Guild Auction Action Squad (GAAS) Committee is

given several quilt tops for completion and inclusion in the annual auction. Usually there will be between fifty and eighty quilts in the auction that began as QPC kits. One or two finished tops are donated to the ITC Committee's quilters for demonstrations at both the Institute of Texan Cultures and at the Guild show. Occasionally a quilt from QPC hands will be taken into the Guild's own collection. Over the course of a year more than one hundred twenty service hours are accumulated by QPC, furthering the Guild's stated object of quilt education.

The QPC a.m. group meets at ten o'clock on the third Thursday of each month, excluding holidays, at the Alamo Stitchin' Post (5315 Walzem Road). The QPC p.m. group meets at the

Hancock Fabrics Store on Bandera near Huebner Road (7046 Bandera Road), if the chair is notified in advance - she doesn't want to be the only one to show up. The committees welcome all members. There is no long term commitment required. There are many tasks to be done - from measuring and cutting (accurately!) to putting the kits into zippy bags - the old adage that "many hands make light work" definitely holds true.

If you would like to help QPC, please call Loveta Fowler (a.m. group) at 945-8230, or Carol Rouse (p.m. group) at 699-9363. And remember, the more the merrier.










January 2006 BLOCK PARTY


Try this simple block. The block should be $6^{\circ} \times 6^{\circ}$ finished or $6.5^{\circ} \times 6.5^{\circ}$ unfinished.Color is your choice but keep the parts labeled A a nice off white. This should be 6° square but measure to be sure. It can be done as paper piecing.

Bring as many as you like with your name attached to each one to the January Guild meeting. All names go in the basket and the lucky winner in the drawing gets all of the blocks.
