Program Notes

In **April** will be our annual Mini-Demo program featuring four of our members with some special techniques and information. Ida Blankenship will do a session on Machine Appliqué, Charlotte Keener has a presentation on binding, Marcia Stanley will show how to do a double wedding ring with straight lines, and Holly Nelson will show a special technique on doing appliqué using liquid sizing. We will set up four stations and each demo will run 15 to 20 minutes. You can watch all four, just select your favorite, or even watch one of them four times!

Then **May** will feature Judith Lester with two workshops and a lecture. Friday, May 12, from 9:30 to 3:30 at Cavender Buick she will teach her Posey Basket Table Runner from her book "Table Runners for All Seasons", and on Saturday from approximately 12:30 to 3:30 following the guild meeting at the church the workshop is Appliqué, Embroider and Embellish. The project she uses to illustrate the techniques is a Cowboy Boot Christmas Stocking. Her lecture is called "Quilt is a 5 Letter Word". You have asked us to bring in published authors and teachers which we can only do if you support the efforts by attending their workshops. Plan to sign up at our April meeting.







Indiana Heritage Quilt Show Announces 2006 Prize Winners

BLOOMINGTON – The Indiana Heritage Quilt Show took place March 2-4 at the Bloomington Convention Center. This year's show featured a record number of exquisite examples of quilted works that were eligible to win over \$12,000 in cash prizes and awards. Quilters from around the country and as far away as California participated in this year's show. Prizes were awarded by a three judge panel. Bloomington welcomed over 4,000 visitors to this year's three-day event.

Quilted works on display ranged from traditional to non-traditional - and some weren't even quilts at all! Small-scale wall hangings are just one example of works that may not fit the average definition of "quilt." Many quilters are inspired by specific family events, different cultures, or objects found in nature.

Diane Leclair of San Antonio, Tex. was among the quilters receiving honors at this year's show. Leclair's creation, titled "Coeur du Vigne" was awarded the Viewer's Choice Award, voted on by quilt show attendees. The work featured an original design of a medallion style rectangular wreath of leaves, roses, grapes and other flowers and buds. The work was hand quilted and featured hand appliqué. Leclair is a member of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild.

Next year's Indiana Heritage Quilt Show will take place at the Bloomington Convention Center on March 1-3, 2007. More information about the Indiana Heritage Quilt Show can be found at www.IHQS-quiltshow.org.



Tips and Hints By Holly Nelson

Making your own seam guide to help keep that perfect 1/4" throughout? Use your ruler to align a strip of moleskin or a short stack of post-it notes or several layers of painters' tape just in front of your presser foot. And here's a clever tip if you're using the tape: with a utility knife, cut through several layers while the tape is **still on the roll**, then peel them off as one piece — you'll have a nice straight even stack.

When you've finished your appliqué block, turn it right side down onto a thick fluffy towel. Now press. It will come out smooth and flat without risking your appliqué work.

Have that Valentine's quilt that you need to store somewhere until next February? If you fused it with WonderUnder, folding it away may permanently crease it. So, hang it on a skirt hanger in the back of a closet. When joining pieces of batting, try this technique for a smooth strong join without bumps or gaps.

- Overlap the 2 pieces 4-6 inches and, with your rotary cutter, make a gently curving cut along the length of the overlap.
- Peel away the small leftover edges and discard. Both sections of batting should now fit together like a jigsaw puzzle.
- Lay 4-6 inch wide strip(s) of light-weight fusible interfacing on top of your wavy join line. Press in place.
 - Voila! One big piece of batting.


