

Board Meeting Minutes June 1, 2006

Board members present: Ruth Felty, Dea Jae Shore, Lois Beauchamp, Larry Beauchamp, Karen Nanos, Barbara Gilstad, Mary Mc Carthy, Judith Miller and Teresa Tijerina. Sandy Mehall was absent.

<u>President</u>: The meeting, held at the St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, was called to order at 5:00 pm. The May Meeting Minutes were approved as e-mailed and published. Loveta Fowler will receive the Calico Rose for the many years of work with QPC.

A discussion followed on the blocks donated by Noi Stringer which have been made into placemats. A motion was made to hold out the placemats from the auction until further information can be obtained; the motion was seconded and carried.

<u>Secretary</u>: Fourteen calls were received in the last month.

<u>Treasurer</u>: May Report; Operating balance \$11,984.30, Reserve \$37,265.17, CD \$20,000.00, and Total \$69,249.47. Research was completed and a comparable bid was received from a certified CPA accountant that will prepare our yearly taxes. A motion was made to switch from our former tax preparation firm and employ Bauer Willis and Associates to begin with our 2006 taxes; the motion was seconded and carried.

<u>Special Events:</u> Preparations for the auction continue and are on target. Discussion on the next auction chair was tabled for the next meeting.

<u>Newsletter</u>: An e-mail has been sent to Thompson Printing with regard to problems in printing and mailing the newsletter.

<u>Services</u>: A discussion followed on set-up of the meeting room.

Community Outreach: The Community Response Committee has asked for approval to donate a quilt to Youth Alternatives for their fund raiser on October 28, 2006. A motion was made to approve this donation; it was seconded and carried. For future requests, committees will be asked to submit dates of functions and the availability of quilts.

A report submitted by Storybooks and Quilts to Go Program revealed a very successful Spring semester. A total of 10,754 children at 25 different schools enjoyed the story books and quilts presented by their school librarians and teachers. Sandra Retzloff plans to take this much-asked-for traveling program to some day care centers this summer.

<u>Parliamentarian</u>: A working session to work on the By-Laws will be scheduled with the By-Laws Commit-

tee and board members available.

Unfinished Business: A discussion on having a more successful auction as well as holding it annually or biennually was tabled for the next meeting.

New Business: Jean Powell has asked for approval to purchase two new rotary cutting mats for use at retreats. A motion was made to accept this request; the motion was seconded and carried. The mats are to be stored at our storage and used by all. Judy Miller has asked for \$200.00 for the Katrina Committee to purchase batting for the completion of guilts. A motion was made to accept this request; the motion was seconded and carried.

Tips by Holly Nelson

- 1. I have many unfinished projects. I write the type/color of thread I've been using on a 3x5 card and store that with the work-in-progress to keep consistent with my piecing, applique and quilting from start to finish.
- 2. Ever run short of binding fabric? Try this: Make the outside border 2 to 2 1/2" wider than its final size. That way, you'll always have enough to bind it in the same fabric, even though it may be years before the guilt gets finished. When you're ready, cut 2 - 2 1/2" around the

quilt and you'll have enough for its binding.

3. Making miniature quilts is a good way to make many quilts in a year that are affordable — both in time and money. Design and construction are pretty much the same, but the quilting goes *much* faster. And there's always room for one more.

DIRECTIONS FOR MAKING A MEMORIAL SQUARE

- 1. Deceased guild member (active at time of onset of illness or death)
- 2. Finished size is 8 x 8. NOT A TOP, a finished tied or quilted square.
- 3. Two 3/4" Button holes horizontally placed one inch from the bottom and 1" in from each side
- 4. Two 5/8" buttons on the top of the square 1" from the top 1 1/4" in from each side edge.
- 5. Block must have member's name and year of birth year of death
- 6. Any method of construction
- 7. Any material
- 8. Any color
- 9. Any design
- 10. Block contents must be in good taste as determined by the project founders or the current board. Amy Cottrell will chair the project thru the end of 2006 and then a board member.
