### PUMPKIN CRUMBLE - TOP DESSERT

3 1/2 c. cooked, drained, and pureed pumpkin (can use blender)

1 c. rich milk


1 c. sugar

1/2 tsp. salt

3 1/3 c. 1 pkg. spice cake mix

2 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. allspice




She is a traditional quilter and likes working with bright colors, particularly blue. She is a relatively new member of the guild, belonging just three years.


