GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

October 7, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 pm by Ida Blankenship, president. Those in attendance were Linda Ethridge, Melanie McInnis, Mary McCarthy, Cindy Shutt, DeaJae Shore, Sherry Duringer, Gail Dickman, Ida Blankenship and Sylvia Jolet. The September 2013 Board Meeting minutes were approved as presented. President - Ida Blankenship - A Calico Rose was approved for Lisetta Ennis for her recruitment of new members. Rosebuds were approved for Carol Bryant, Lani Nunley and Jackie Randall for the food service and assistance with the recent Mini-Retreat for the membership. October is the beginning month of the 2014 membership drive. Cathy Baisley and Adrean Thomas have been appointed as Membership Co-chairs to Gloria Hammond. Contents for the welcome packets for new members were discussed.

President Pro-Tem – Melanie McInnis – Several proposals were presented to the board on new sound system for guild. A motion was made, seconded and approved to purchase a Bose (L1) Compact Sound System and microphone. This will be incorporated in 2014 budget.

Secretary - Sylvia Jolet - There were 9 calls to the guild telephone requesting general guild information. Treasurer – Cindy Shutt – The August 2013 financials were reviewed. September 2013 guild funds total \$70,653.86. The 2014 guild budget was discussed. A motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the proposed amended budget to bring to the membership. 1st Vice President - Special Events - Carol Bryant -Winter Retreat preparation is complete. There are no spaces left for more participants. There is a waiting list of 6. It is too early for a report on Summer 2014 Retreat. The 2014 Guild Quilt Auction and luncheon will be held at the Horizon Hill Event Center – LaQuinta on September 27. This is near the I10 and Callaghan Road intersection. A very nice 5,000 square foot area has been selected. More details will be forthcoming. We currently have about 40 quilts in progress toward the goal of 70-80 auctions items. DeaJae reported on many of the details of the guilt show. There is a difference of approximately \$2,000 less than the 2011 show.

2nd Vice President – Information - Dea Jae Shore – Dea Jae will assist with the computerization of membership records with the new co-chairs. She will also train anyone in the endeavor who needs training on ACCESS. 3rd Vice President – Programs – Mary McCarthy – Mary was unable to book a new program for Saturday's meeting. Melinda Bula had to cancel her appearance. Cindy Shutt will give give a short presentation of our budgeting process. Mary will continue to obtain a suitable substitution program for October's meeting November's program is Vickie Owen, Ethel Howey Grant recipient. Sign up will continue at October meeting. 4th Vice President – Services – Gail Dickman – Quarterly reports for all groups were submitted.

5th Vice President – Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer – Quarterly reports were submitted. After supplemental information and discussion it was determined that the guild membership is unable to respond to the SA Children's Hospital request for 100 quilts per month. Carol Steely is the new Bright Hopes Chair.

Parliamentarian – Linda Ethridge – The Nominating Committee report was submitted. The nominees are Judith Miller, President Pro-Tem; Carol Bryant, 1st VP for Special Events; Rebecca Cook, 4th VP for Programs and Cindy Shutt, Treasurer. Nominations will be taken from the floor at general membership meeting. Unfinished Business – There was a discussion on membership pins distribution to new members. No decision was made.

New Business – none Adjourned – 4:55 p.m.

Community Outreach Report for July, August, September 2013

The third quarter of the year is already gone, and the volunteers from the GSAQG have been very busy contributing hours of time and beautiful items to the community. I won't print the entire report here, but will give you the highlights. Storybooks volunteers spent 36.5 hours and drove 168 miles to deliver the tubs of books and quilts for the fall semester to 22 schools. The Community Quilt Angels spent 39 hours washing, ironing, piecing, quilting and binding two quilts. Sixteen members of the Institute of Texan Cultures bee contributed 501 hours of hand quilting and interpretation at the museum, much of that time spent on a striking quilt that will be in the auction next year. And last, and certainly not least, Bright Hopes hours totaled a whopping 1222 with 167 guilts and 35 totes delivered to the Children's Shelter. I'd also like to say thank you to everyone who manned information tables at the Quilt Show.

Want to get involved? Here are the people to contact: Storybooks and Quilts to Go – Linda Kirk, Quilt Angels – Barbara Sumlin, ITC Quilters – Kay Allison, Bright Hopes – Carol Steely. Their contact information is printed in the newsletter each month.

I am looking for a person to take on a project that Larry Beauchamp has been in charge of for the past eight years. The San Antonio Eye Bank holds an annual quilt program for cornea donor families, in which personal patches submitted by the donor families are attached to a quilt. If you would be willing to take on this outreach, please contact me and I will forward the information to you.

Pieces of the Past, 43: Button Cards Ellen Hernandez


