

GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

May 4, 2015

The meeting was called to order by Ida Blankenship, President, at 3:00 pm.

Members in attendance: Ida Blankenship, Karen Lambdin, Linda Ethridge, Sherry Durringer, Jeana Kubik, Rebecca Cook, Cindy Shutt, Carol Bryant, and Judith Miller.

The minutes from the April board meeting were approved as presented.

President – Ida Blankenship received two nominations for Calico Roses: Sandra Rezloff for her service on the Storybook Committee, and Kay Allison for serving as ITC bee leader for years. A motion was seconded and approved to give them both a Calico Rose at the May meeting.

Ida gathered board input on the three late entries for the Summer Retreat Grant. It was decided there was no cause for action.

Ida reported that she and two other guild members attended a barbecue at Safesite Storage and had a nice visit.

The QPC committee has requested new shelving for the storage unit. A motion to authorize the purchase of four storage shelves for QPC, and amended to add two more units for Bright Hopes, was seconded and approved.

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt reported a balance of \$78,618.96. She cashed out \$1000 from the April CD for the June workshop and rolled the rest over. The tax return is ready, and the tax attorney was very impressed with the record keeping. The March financials have been checked and approved.

1st Vice President – Carol Bryant. The banners and bookmarks for the quilt show are ready.

3rd Vice President – Rebecca Cook reported that there are openings in the Charlotte Angotti workshops. The board discussed changing the month of the Eleanor Wright workshop in future because of June conflicts. Registration for Melinda Bula will be this month.

Three new contracts for future speakers have been signed.

Rebecca asked for help from the board with her position responsibilities.

4th Vice President – Jeana Kubik created new charts for table arrangements for committee chairs to use after the meetings. She will be gone this month, but the idea will be helpful at future meetings also.

Gail Dickman and Nancy Beasley accepted co-chair positions for QPC.

5th Vice President for Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer.

Kitty Janiga and Sandra Bloom were at a fiber arts function at the Alamo in April as part of the Community Education Committee. Committee members will also attend an all-day quilting presentation at an elementary school in May.

The Storybook Committee is sending representatives with books and quilts to a Mini-Maker Fair in Floresville in May.

Other Business

Ida passed out a Memory Key Stick Guideline Statement. The goal is to convert guild information to digital files.

Board members are requested to work up a document to identify the position duties, including new memory stick guidelines, and to make any changes needed. Several policy corrections were discussed. Ida will look at the Eleanor Wright Grant paperwork to see if a date change is allowed.

Announcement policies and details about commercial announcements will be discussed at a later date.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:50 pm,.

The bookmarks and fliers are here and need to be taken to quilt shops and other venues. Ida is selling ads for the quilt show program. 2nd VP for Information – Dea Jae Shore has fixed the Bring and Brag link on the webpage.

3rd VP for Programs – Rebecca Cook announced that there are still openings in the Charlotte Angotti workshops many of which will be funded by the Eleanor Wright Scholarship. Today she will open registration for Melinda Bula's July workshops.

The program for August will be a quilt label lesson by Ida Blankenship.

4th VP for Services – Jeana Kubik reported that Gail Dickman and Nancy Beasley will be co-chairs of the QPC. They are initiating a new project: off-the-floor blocks with a prize for the one who makes the most. The QPC meets on the 1st Thursday at a convent at OLLU.

5th VP for Community Outreach – Sherry Duringer reported that the Trauma Quilt workshops have several upcoming dates that will be listed in the newsletter for those who want to help.

Linda Kirk from Storybooks reported that they are bringing the quilts back from the schools this month. The Haiku challenge blocks are due in July.

Carol Steely announced that Bright Hopes will be making kits, labeling, and doing various jobs at today's workshop. Bring a finished top in the next 4 months and get a chance for a prize.

Kitty Janiga, with the Community Education committee, needs a volunteer to teach one to six classes in hand sewing at a library. The committee has been busy with the mentoring of four students, a demo at the Alamo, and helping at a retirement home.

There were 104 members present and four new members welcomed.

Today was the guild's 34th birthday party with cupcakes to celebrate.

After announcements, door prizes, and Bring and Brag, the meeting was adjourned at 11:10 am.



Pieces of the Past: Mekong Quilts, (www.mekong-quilts.org) by Ellen Hernandez



The winds of time have changed the relationship between the US and Vietnam, even affecting the quilting world. A group of Vietnamese and Cambodian women are carrying on the tradition of hand quilting cotton and silk bedcovers which are sold worldwide through an organization that started in the 1990s: Mekong Quilts. Initially there were 35 women at the non-profit and now over 340 women work full time. Working in their remote villages, benefits include a fair wage, a safe environment, and their children are able to attend school. Besides being taught to hand quilt, they receive training in health and hygiene, and group management.



Women can progress from desperate field workers to entrepreneurs doubling or tripling their income. Professional designers from Australia, France, and the US frequently assist with new ideas. The quilts and other sewn items must pass a quality control inspection prior to being sold. All profits are



reinvested into the community: "scholarships for children, agricultural training, and microfinance programs."

Most quilts are finished in one to four weeks. A king size quilt averages around \$400 which includes overseas shipping. Custom orders may also be requested. In addition to traditional and contemporary quilts for children and adults, the women make a variety of hand crafted items, such as table runners, placemats, potholders, aprons, hammocks, pillow covers, yoga mats, bags, toys, and Christmas ornaments. They have eight shops in Vietnam and Cambodia and also rely on out of country supporters called "Sales Angels" to promote and sell quilts abroad. There is an online catalog which includes color options and an email contact to discuss current inventory and details. Buying from this fair market trader is a three way profit - for the buyer, supplier, and the community.

ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM**

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today’s society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year following receipt of the grant**. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, **at a minimum of (3) three months before** the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **by March 1** of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

1. Why you would like to receive this grant
2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.

The blocks were the result of a block lotto years before and were donated by winners Carol Bryant and Ruth Felty. In 2006 the board sponsored a design contest for the 25th birthday quilt. Dea Jae Shore won the contest and the blocks were set by a few of the board members. It was basted by the Hand Quilting Bee then quilted by the Institute of Texan Cultures Bee. Ruth Felty bound and finished the quilt including adding a label.
