

Ethel Howey Grant

The Ethel Howey Grant was created by the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild in 2006 to honor founding Guild member, Ethel Howey. The Grant is a monetary award that allows a Guild member to further their quilting skills and share these quilting skills with the Guild.

The deadline for the Ethel Howey Grant is August 1 and is open to any Guild members meeting the guidelines.

If you are applying for the Grant take the time to talk with Guild members, VP for Programs and previous winners to learn what skills/techniques are needed or wanted. Review national teachers the Guild has had in the past year so you don't repeat their teaching.

Please consider applying and giving back to the Guild.

Common Threads GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC. ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials and books. The grant(s) will be awarded annually, not to exceed \$1000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$1,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criteria for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for three years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a time-line agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year following receipt of the grant**. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of (3) three months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses **by March 1** of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated time line, submit a typed or hand written application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques and information with the membership.




6.16 Pieces of the Past, 74: Pine Burr Quilt by Ellen Hernandez



Danny Drain, curator of the Slave Relic Historical Museum and Cultural Center in Walterboro, SC is the owner of this vibrant Pine Burr quilt he claims was made by slaves in the 1830s. Danny had inventory

documentation from the Polk estate to substantiate the provenance of this quilt he purchased in Arizona. Mr. Polk died in 1864. In 2004 Danny had the quilt appraised on *Antiques Roadshow* where its estimated value was \$40,000 - \$60,000. The quilt has been highlighted in several television documentaries and has been displayed around the US in the Smithsonian's traveling exhibit. It is featured on the cover of *Jubilee*, a





National Geographic book about the emergence of African-American culture.

The quilting community responded to the quilt's age with some skepticism citing several discrepancies. First, this block pattern was common only after 1875, as was the fan quilting. Second, the faded tan fabric seems to be made from a synthetic dye not made before 1870. Most historians who have commented on this quilt claim it could have been made between 1880 and 1910, perhaps by former slaves. Others



have argued that this pattern is an African motif honoring a religious deity, Shango, which was known to Africans long before US slavery and therefore the quilt could date to pre-Civil War.

The pattern appeared in *Practical Needlework: Quilt Patterns* in 1906, attributed to Clara Stone. The *Kansas City Star* published the pattern in August 1939 stating that it was copied from a family quilt made 45 years earlier (in the 1890s.) Other names for the block are *Pine Cone* and *Feathered World Without End*. A secondary pattern appears when blocks are sewn side by side, either an octagon or a circle.

Regardless of its exact age, this quilt is a wonderful example of a challenging block. There are many variations of the pattern from color placement to center block design. Fons and Porter have a Pine Burr paper and digital patterns, a template set, and a kit at www.shopfonsandporter.com. More recently, paper piecing patterns have been designed which help prevent puckering of this multi-pieced block.




Golden Carrot Winner: Kit Kucincas
