GSAQG Board Meeting Minutes

August 1, 2016

Ida called the meeting to order at 3 pm. Others in attendance were Karen Lambdin, Elaine Staller, Janet Miller, Jeana Kubik, Cindy Shutt, Linda Ethridge, and Dea Jae Shore.

The Board meeting minutes for July stand approved as presented in the newsletter.

There were no nominations for the Calico Rose award.

President Pro Tem – Dea Jae and Janet reported on the storage building discoveries. Suggestions were made that could lead to the elimination of one building. A new storage committee will be chaired by Janet Miller who will report progress at the meeting.

Secretary –Karen Lambdin received the new phone, and the new guild phone number is 210-984-6149

Treasurer – Cindy Shutt reported a cash and savings balance of \$50,964.58 and the June financials have been approved and checked. She found a big quilt show banner that no one remembers.

1st VP for Special Events – Elaine Staller. The Fall Mini Retreat signups will be at the meeting and it is almost full. Elaine asked if door prizes are needed at retreats and quilt shows? Mini retreat costs \$35 and Virginia budgeted for door prizes already.

There will be an Auction meeting Friday. The Quilt show meeting after the August Guild meeting has been cancelled. Holly will continue to sell challenge fabric.

Linda Kirk has 2 openings for the Winter Retreat.

Sandra Lowell will have sign-ups for the Houston bus trip at the meeting.

2nd VP for Information- Dea Jae Shore. Cathy Baisley has welcome brochures that need new phone numbers and the welcome packets could use some updating in other places. Board members wrote in the phone number to save money by not reprinting. Cathy also made some recommendations for the new member kits.

Dea Jae found a bag of pins from an old show for \$1.

3rd VP for Programs - Janet Miller. The August program is the auction preview. Kathy Brown will be the speaker in September; there are openings in both classes. Janet made samples for the classes to garner interest. Janet submitted a written report containing the speaker list for the next year.

4th VP for Services— Jeana Kubik found a suitable sign for tables. She proposes we order 3 to ensure they are good quality. They can be used for multiple events. After discovering the sign bases weighed 12 pounds, board members suggested Jeana look for something lighter. She will look at lighter wooden stands or acrylic ones. Ida will check with the church and see if they will store the bases there.

Dea Jae suggested publishing committee reports in the newsletter to help move the meeting along. Each month the guild could publish a different committee report.

Parliamentarian – Linda Ethridge gave the nominating committee report. The bylaws say if she can't find three members to volunteer then the board shall select members for the committee. She has two members right now – herself and Virginia. Names were suggested.

9.16 Pieces of the Past, 77: Mikado Whole Cloth, by Ellen Hernandez



Asian inspired fabrics, such as this 1888 Cochecho print, were in great demand in the US in the 1800s, especially after Commodore Matthew Perry opened Japan to international trade in 1854. Influential as well was the 1876 Centennial Exhibition in Philadelphia where Japan and 37 countries were represented – successive events were called the World’s Fair. More than 10 million people visited the exhibit and were introduced to Japan’s lifestyle and culture shown in architecture, gardens, and decorative arts such as beautiful silk screens of figures, animals, flowers, and landscapes with detailed embroidery. These works are said to have fueled the Crazy Quilt trend, then

called Japanese Patch.

This Mikado print was popular following the Centennial and its origin is



positively identified by the American Textile History Museum in MA (sadly this museum is closing.) They have an archived engraver’s sheet, #3286, and a sample print dated January 1886 from the Cochecho Print Works of Dover, NH. This mill operated until 1912. The printed panels were about 24 inches wide, requiring piecing to make large quilts. These types of *imitation* patchwork fabrics are now referred to as cheater cloth.



Laura Fisher, author, antique dealer, textile and quilt lecturer, discovered this print used as the backing on an antique Log Cabin quilt. The characters are from *The Mikado*, a triumphant comic operetta by Gilbert and Sullivan which opened in London in 1885. The play was quickly a hit there and in the US. Arthur Liberty, the founder of Liberty Fabrics of London, designed the costumes for *The Mikado* based on input from a team he sent to Japan to study their clothes and fabrics. He continued to print ‘Oriental’ designs which were quite sought after.

The Michigan State University Museum owns this 1900 cotton, wool, and silk Nine Patch quilt which has another version of the Mikado fabric on the back.



The Metropolitan Museum of Art also has a quilt in their collection with the Mikado print used as the front.



The 1886 quilt features this whole cloth cheater print of yachts racing in the 1886 America’s Cup as a backing.



Quilters and collectors remain on the lookout for this unique Mikado fabric in quilts, whether as whole cloth or used in crazy patches.




