4.17 Pieces of the Past, 84: Sock Quilts, by Ellen Hernandez



Fort Payne, Alabama coined itself ‘Sock Capital of the World’ in the early 1900s. The companies peaked in the 1990s with 120 mills and 7500 employees. In 1934 Ada Jones of Fyffe, Alabama used sock tops from the W.B. Davis hosiery factory in Fort Payne to make two quilts. At the time, the colorful sock tops with dots, squares, diamonds, and other shapes were made separately and attached to knitted white sock bottoms. Ada’s sock tops were samples from the showroom that were no longer needed. She

hand stitched the sock tops into strips and then combined them to make her quilts. She used home grown cotton for the filler. Ada’s family donated the two sock quilts, the one on the left to the Smithsonian, and the one on the right to the State of Alabama Department of Archives and History.



Cheaper foreign production and financial crisis eventually lead to the collapse of most sock mills. About 10 years ago Fort Payne resident Gina Locklear decided to bring sock production back using organic cotton and dyes. Her parents had had a successful mill making sport socks. With their help, Gina’s *Emi-G Knitting* produces *Zkano* and *Little River Sock Mill* items that sell for \$14 to \$30 a pair. The cotton is from Lubbock, TX. In 2015 Martha Stewart awarded Gina with an *American Made Award*. The most recent line was based on quilt patterns. Gina is mindful of reducing waste, especially textiles. If your socks can’t be reused as a dust rag, drink cozy, heat pack, draft protector, or dog toy, *Emi-G Knitting* will recycle your past-their-prime socks, reworking, reusing, and composting the cotton fibers.



Turning "If Only!" into "What If?"

Recently I was attending a seminar in which the instructor suggested that the best way to change a perception of a difficult problem was to change how we referred to it. By turning a negative reference into a positive reference, the way we would approach the solving would also become positive. Instead of referring to this as a problem but an actual opportunity it would give us a chance to grow and learn.

This started me thinking about my quilting (maybe not what the instructor was after but never far from my mind). How often do the words "If Only!" occur when you are working on a project? "If only" I had gotten that extra half yard now I am out of that color! "If only" I had signed up for that class last week now they are all full! "If only" I had gotten that other color before, now it won't match the (fill in the blank)! "If only" I had changed the fabric that I did not like in that Block of the Month, now I just don't like the quilt!

"What if's" look forward as positive opportunities for development of several things. We can take the occasions when the fabric runs out, to be creative (yes, you are, we will talk about that later) and say "what if" I use another color(s) and/or mixed borders and piecing? If you did not get into that class you can call your friend that did get in and say "what if" we work on a project together. This gives you an opportunity for the information to be passed on, colors to be discussed and creative (there is that word again) sparks to be struck between the two of you. If you got a pattern or kit in a color that isn't quite right you could say "what if" I add or change some of the fabrics? You are the one making this after all! (The quilt police are not watching. I sent them to get coffee and donuts because we were out.) Even when you sign up for a block of the month that might have a fabric that you really, really don't like but everything else is great, "what if" you changed out that fabric for one that you really, really love? Make yourself happy when you work. That is why we do this. Leave the sad "if only's" behind. Look forward to the happy "what if" opportunities to be creative. Yes, you are. Really.
