#### 9.17 Pieces of the Past, 87: San Quentin Quilt, by Ellen Hernandez



Radha Stern's grief over the loss of her 21-year-old son, Christopher, in 1996 turned into a story of forgiveness and healing. Her book, *Griefprints: A Practical Guide for Supporting a Grieving Person*, contains pictures of a quilt she

had made by Liz Piatt after Christopher's death. Each of the 21 heart blocks represents a year of his life with favorites such as reptiles, sunsets, Ben and Jerry's Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough ice cream, and an eagle on Mount Tamalpais. Radha uses the quilt when she speaks to groups to bring

Christopher's story to life. She also made a documentary, *Unlikely Friends*, about the friendships that have developed through forgiveness between the victims of brutal crimes and their perpetrators.

Radha has forgiven her son's

roommate, a process which helped her survive. The man shot Christopher four times, senselessly, because he didn't like the way the dishes had been put away. Radha started working with the San Francisco Bay Area Insight Prison





Project and was asked to go to San Quentin to share her story. She spoke with 17 inmates, sharing her story and passing around the quilt. At the end of the visit, all the prisoners were sobbing, so touched by her genuine concern, forgiveness, and hope.

Ten years after Christopher's death, the San Quentin men who had been in Radha's group for three years decided to make a quilt for her. They were creative, using found objects available to them to make 18 blocks mounted on black felt. There were napkins, pieces of mattress liners, shirts, and glass beads. There was even some embroidery, poems, and letters. The men shared their appreciation for Radha's acceptance and friendship. At the bottom of the quilt is a hanging red thread, which in Navajo tradition allows the spirit to freely move in and out of the quilt.

Expressions from the men include: "Thank you for starting me on my road to healing by sharing your life with me." "Thank you for



coming into our lives and for blessing us with your wonderful spirit and your fun personality. What a gift to humanity you are."

Thanks to your efforts, we are doing great on Raffle Ticket sales...let's keep up the good work!

**Silent Auction** - Suellis needs your help! She still has lots of room to display/sell more silent auction items. Anything quilt related is acceptable...please bring her your donation items at this next meeting on Sept 9.

**Boutique news** - Reminder, Jeanette will accept items at the September meeting and will be setting up the boutique the Wed. and Thur. before the show. (You are welcome to bring boutique items on Tues., 9/19, when you bring in your quilt entry...we will store them for you)

IMPORTANT...An inventory sheet <u>must be filled out</u> and every item must be on the sheet. Every item must be tagged with the sales price and your unique inventory code. That code can be your initials, a series of 3-4 numbers or a combination of both. That is how we will identify you when an item is sold to be sure you get paid!

You may bring one or one hundred items! Completed or assembled in a bag as a kit. Bundles of fabric as a theme or a grouping. You can even put in fat quarters, but remember, every item you want in the boutique must be on an inventory sheet and <u>must be tagged</u>. We will have inventory forms at the September meeting, if you are not able to print them from our website.





We will try to provide batting for the quilts as indicated in the table below, so please adhere to the standard sizes listed. Twin quilts will have priority. If you have any batting you are not going to use, donating large sizes of batting would be most welcomed! Because of storage space, we cannot accept quilt tops at this time. Please finish quilts prior to turning them into Bright Hopes. We hope this does not cause you any problem.
