
Texan Diane Rose has a vision to motivate others to achieve their true potential. Living with vision impairment from birth, Diane was completely blinded after an accident in 1984. She began quilting in 1998 and set a goal to make 500 quilts in 10 years. She is now working towards her 1,000th quilt. She credits God to supplying her with this talent and is often found travelling around the world sharing her motivational story.

Many wonder how Diane can quilt and applique so well. She says she can feel where the stitch is because the applique has a raised edge. She often uses AccuCut shapes, but also creates her



own designs. Her work is done by machine and by hand. A friend sometimes helps her select colors and patterns. She makes quilts for special people like President George W. Bush, Prince William and Kate, and her favorite country western singers.

Custom quilts of all sizes from throw to king may be requested at her website, <u>www.theamazingquilter.com</u>. She appreciates and often relies on donations of money and sewing supplies, and has a wish list on her site.





Nashville. There she worked as a journalist and tour guide (really) and became friends with many at the Grand Ole Opry. Quilting gave her independence and a sense of accomplishment. She travels without a cane or dog, cooks — and even wrote a cookbook, and makes ceramics. Her personality is bubbly and upbeat, always smiling. She has been featured in many newspapers and interviewed on numerous television shows, including the *Texas Country Reporter*.

In 2009 Diane received the Barbara Jordan Media Achievement Disability Award. She was appointed by Texas Governor Abbott as one of six to the Governor's Committee on People with Disabilities. Every hundredth quilt goes out for special displays such as the 600th *Gallery of Presidents* quilt and the 700th *I Pledge Allegiance to the Flag* quilt. Diane's message: "If you want to do something, don't let anybody tell you you can't."

1. Title: Change first two lines from regular to BOLD, center text, and update amendment date as follows:

BYLAWS OF THE GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC

AS ADOPTED MAY 13, 2000 AND AMENDED NOVEMBER 11, 2017

- 2. Article II Object. Rewritten to simplify as follows.
 - a. OLD: The object of the Guild, organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as a nonprofit corporation, shall be to stimulate an interest in quilts and to advance the art of quilt making through an annual event for the general public; to assist local museums in their displays of quilts and quilting; and to hold educational programs, workshops and seminars in the design and techniques of quilt making, all within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
 - b. NEW: The guild is organized for charitable and educational purposes as a nonprofit corporation to stimulate an interest in quilts and advance the art of quilt making within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code and its regulations as they now exist or as they may hereafter be amended.
- 3. Article III Section 6 Resignation. Remove this section and renumber remaining sections under Article III. Section read as follows:

RESIGNATION. Resignation of any member in good standing shall be submitted by letter and sent to the President, read at the next business meeting and considered final without vote.

- 4. Article IV Officers.
 - a. Section 1. Elected Officers. In the list of elected officers, change 'Second Vice President for Newsletter' to 'Second Vice President for Information'.
 - b. Section 2. Appointed Officer. Change 'appointed' to 'approved' as follows:

The appointed officer of the Guild shall be a parliamentarian and shall be appointed approved by the Executive Board.

- c. Section 4. Item C. Change 'Second Vice President for Newsletter' to 'Second Vice President for Information'.
- d. Section 5 Term of Office, Item C. Change 'Second Vice President for Newsletter' to 'Second Vice President for Information'.
- e. Section 6, Duties of Officers,
 - i. Item D. Change 'Second Vice President for Newsletter' to 'Second Vice President for Information'.
 - ii. Item D, subitem C: Add in missing word in description of one of the 2nd VP Information's duties as follows:
 - c. publish the chairman's final report for all special events as provided by the Vice President for Special Events, in a timely manner.
 - iii. Item H. Remove sub item 3, and renumber remaining sub items. Text being removed is from the duties of the secretary.
 - 1. OLD: 3. Have custody of the seal of the Guild and affix the Guild's seal to all documents, as required.
 - 2. NEW: (removed)
- 5. Article VII Executive Board
 - a. Section 2, Item F. Correct two typos: remove comma after approval, and make character at end of line a semi-colon.
- 6. Article VIII Committees
 - a. Section 5 Duties of Ad Hoc Committees remove this section.
 - i. OLD: Section 5. Duties of Ad Hoc Committees. The duties of the ad hoc committees are as specified by their creation.
 - ii. NEW: (removed.)
 - b. Renumber Section 6 to Section 5.
- 7. Article 8, Section 2, Composition. Remove unnecessary wording:
 - a. OLD: Section 2. Composition. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, members of all committees shall be members in good standing of the Guild.
 - b. NEW: Section 2. Composition. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, members Members of all committees shall be members in good standing of the Guild.

/ Change 'Updated January 2016' to 'Amended November 2017'

Add numbering to items 1-15 (16-18 have them)

- 1. Overall change: Add numbering to items 1-15; items 16-18 are already numbered.
- 2. Announcements. Announcements to the membership at the business meeting are turned into the Secretary who reads them to the guild: must be quilt related and under 1 minute long.
- 3. Board. All board members and committee chairs shall receive copies of job descriptions, binder, and any information in digital form pertaining to that office or job at the December board meeting.
- 4. Calico Rose Award. The following sections are updates; the rest remain unchanged:
- a. The recipient of the award is announced at the following business meeting. and a short article about the individual and the reason for the award is published in the following month's newsletter
- b. Remove the statement 'The award consists of a small token of appreciation.'
- 5. Rosebud Award. Add the line 'The president keeps all records of Calico Rosebud recipients.'
- 6. Children. While membership is open to all, "all" is intended to represent individuals of at least school age who demonstrate an interest in quilting and participate in Guild activities. Accordingly, small children are not permitted to attend Guild meetings. Children under 6 are not permitted to attend Guild meetings.
- 7. Add the following information under a new section, FABRIC, which will follow the DONATIONS section: FABRIC.
 - a. All guild fabric, unless assigned to Bright Hopes (juvenile themed fabric) and Community Quilt Angels (patriotic themed fabric) will be the responsibility of the President Pro-Tempore.
 - **b.** A Fabric Coordinator, under the President Pro-Tempore, will make a determination on acceptance of any donated fabric. Donated fabric can be assigned to a specific committee, added to the Guild fabric, placed on the free table for Guild members or passed onto another charitable organization. The Guild Board could direct the Fabric Coordinator to sell the fabric to Guild members if the donation is large enough.
 - c. Guild fabric can be used by any Guild member for Guild projects. Chairs of the following committees have access to the guild fabric at any time: Bright Hopes, Community Quilt Angels, QPC, Auction, and QPFC. Any other committee chair, retreat chair, or bee must contact the Fabric Coordinator for access to the Guild fabric.
 - **d.** In the guild storage unit, any fabric on the shelf of a committee will belong to that committee. The fabric may not be removed unless specific permission from the committee chair is received.
 - 8. Payment of Fees, section (B) Workshops, Item 1(b)
 - b. WORKSHOPS. Registration for workshops opens 60 days 3 meetings prior to the workshop date month.
 - 1. Registration is confirmed only when the total fee is paid. No refunds are made after the guild meeting prior to the workshop unless the space slot can be filled from a the waiting list.
